

Dear Parishioners,

One of the most beautiful aspects of the life and ministry of Jesus is that he revealed the Father to us. Until Christ came with his preaching and miracles, the Father was still mostly a mystery in the mind and heart of his Jewish audience. With Jesus, we can now "know" God as Father.

In baptism, we call God our Father, for he truly is. Jesus taught us to call God "Father" when he taught his disciples the "Our Father". Jesus revealed a God who is a merciful and loving father. This alone is enough to make us weep, if we are honest.

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus continues to reveal the Father. He does so today by using an example about a judge and a persistent widow. As we hear about this judge and we learn about his motivations, remember what Jesus is saving: God IS NOT LIKE this judge. It is wrong to think that Jesus is saying we need to pester and annoy God until he begrudgingly gives us what we want. No! The Gospel story of Jesus tells us of a woman approaching the judge consistently over a long period of time and demanding from him a favor. The judge delays, avoids, and doesn't care much about the widow. In fact, the judge cares only about himself. If he renders a favorable judgment on the woman, it is for his sake, not the woman's. But our God, the Father revealed by Jesus, is not like this judge. This means we will not have to wait for an answer since he is a good father, not a selfish judge. God will act in our favor because he loves us, not because he is bothered by us. God always hears us. This revelation provides us with some deep truths about the Father and about how amazing it is to become a Christian. First, Jesus wants us to know God as Father and merely as judge. While God is the Divine Judge, Jesus taught us to call him "Father", and this means something. Second, we must know that he loves us and doesn't just "put up" with us. This is important because many think of themselves as too lost and too sinful to get any real attention from God the Father. But this is not the case. Lastly, we should know that God the Father is always attentive to us. We don't have to go to prayer in a fretful and anxious way. Rather, we can go to prayer as a child goes before their father.





Saints Isaac Jogues (1560-1646) and John de Brébeuf (1593-1649) and their companions October 19

Their mission was to New France, but these missionaries found in present day New York State and the Province of Ontario a world wildly different from the homes they left behind. Six Jesuit priests, Fathers Isaac Jogues, John de Brébeuf, Anthony Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier, and Noel Chabanel—and Jesuit lay volunteers Rene Goupil and John Lalande—shared the gospel with the Native Americans they met, in languages they painstakingly learned, and through images they creatively adapted to the indigenous cultures (for example, John de Brebeuf's "Twas in the Moon of Wintertime: the Huron Carol"). But their evangelization was caught up in turmoil beyond their control: a smallpox epidemic. battles between French and English trading interests—the traders united only by their willingness to exploit the Native Americans and conflict among the tribes themselves, Huron, Mohawk, Iroquois. The missionaries' perseverance despite exhausting hardships, their steadfast courage in facing unspeakable tortures, and undaunted love even for those who martyred them, bore fruit, immediately in Kateri Tekakwitha's sanctity, eventually in the Catholicism that still flourishes in the United States and Canada.

Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time Perseverance

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives a clever example of why we are to persevere in praying, even if we think the prayer is not being heard. The crooked judge just wanted to get that widow off his back. So we can pray to God with even more confidence, because we know that God loves us and will answer our prayers.

St. Paul carries that theme of perseverance even further. He is not just talking about prayer here; he encourages Timothy to persevere in proclaiming God's word as well. That command we may find more challenging than prayer. He tells Timothy (and us!) to "convince, reprimand and encourage through all patience and teaching" (2 Timothy 4:2). How can we do that?

"Convince" reminds me that our faith should be reasonable. Jesus' command to love one another, for instance, can be taught much more convincingly by giving examples of love. A mother who hugs her child when he is hurt and encourages him when he feels lost is teaching that command in a way that will be remembered much longer than just telling him to love people.

Paul also talks about reprimanding each other. Most people find it difficult to reprimand someone they are in charge of, much less one who is equal in status. That's where patience comes in. A reprimand can be made patiently and gently, as a sign of concern rather than authority.

Paul lastly mentions teaching. Parents can do their part by teaching the stories from the Bible, helping children to see God in creation, teaching them to pray, and being good examples of God's love for them. If you send your children to religion classes or the parish school, do what you can to support the teachers so that what the children learn at school is practiced at home.
