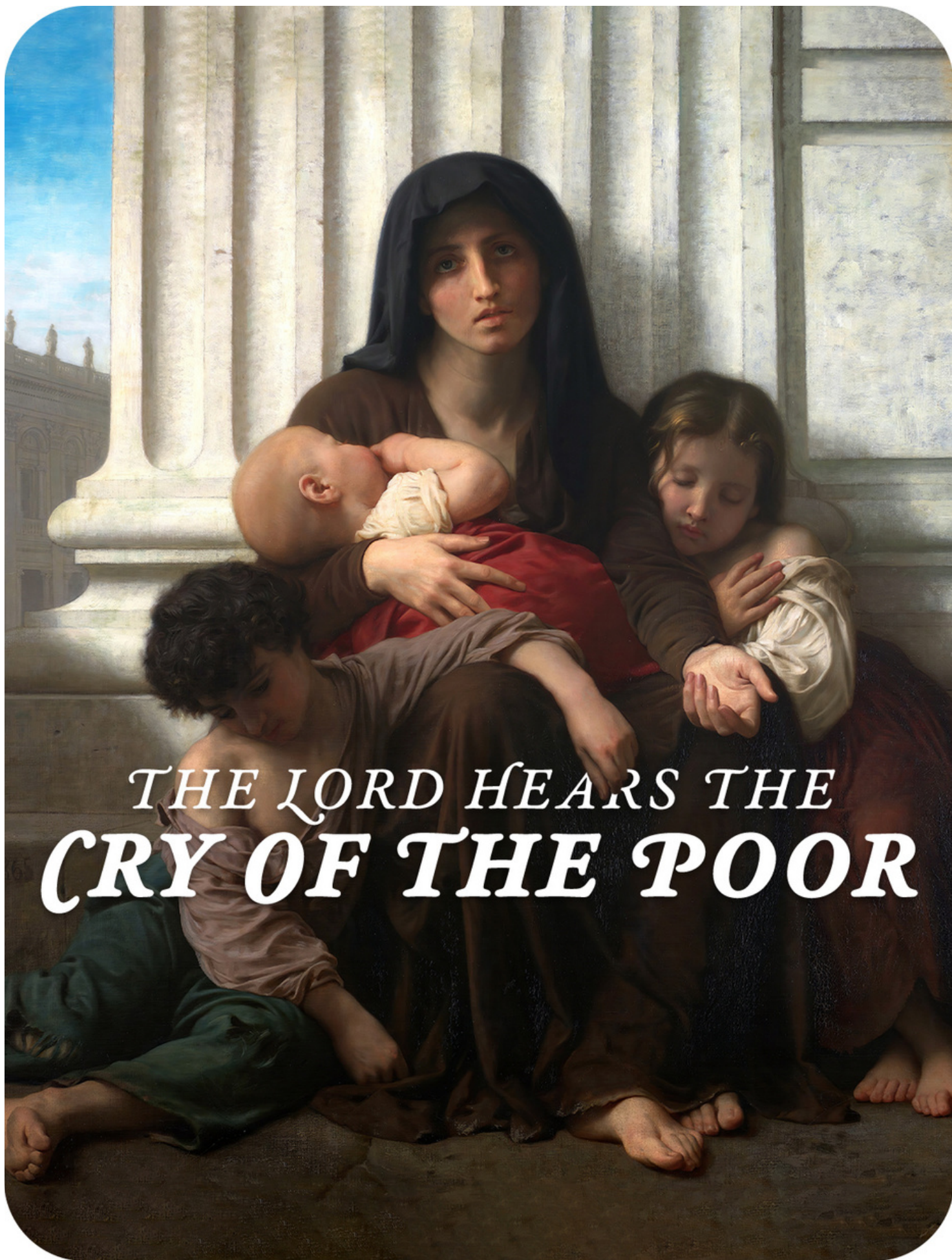

The Lord hears the cry of the poor

Dear Parishioners,

Jesus gives a very strong, but very consoling teaching about prayer. It involves a Pharisee and a tax collector. Right away, we should remember something important. To better understand the example Jesus uses, we should put ourselves in the first century AD. A faithful Jewish person would assume without question two things: Pharisee is a very holy and devout man, and a tax collector was a traitor to his people and a public sinner. Thus, while today we have a negative view of the Pharisees, this was not the case in the time of Jesus. In this light, the example Jesus uses was incredibly shocking to his listeners. So, the Pharisee has three problems.

First, he can be praised for taking time to pray and to go up to the Temple. But there is a fundamental issue with his prayer: He Prays to Himself. At its heart, the Catholic Catechism (2558) tells us what prayer is by taking a quote from St. Therese of Lisieux: "For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy." Prayer reaches out to God. It is turning oneself toward heaven. It is love. But the prayer of the Pharisee lacks any relationship to God. In fact, Luke wants us to know that he "prayed to himself".

And so, while the Pharisee is going to the Temple to pray, he is still all alone. God is not involved in this moment. He is Boastful. Second, the issue with his prayer is how awfully boastful and conceited it is. He is sort of merely looking in a mirror, admiring his self-proclaimed virtue. He should be looking toward heaven and not himself! This spiritual narcissism, self-love that destroys his soul, is fundamentally changing everything about his spiritual life, and not for the better. He is Competitive.

Third, the issue with his prayer is that he spends time looking around him at others. He wants to make sure he is "ahead of the rest". It reveals that the Pharisee's spiritual pursuits are a game, a competition. He wants to see if he can get first place, to prove he is better than the rest. This feeds his arrogance and conceit. He can't look at his neighbor with mercy. Rather, he loves looking down on them and judging them, as if somehow this was pleasing to God. Now, we turn now to the tax collector. Jesus says this man was justified, despite his public status. It makes sense when we hear Jesus explain his main point: "Everyone who exalts himself is humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted." (Luke 18:14) We are all called to be like Jesus, who humbled himself to die on a cross. This is ultimately why humility is so great a virtue. It is the virtue of Jesus! The tax collector only stays at the back of the Temple. Unlike the Pharisee, he is at least living in the truth. Unlike the Pharisee, he has a humble opinion of himself. For a Jewish person of the time, closeness to God and the Temple was reserved for only those ritually clean.

Many things could make a person unclean, such as touching blood or eating the wrong foods. This tax collector knows he is unclean. He knows he is far from holiness. He does not feel worthy to walk up to God, but rather keeps his distance, out of humility. But the man also knows he needs mercy. He wants that from God. Honestly, we do not know this man's life story. We don't know how he ended up as a tax collector. Only God does. And thus, only God can judge him.

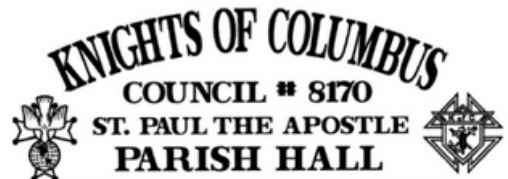

Saints Simon and Jude, Apostles

Saint Jude, apostle and . . . Hollywood success story? Indeed! Beyond Simon's being a "Zealot" for Israel's liberation and Jude's question about Jesus revealing himself (John 14:22), no historic facts are known about either saint. But Saint Jude's well-known patronage of "lost causes" and "hopeless cases" is largely due to a desperate vow made just before World War II by a struggling entertainer, the son of Arab-American immigrants, Danny Thomas. Unemployed, his wife about to give birth, Danny, attending Mass, impulsively donated his last \$7.00 to the collection, promising: "Saint Jude, if you help me find my way in life, I will build a shrine in your honor!" Older Americans remember well Danny's long, successful movie and television career. Grateful parents worldwide know the miracles that have taken place for fifty years at his Saint Jude Children's Research Hospital, where needy children are cared for regardless of race, religion, or financial resources, and monumental advances continue in healing and preventing pediatric cancers and catastrophic childhood diseases. A living, life-giving partnership is this "Communion of Saints": Simon, Jude, Danny Thomas—us!

Know Your Saints

The Gospel for today's feast is always Matthew's account of the Beatitudes. At first they seem to favor the meek, the humble, the merciful. But then Jesus ends with some tough ones, aimed at those who are persecuted, insulted, and slandered. While it may sound negative, Jesus is actually giving us encouragement.

Jesus isn't telling us to make enemies, but not to be afraid if we do. An important part of our faith is the imperative to spread it. Some people do that by sharing their faith during their lunch break. Others teach formation classes to prospective Christians. So there are many ways to spread the faith, and many types of saints who are celebrated today.

Maybe today would be a good day to learn about your favorite saint. What made her special? How did he spread the faith? What persecution did they suffer? Perhaps you could talk about the saints with your children. What saint shares a name with your child? As St. John says in the second reading, we are all God's children (1 John 3:2). As we get to know our favorite saints, their lives can inspire us to face persecution or ridicule for our faith—or at least the courage to talk about our faith, and maybe change someone else's life.
