Small acts
of faith reveal
God's greatness

Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel, Jesus challenges us with a lesson on humility. He chooses to use an example of a servant who, after completing his day's work, is reminded to say to himself, "I am just an unprofitable servant, having done what I was obliged to do." These words sound rather blunt from Jesus. We may wish to hear something that sounds nicer. But we should understand his words from within the full context of the Gospel. Jesus' words are a reminder to be humble and not to fall into spiritual pride. Pride is one of the seven deadly sins: pride, greed, wrath, lust, envy, gluttony, and sloth. Each of these also has a spiritual dimension.

For example, in pride, we can be proud of many things in our lives: a fancy car, financial accomplishments, intellectual abilities, etc. But pride doesn't stop at our material possessions or human accomplishments. We can also become proud of our spiritual accomplishments. When this happens, we can be on dangerous ground! The danger of spiritual pride is that it is so subtle and quietly insidious in our lives. We don't see the damage it is doing before it's already too late. What is spiritual pride? Have you ever felt like God should answer your prayers because you deserve it? Or looked down on someone else spiritually or morally? Or felt that God owed you something special because of who you are? Or it felt hard to forgive someone who has hurt you? Or felt the need to correct someone spiritually or morally? Or assumed you will get a high place in heaven? If so, this passage is speaking directly to you! There are two significant dangers that arise from spiritual pride: illusions of self-righteousness and temptations to judge others.

The first danger, self-righteousness, is pharisaical. It emerges when we begin to believe that our fidelity to God's commandments or our good works entitle us to special favor in heaven. We may think, "I've attended Mass every Sunday, prayed my rosary, given to charity—surely I've earned a high place in God's kingdom." This mindset distorts the truth of our relationship with God. The servant in the parable doesn't demand a reward for doing his duty, nor should we. Our good deeds, while pleasing to God, do not make us deserving of salvation as if it were a transaction. Salvation is a gift of grace, freely given by God's mercy, not a wage we earn.

The second danger is the temptation to judge others, which often follows self-righteousness. When we elevate ourselves, we begin to look down on those we perceive as less faithful—perhaps the Catholic who misses Mass, struggles with sin, or seems less devout. This is a real problem for a Christian because it robs us of the ability to be merciful. We might think, "I'm not like them; I'm better because I follow the rules." Our focus should be on our own faithfulness, not on measuring others' shortcomings.

The antidote to spiritual pride is humility. By recognizing ourselves as "unprofitable servants," we acknowledge that all we have is from God, and our duty is to serve Him without expecting anything special in return.

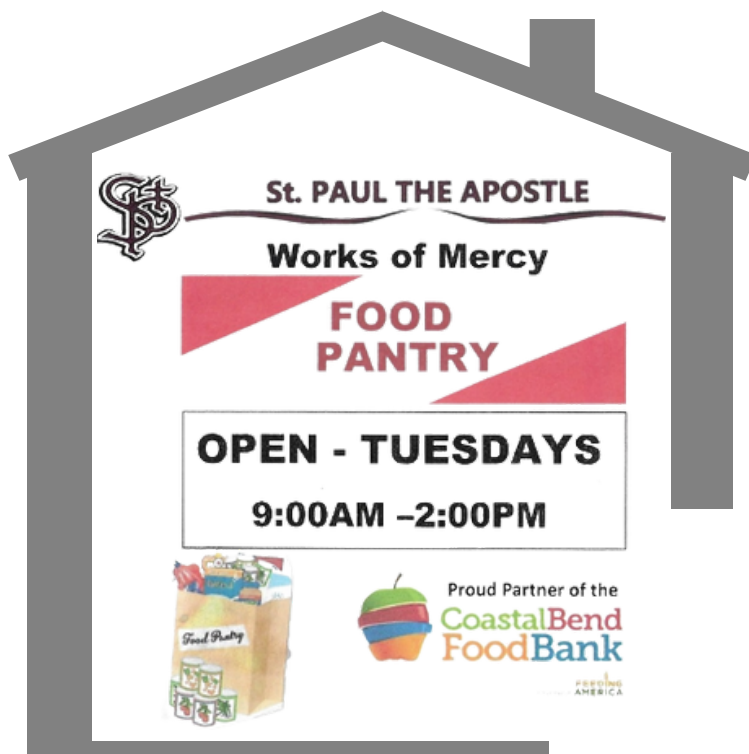

POPE SAINT JOHN XXIII (1881-1963)
October 11

Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was an ordinary man who achieved extraordinary things in the 20th century. Born into a farming family in northern Italy, he joined the Secular Franciscan order and served in Rome in various capacities following his ordination. During World War II, his diplomacy helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people. He was named a cardinal in 1953, and later elected pope, taking the name John after his father and St. John Lateran. Pope John soon became famous for his wit and he began meeting with world political and religious leaders. His writings include "Mother and Teacher" (1961) and "Peace on Earth" (1963). He enlarged the College of Cardinals, making it more international. He opened the Second Vatican Council and set the tone for it stating "...the Spouse of Christ prefers to make use of the medicine of mercy rather than that of severity." He is nicknamed "Good Pope John". May Pope Saint John XXIII encourage us by his teachings and example, to understand the Gospel better and to understand each other better.

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Taking Care of Business

When we were kids, my brothers and sisters and I thought that you were not supposed to say the blessing before meals in a restaurant. We were probably afraid of being embarrassed if non-believers saw us praying. I think of that when I hear St. Paul telling Timothy, "God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control" (2 Timothy 1:7). Our readings mention the difficulties that people of faith will encounter, and each reading has its own way of facing those hardships.

Jesus gives the practical advice: Look at the difficulties of being a disciple as just part of your job. So if the Lord says I must forgive those who hurt me, or be patient with customers, or share what I have with the poor—no problem; it's part of the job of a disciple. Too tired to go to church after work on a holy day? Just taking care of business.

Paul reminds us in the second reading to stir the gifts of the Spirit into flame. If you take time to pray every day, if you look for God in other people, if you see difficulties as your share of the cross—you will begin to experience those gifts.

We can trust that this is more than just wishful thinking by going to the first reading. When the prophet cries out for help with the misery and violence in the world, he hears God's promise that the vision (of hope for deliverance) will be fulfilled even if it seems to be delayed. We too hear that promise when we start to get discouraged, for God's promise "will not disappoint" (Habakkuk 2:3).
