

Dear Parishioners,

Each November 2nd we are invited by the liturgy to pray for the faithful departed. While we can celebrate their lives and recall the beautiful moments we had with our departed loved ones, above all we gather to pray for those who may still be in a state of purification and thus benefit from our prayers. The reality of purgatory is something that sets Catholicism apart from many of our fellow Christians in Protestant denominations.

Have you ever found yourself struggling to explain this belief to another person? If so, this text is for you!

Today, let's look over this Catholic teaching and see what is and what is not part of our belief. We will see that purgatory starts now! Because of the amount of ink spilled on this topic, and because it gets brought up by those who oppose Catholicism, it can seem that the Catholic Church has a vast body of teaching on purgatory.

This is not the case at all. The Church has a very modest teaching on the subject. Namely, after death, if a person is not ready yet to stand before God: a final preparation exists; it is cleansing and purifying and we can pray for and thus help any soul that is undergoing this purification. There is indeed some stark imagery about purgatory that comes from the Middle Ages. Many saints of the time told stories about mystical visions of purgatory. These stories coincide timewise with writers like Dante (The Divine Comedy) who lent their imagination to the theme. As such, while much has been said unofficially in the Catholic world about purgatory, the Church has preferred to keep things simple. On the one hand, the Church has had to clarify that our final purification "is entirely different from the punishment of the damned." (CCC 1031)

A good summary of the Church's teaching is found in paragraph 1030 of the Catechism: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven." Here is a great question to ask yourself. If you were to die right now, do you think you are ready to immediately stand before the holy of holies and be with God? Or, are there some things I need to apologize for? Are there any angry feelings and grudges that I need to let go of? Do I have any attachment to vice of any sort? Is there any stain on my soul, even the slightest, that may need to be washed away before I enter God's presence? If you answered ves to any of the above, then you can understand purgatory. Here is the kicker: for Catholics, whatever that preparation is by which a soul is made ready for the Kingdom of Heaven, we call purgatory. Nobody dies early. In God's Providence, he knows all things and provides all things. We can trust that God gives us already in this life everything we would need to be prepared for heaven. The problem is at our end. We don't always take advantage of this! If a person responds to God's grace here in this life, they will be ready for heaven at the moment of death. That is why in a colloquial sense, purgatory begins now. In this life, we are on a journey to heaven, All along the way, we have moments that can move us closer to holiness or further away. On this purifying journey, the Ten Commandments are the guardrails that point the way. The Beatitudes are the center line of the highway. The Saints walk on the center line. The Sinners bounce back and forth between the guardrails. Because most of us are "bouncing back and forth", purgatory is a welcome belief!



Saint Martin de Porres (1579-1639) November 3

An old illustration pictures Martin de Porres, finger to his lips - "Shhhh!" - as several mice peek out of sacristy vestment drawers, preparing to join a rodent "procession" following him out of church! Martin's rescue of these unwelcome "guests," and statues depicting him, broom in hand, feeding a dog, cat, bird, and mouse from the same dish symbolize his life and sanctity. Initially denied entrance by the Dominicans because of "mixed race" (Spanish father, Panamanian mother), Martin cherished society's marginalized. For him, menial tasks, lovingly done, were sacred. Great and lowly alike feasted on his charity. Enemies were reconciled by this "poor mulatto" (his self-description), kind even to those whose racism demeaned him. Apprenticed to a surgeonbarber in his youth—thus patron saint of hair stylists and public health providers—Martin dispensed healing and dignity to Lima's poorest, serving in them the Christ he adored for hours in the Blessed Sacrament. By the time he died, all Peru called him "Martin the Charitable," a title even those of us who will never be called "saint" might still aspire to. -Peter Scagnelli

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed The Church Suffering

One of the most beautiful aspects of our Catholic faith is the Communion of Saints. Whether it be the Church Militant still fighting the good fight here on earth, or the Church Suffering enduring their final time of purification in Purgatory, or the Church Triumphant rejoicing with our Lord in heaven, we are all in it together. We are one Church, united in the mysteries of the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord.

Today, let us pray for all the souls in purgatory, that they may soon gaze upon the glorious face of our Saviour, and may they in turn pray for us, that we may one day join them in Heaven.
