Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate a liturgical feast that some may wonder what exactly it's about. Why is the dedication of a Church

building in the city of Rome a big deal?

The short answer is that the Lateran Basilica was the first public building, the first temple where Christians found themselves free to worship. They were in the capital of the Roman empire, and the persecutions of the Church had finally ended. And so, they "came out of the catacombs" and built a magnificent church.

This is the day we celebrate that the Catholic Church was able to worship publicly and freely.

At the Basilica's entrance, there is an inscription that reads: "Holy Church of Lateran, mother and head of all churches of the city and of the world." The beginnings of all parish churches throughout the world are found there, at the Lateran Basilica. Now, that's the short answer. But there is a longer answer, what we can call a spiritual meaning to today's celebration.

In the Old Testament, something the Jewish people longed for, fought for, and sacrificed for was the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. Because of the Temple, the Jewish people had a place to encounter God. Because of the Temple, God had a place to dwell in their midst. Because of the Temple, the Jewish people had a home and an identity. The Temple was important to Jesus.

In the Gospel today, Jesus purifies the Temple of some of the excesses and corruptions that sinful and greedy men had brought into the Temple. Jesus also reveals a revolutionary idea. As he is challenged about his actions, Jesus hints at something greater than the Temple: Himself.

Jesus refers to his body as the Temple and speaks about his

Resurrection.

Saints Peter and Paul, in their letters, bring us as well into this mystery: "Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?" And, "As you come to him, a living stone rejected by men but in the sight of God chosen and precious, you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." We believe that all of us make up the Mystical Body of Christ. By our baptism, we are united to Christ, and we are also being built up, chosen by God for this beautiful calling.

The Jewish feast of Hanukkah is also called the Feast of the Dedication. There is a spiritual link to this Jewish feast today. It involves the meaning of the word "dedication". In the Book of Maccabees, we encounter the tragic story of how the Jewish Temple was desecrated by an invading army. Three years later, Judas Maccabeus was able to lead a revolt and recapture after. Temple. After they had cleared away the desecrated altar, cleaned and refurnished the sanctuary, they celebrated a "rededication" of the Temple. The Hebrew word for this "dedication" or "sanctifying" was hanukkah. Jesus said, while in the Temple, that he had been dedicated or hanukkah-ed by the Father. Jesus calls himself the one "the Father has sanctified and sent into the world."

Jesus is the New Hanukkah. As we are part of his Mystical Body, by our baptism, we also have been "sanctified", or by way of expression, we have been "hannukah-ed" by the Father. This means we have a high and noble calling. We are part of the Temple of God! All of these spiritual layers of meaning surround the great feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica!

Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850-1917) November 13

Burly longshoremen glared at the woman in widow's dress who interrupted their drinking to beg money, in broken English, for her orphanage. The bar exploded in laughter as one man responded by spitting in her face. "That was for me," the woman smiled. "Do you have anything

for the children?" Given today's national debate, could it be as much God's sense of humor as God's will for our sanctification that our first "American" saint should be an immigrant and naturalized citizen? Frances Cabrini, adopting the name "Xavier," confided to Pope Leo XIII her longing to follow her Jesuit patron to Asia. But the Pope replied, "Not East—West!" So she and her Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart exchanged exotic dreams of China for the impoverished reality of Italian ghettos across the United States and Central and South America. Before her death, Frances had founded seventy educational, health care, child, and family service institutions. Today, from Siberia to Ethiopia, in sixteen countries, Mother Cabrini's sisters and lay associates embody her practical spirituality: "Let's get to work! We'll have eternity to rest!"

Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome Why All the Fuss about Buildings?

What's all the fuss about buildings? Doesn't the Bible tell us over and over again not to focus on material things but rather on the heart? Aren't we supposed to focus on the Church rather than a church?

Well, if the Church has proclaimed this day a feast, then it must have some great significance, so let's find it. The Archbasilica of St. John Lateran in Rome is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome. His cathedra, his bishop's seat, is found at St. John Lateran. This basilica was built on terrain donated by Emperor Constantine himself and celebrated the freedom of worship granted by the Edict of Milan. Wow.

Ok, so maybe this isn't just any old church. It holds special significance, reminding Catholics of the courage of the early Christians who fought for freedom of religion and the unity of the universal Church with the Holy See.

This feast can serve as a reminder to us of the respect due our own parish church. Do we see it as a place of honor, reverence and community worship? Do we dress and act appropriately, considering we are in God's presence? Do we offer ourselves together with Christ in the Eucharistic sacrifice, uniting ourselves with Catholics throughout the world?

May we celebrate our universal Church today and may we thank God for all of the churches that have been built and dedicated to allow us a space to worship freely. Maybe we should make a fuss about these beautiful buildings after all.
