Dear Parishioners,

The message of the Bible is not just directed to people in the past. The Bible actually speaks to all people in all time and has a clear message for us today as we celebrate this third Sunday of Advent.

The message today is to be patient, to enter courageously the desert, to allow yourself to become like a seed that dies to itself in order to grow and bear fruit. This Advent, the Church invites us to consider all that we can hope for through life in Christ and what we hope for in eternal life.

For truly, the Christian life is a participation in the life of heaven already begun here on earth. What does entering the desert mean for us today? It means three things. First, the desert can be seen as a conversion moment. Israel had to prepare itself for the Promised Land by a forty-year sojourn in the desert. The wandering was not in vain. Each year and each day, the hearts of the new generation of the children of Israel were being stretched and reformed until they were able to give God the most important place in their life. The forty years had a purpose. Like the people of Israel, the desert is a place to face ourselves, to overcome ourselves, and to let go of all the sin in our lives. Second, the desert means getting oneself away from the noise of the world. The desert is silent. Out in this symbolic desert, we can silence the many voices around us so as to hear the only voice that matters: God. The desert represents getting away from worldliness and all the petty distractions that bring us down. This Advent, going into the desert means: spending less time "connected" to the world (phones and social media); spending less time on frivolous shopping and entertainment; spending more time with God; spending more time with the important relationships in our lives. Third, life in the desert is simple. The landscape of the desert is stark and bare. There are no "distractions". The desert helps us focus. In the desert, you have to find one thing: water. All other "distractions" in life are useless and quickly become less important. Finding water is the one and only goal, the one thing necessary. Likewise, for a Christian, there is one thing necessary: Jesus Christ. This teaches us to be as simple as children and to abandon complexities and unnecessary vain pursuits. The desert teaches us to have a simpler life.

This Advent, going into the desert means: seeking to simplify one's life, saying "no" to excessive commitments that pull me away from my duties and goals. It also means seeking to focus one's life and saying "yes" to good and holy things that help me arrive closer to my personal goals.

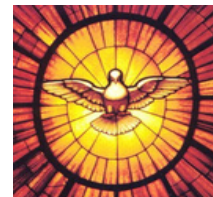

SAINT JOHN OF THE CROSS (c. 1542-1591) December 14

How beautiful the experience of love for God and neighbor, a fire deep within! How disheartening when love suddenly cools; and our souls grow dark, our prayer arid. How painful when misunderstanding, even rejection, comes our way, sometimes from those we least expect. For all such "seasons of the soul," an inspiring fellow-pilgrim is the poet and mystic, John of the Cross. As a young Carmelite, he was recruited by Teresa of Avila for her Discalced ("barefoot," evangelical poverty) Carmelite reform, striving to renew the Church from within after the Protestant Reformation had led countless religious away. John suffered unspeakably harsh abuse, even imprisonment, from friars who rejected this reform. Yet during these times of deepest suffering, John composed spiritual masterpieces that still guide souls to God, their titles reflecting his own painful yet ultimately victorious journey: from *The Dark Night of the Soul*, through *The Ascent of Mount Carmel*, to his *Spiritual Canticle* and *The Living Flame of Love*. John summarized his spirituality simply: "Put love where there is no love, and you will find love."

Third Sunday of Advent The Prophet's Profit

Old Testament prophets were not very popular. Most were killed or exiled because they challenged people to follow the commands of God. John the Baptist suffered the same way. So what kept the prophets going?

First of all, the prophets had faith in God. They believed that God spoke through them, that God would protect them and support them. Second, they had patience. They kept going when people rejected their preaching. Some prophets had to be patient with their own weaknesses.

The third gift of the prophets was hope: That by keeping God's commands, God's people would be renewed, along with all of creation. Our first reading is an example of such hope, with its descriptions of deserts becoming gardens and the sick and disabled being healed and strengthened.

So what do we learn from those prophets? First, we need to keep our faith in God strong. If you go to church once a week, the bare minimum, it would be like exercising only once a week and thinking that will keep you in shape. Second, we need patience and not just with our kids. We need to be patient with ourselves and with God. Some people stop going to church because they don't see any spiritual growth in themselves. So be patient; don't expect to become a saint right away. Finally, the reading from Isaiah gives us hope that God will open our eyes of faith, clear our ears to hear His word, (Is 35:5) and "meet him with joy and gladness" (Is 35:10).

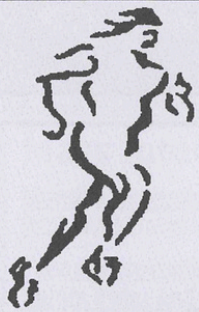
