ANGELUS

Dear Parishioners,

Joseph is such a silent man in the Gospels. Yet while he never utters a word in the pages of the Gospels, his life speaks volumes. Given today's reading, we cannot fail to ponder this man's life of virtue.

Both Mary and Joseph were a necessary part of the Christmas story. Joseph was a man deeply in love with his Jewish faith. He was a righteous man in the Jewish sense: He heeded the voice of God and kept the law. As a man of prayer, the Temple in Jerusalem was the center of his life of faith.

The Temple was for the Jewish people the dwelling place of God. Inside the Temple was the Holy of Holies, a sacred source of wonder for the Jewish people. Joseph would have prayed in the Temple often and brought his family, Mary and Jesus, to the Temple each year.

As the temple was a central element of Joseph's life, he received an abundance of blessings when he took Mary into his home. For Mary herself is a New Temple, her womb the Holy of Holies where God dwells. In a sense, Joseph no longer needed to travel to Jerusalem to worship God: he had God's very presence within his own home.

But for this blessing to come to Joseph, he had to pass through a trial.

This can be what we will call a "dark night" moment. We read today that Joseph received dreams to understand God's will. Mary, Zechariah, and the Shepherds receive the visits of angels to learn of God's will, while Joseph and the Magi receive dreams. It is important to highlight that Joseph is praised for the promptness with which he obeyed these dreams.

In so doing, by taking Mary into his home, Joseph says "yes" to God's will. Even when the specifics and the consequences of God's will were not very clear.

Another element of his life is that Joseph comes across as a man who remains silent before God because he is a man who listens to God. Like Mary, Joseph says "yes" to God. He gives a silent "fiat" (Be it done to me!) to God. In a sense, God chose to "need" Mary's spoken fiat as well as Joseph's silent fiat. The silent "fiat" of Joseph perhaps hides much holiness on his end. Joseph was not the Immaculate Conception. Joseph was an ordinary mortal like the rest of us. Joseph had to have faith and trust in God; he had to suffer much in his life.

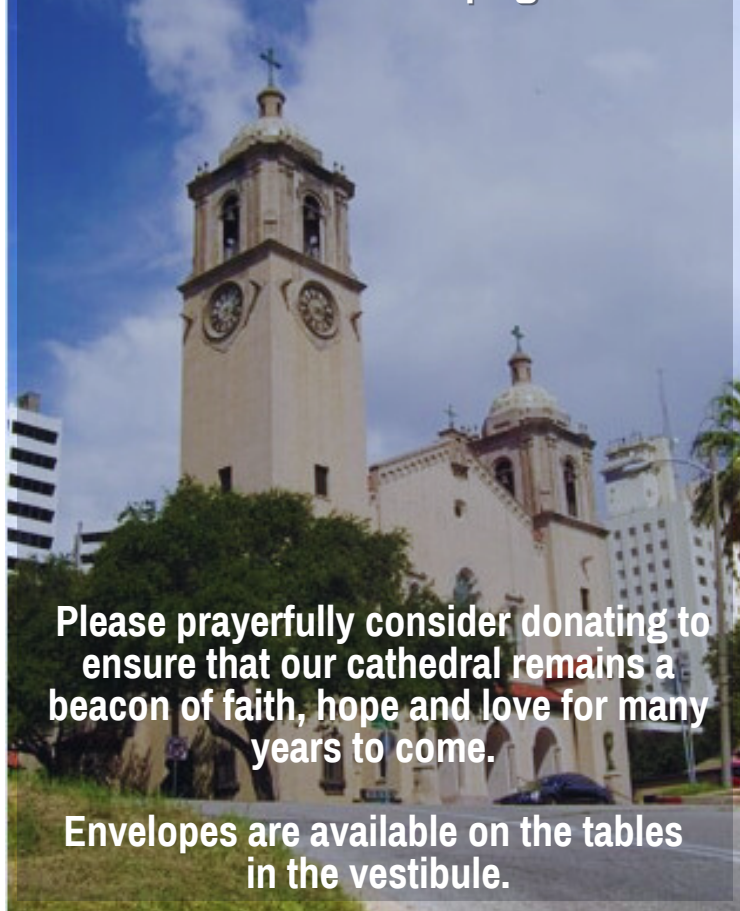
Running for his life and protecting Mary and Jesus as they fled to Egypt could not have been easy. And yet Joseph gives his assent to whatever God has in store for him. We tend to paint the Holy Family's flight into Egypt in rosy colors during our Christmas pageants. But the reality was of a dangerous journey for Joseph. He did not know whom to trust, but he knew that God was depending on him to help Jesus and Mary. This had to be a huge weight on Joseph's shoulders. To learn a new language, to face hunger and cold, to not know if he could provide for Mary and Jesus from one day to the next... all of this formed him into the saint that he became. The secret to his holiness, and the example he gives to every Christian man, is to be a man who listens for the voice of God, and uses all his strength and abilities to heed this Voice.

For that, he is a silent saint whose very life speaks volumes.

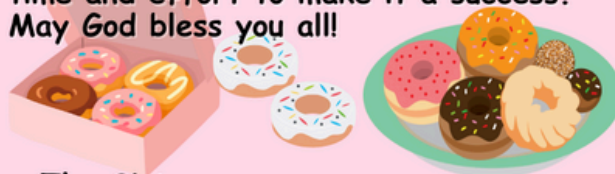

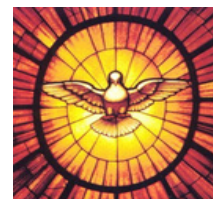

SAINT JOHN OF KANTY (1390-1473) December 23

Perhaps not many have heard of today's saint. A native of Poland, as a young man John proved himself to be a bright student at the University of Krakow. He then went on to become a priest and professor but was later prevented from teaching by rivals and became a parish priest instead. Yet, difficulties found him there as well, in the form of personal fear and opposition by parishioners. Those who took the time to get to know him were eventually won over by his humility and kindness. He eventually returned to Krakow to teach Scripture but led a sacrificial and austere life, keeping only the bare essentials and donating the rest to those in need. He slept little, ate little and gave much. His life is a great example of focusing on the essential - Jesus - and pruning out the unnecessary. Lord, grant us the grace to be more humble, selfless and kind. Saint John of Kanty, pray for us!

Fourth Sunday of Advent Emmanuel



On this last Sunday before Christmas, we see that Jesus' birth is the fulfillment of the promise of Emmanuel, meaning "God is with us." (Mt 1:23) The gospel refers to the first reading from Isaiah. There we see the king of Judah, Ahaz, is under attack by the kings of Aram and Israel. He wants to ask the Assyrians for help, instead of relying on God. He is afraid to admit his lack of faith. So the weakness of Ahaz gives us the wonderful prophecy of the birth of Jesus.

In the gospel, Joseph also does not understand how Mary was pregnant. But unlike Ahaz, Joseph did have faith in God and the message of the angel. He took Mary as his wife and helped her through her pregnancy and afterwards in raising Jesus.

So now we have to choose who we rely on: Do I act like Ahaz, relying on the worldly powers, or like Joseph who trusted the Lord? If I look at my actions and priorities, I might be more like Ahaz than I want to admit.

How much time do I spend watching television (especially now that it's in HD) compared to time in prayer? How much time do I spend reading the scriptures compared to the newspaper or magazines? If I really believe that "God is with us," which is what Christmas is all about, how much of God can people see in my actions? Maybe if we kept in mind that promise that God IS with us, in the Baptism we received and the sacraments of the Church, and the love of our spouse or parents—we could see how close God really is and let others see in our actions, that Jesus is Emmanuel.

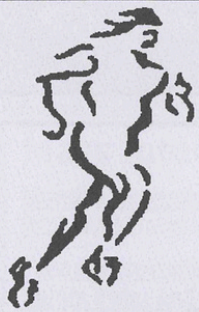
