


Dear parishioners,

The central theme of the Christmas story is family. Fittingly, during the octave of Christmas, we celebrate the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Because of the obedience of each one of these members, the Christmas story happened, and the hero of the story is not just one person, but all three.

In the story of Christmas, we focus a lot on the experience of Mary, the Mother of Jesus. But the experience of Joseph, the foster father of Jesus, is also full of mystery and holiness. While Luke narrates the Christmas story from the perspective of Mary, Matthew seems to tell the story more from the viewpoint of Joseph.

In today's Gospel, we get to see how Joseph went about protecting the Holy Family from Herod. Joseph's relationship to King Herod is actually very complex.

Let us pause for a moment to consider Luke 2:4: "And Joseph too went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David that is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David". Few people have noticed or thought about Joseph as a hidden king of the Jews. Pay attention to the phrase "house and family of David". Joseph is royalty not only as a descendant of David (for he was of the "family of David"), but because he belongs to the royal house of David. Just how close Joseph was to being heir to the Jewish throne is unclear. But as a member of the House of David, Joseph is legitimately within the royal line of succession. He is a legitimate heir to the throne of King David, much more so than the puppet King Herod. While we do not know exactly what being a member of the "house of David" meant for Joseph, it stands to reason that while Herod reigned on the Jewish throne, men like Joseph had to be careful and remain to some degree "hidden".


To consider, therefore, that Joseph is of royal descent, that he is truly a "hidden king," is a fitting pattern that blends well with the story of Christmas: Jesus is the King of Kings, and he comes to earth in a hidden and humble way at Bethlehem. Joseph is more than a mere carpenter. Under the humble façade of a carpenter is a man who is well aware of the dangers that King Herod and the Romans pose to himself and his family. This truth about Joseph's own hidden royalty is something every Christian husband and father is called to live out in his own way. This is because no baptized Christian man is "ordinary". By baptism, a Christian's life is transformed in such a way that we become part of God's royal family. As such, the many hidden sacrifices of a Christian father and husband become an exercise of our divine royalty. Back then, in the time of Jesus, the Church needed Joseph to care for the holy family.

Today, the Church needs Christian men everywhere to take on this pattern of St. Joseph, being by baptism "hidden kings" of heaven who watch over their families during our earthly exile.





SAINT THOMAS BECKET (1118-1170)

December 29

To anyone who imagines conflict between religion and politics to be a modern phenomenon, history witnesses otherwise. Martyred under Henry VIII in 1535, Thomas More declared, "I die the King's good servant, but God's first!" Thomas Becket could have said the same four centuries earlier. As Henry II's closest friend and trusted chancellor, Becket, the King presumed, could be counted on, if made Archbishop, to deliver the church to royal control. But Becket experienced a profound conversion, confirmed by the ordination liturgy's rich symbolism of the bishop as Good Shepherd and the church as Bride of Christ. Renouncing secular responsibilities, distributing his wealth to the poor, Thomas became the church's uncompromising champion. Faced with this "new" Becket, the King's previous friendship turned into a ferocious, almost irrational hatred. As eight centuries later, Archbishop Romero would be martyred at the altar of Christ's sacrifice, Becket was slain before the altar of Canterbury Cathedral by royal agents, neither the first nor last good shepherd to lay down his life as the price of freedom for Christ's church and justice for Christ's sheep.

**Solemnity of Mary,
the Holy Mother of God
Remember, Reflect, Respond**



This feast has had several names through history. Strangely, the title that is most confusing to non-Catholics is the official one. When we call Mary the Mother of God, we are not saying that she somehow preceded God or is equal to God. We are simply recognizing that her human son Jesus is also the divine Son of God.

Today's Gospel records one simple action of Mary: to keep these things in her heart. Even in this simple sentence we are given a good example of being a disciple. Like Mary, we need to both keep, or remember, what God has done, and to reflect on what we remember. First, how much do we remember about what God has done for us? How well do we know the stories of salvation found in the scriptures? Do we recall the prayers God has answered, the guidance given, the love of God that others have shown us, the times God has forgiven us?

Second, how much do we reflect on what God has done? Even if we have many memories of God's goodness to us, we also need to pray over them and ask ourselves how we have changed because of what God has done. Do I forgive hurts more readily? Do I share my faith with my family or friends? Do I support my parish with my time or offerings? Let us ask God's help to imitate Mary by remembering and reflecting.


