




Dear Parishioners,

The Bible is full of epic scenes.

Think, for example, of the following: there is the creation of the world in Genesis, over the course of seven days; there is the apocalyptic flood in the time of Noah; there is the dangerous crossing of the Red Sea in the time of Moses; there is the dramatic Transfiguration of Jesus on Mt. Tabor. While these events were amazing in their own right, none of them compared to the moment of the Resurrection, when Jesus rose from the dead.

We would be right to think that the Gospel writers might describe the Resurrection of Jesus with amazing details, flashes of light, peals of thunder, or a terrible earthquake. But if we seek that, we will be disappointed. There are no great visual accounts of how Jesus actually rose from the dead or what his body was like in the tomb the moment he was resurrected. Rather,

God has chosen to show us the Risen Lord, not to tell us about the Resurrection itself. It is not just Matthew's Gospel. All four Gospels have a blackout regarding the specific moment of the Resurrection.

And yet, perhaps the Gospel writers don't think we need any proof or rational arguments about how it happened. They simply wish to tell us that it did happen. And because it happened, life is now different. Something the Gospel writers do highlight is the manner in which Jesus presents himself. He is different, yet the same. Though risen from the dead and having passed through the darkness of the passion, it's still the same Jesus that these women at the tomb know and love from their previous experiences. He comes before them, almost as if by chance. He has an aura of eternity, power, and peace to his persona. And Jesus has a message for them that they may not have expected. Jesus said to the women: "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me." (Matthew 28:10) Jesus tells the apostles to go back to Galilee, and there he will meet them.

Why was this? Jesus asks them all to return to the origin of their vocation. Jesus asked them to go back to the beginning: to the places where they first met him; to the sights and sounds of the many miracles; to the place where Jesus preached the sermon on the mountain.; to the waters of the Sea of Galilee that Jesus had calmed. Jesus wants them to go back to the beginning.

But as they go back, they're different.

The light of the Resurrection has changed the apostles and disciples forever. There in Galilee, they recover the deepest meaning behind their vocation, they recover the initial love that prompted them to leave everything behind and to follow Jesus. The Risen Jesus is the same Jesus but now glorified.

Jesus wishes to take his disciples back to the same places, but all of which are now different because of the Resurrection. As we gather this Easter, the world may look the same as it did yesterday or last week. But it is different. The Resurrection adds color to our monochrome lives. It adds melody to the noise of life. It adds joy to the daily routines of life. Nothing is the same because Jesus has risen from the grave, and eternal life is open for all who believe.

SAINT STANISLAUS, BISHOP AND MARTYR (1030-1079) April 11

Have you ever had to confront evil or injustice? Have you ever tried to reason with those who could not see reason, or share your faith with those who were not open to God? I remember a few episodes in high school where I would ask those around me not to use foul language or when I chose to disassociate with those who were known to drink, smoke or act promiscuously. But all of this pales in comparison to what Stanislaus went through. He was born near Kraków, Poland in 1030. He was ordained a priest,

became known for his preaching and holy example, and was ordained bishop of Kraków in 1072. He was known for his boldness and spoke out against unjust wars, immorality and other evils. Preceding Thomas More and Thomas Becket, all three of them vigorously opposed the evils of unjust government, even to the point of standing up to the king. King Boleslaus killed Stanislaus himself, after the saintly bishop excommunicated him due to his evil ways. May we learn from the example of Saint Stanislaus to boldly proclaim the truth, no matter what the cost.



Easter Sunday Believing Is Seeing

You've heard the saying "Seeing is believing." Today's first reading seems to be just the opposite. You might think that when Jesus rose from the dead, everyone would see him. Yet Peter says that he was only visible to some of the disciples. Even they did not immediately see him. The first thing they saw was the empty tomb, with burial cloths lying on the ground. They may have thought that if his enemies had stolen Jesus' body, they would not have removed the burial cloths; touching a corpse would have made them unclean. So it seems the empty tomb helped them to believe, and believing enabled them to see the Lord. The exception to this may be Thomas, who said he would not believe until he saw and touched Jesus' risen body. Yet when he does see the Lord, Jesus himself declares that believing is primary when he blesses those who have not seen but still believe (John 20:31).

What does this mean for us? Jesus seems to be hidden again. Yet we say that he is present in the sacraments; Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation show that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit live in us. So perhaps we just need to believe in order to see him. Mother Teresa could do it. She said she was amazed at the love she felt when she saw Jesus in the poor and the dying people of Calcutta. Maybe we need to grow in faith so that we can see Jesus in the poor, the dying, the people who annoy us, even our enemies.


