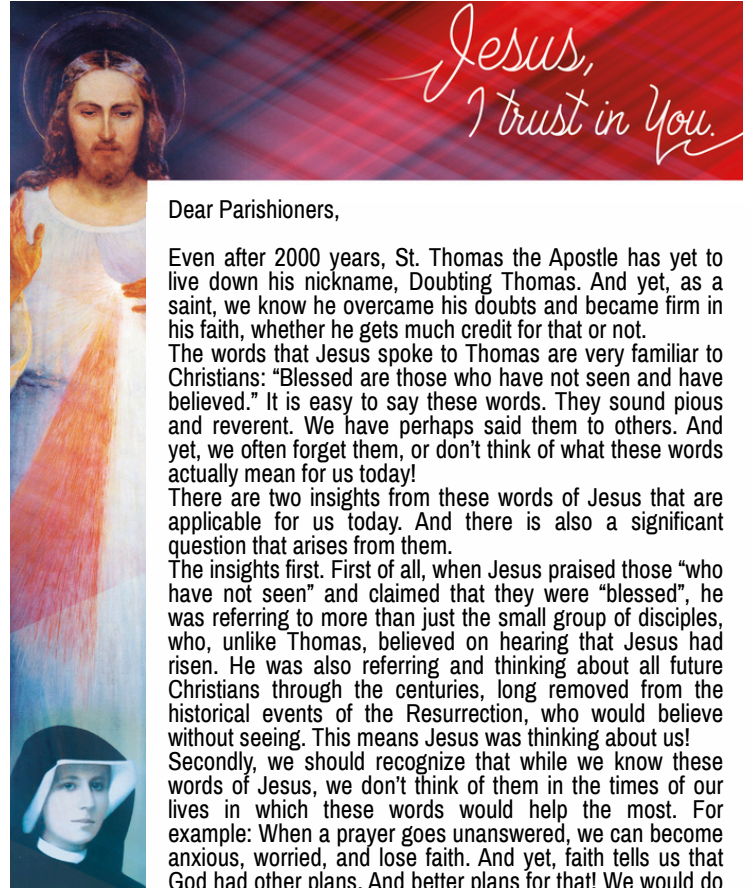

Dear Parishioners,

Even after 2000 years, St. Thomas the Apostle has yet to live down his nickname, Doubting Thomas. And yet, as a saint, we know he overcame his doubts and became firm in his faith, whether he gets much credit for that or not.

The words that Jesus spoke to Thomas are very familiar to Christians: "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." It is easy to say these words. They sound pious and reverent. We have perhaps said them to others. And yet, we often forget them, or don't think of what these words actually mean for us today!

There are two insights from these words of Jesus that are applicable for us today. And there is also a significant question that arises from them.

The insights first. First of all, when Jesus praised those "who have not seen" and claimed that they were "blessed", he was referring to more than just the small group of disciples, who, unlike Thomas, believed on hearing that Jesus had risen. He was also referring and thinking about all future Christians through the centuries, long removed from the historical events of the Resurrection, who would believe without seeing. This means Jesus was thinking about us!

Secondly, we should recognize that while we know these words of Jesus, we don't think of them in the times of our lives in which these words would help the most. For example: When a prayer goes unanswered, we can become anxious, worried, and lose faith. And yet, faith tells us that God had other plans. And better plans for that! We would do well to remember that in all of life's struggles, hardships, and whatever crosses come our way, our faith tells us that in the end, all will be well, because God is in charge, and God wills our good. Even if we can't "see", that is, even if things in life don't make sense to us, we know that God is in charge, and we can trust him! We are left with a significant question, though. Why is faith so precious to God?

To answer this, we must return to the very beginning, to the Garden of Eden, where the Serpent first sowed the seeds of doubt in the human heart. Genesis tells us how the devil approached Adam and Eve, not with an outright denial of God's commands, but with a slanted question, designed to erode their trust in God and to plant the seeds of suspicion about God's goodness in their hearts. The lies of the Devil also struck at the heart of God's Fatherhood. The Devil implied that God was deceiving them. According to the Devil, God was tricking Adam and Eve into thinking that by prohibiting them from eating the apple, God's intentions were evil. The prohibition was not made out of protective love, but out of control. In that moment, Adam and Eve didn't just question a rule; they doubted the Father's goodness, and they doubted whether he was truly a father or whether he was a tyrant.

Original sin explains why faith is so precious to God. Faith isn't merely our intellectual assent to some theological idea, or our punching a ticket to heaven. It's a child's return to the Father. It's the prodigal's return. When Adam and Eve fell, we became orphans

But when we choose faith, as Thomas did, saying, "My Lord and my God!", we are reclaiming God's fatherhood. We allow God to embrace us again, to lavish upon us the inheritance He never withheld. Each and every parent knows just how much a child's well-being means. We can know today that God loves our children and us more than we do ourselves.

**SAINT BERNADETTE SOUBIROUS**  
(1844-1879)  
April 16

With Immaculate Mary's "Ave Maria" for its refrain, Andy Williams' "Village of Saint Bernadette" peaked at #7 on Billboard's Top 40 at Christmas 1959, airing on radio stations all over America. Imagine! In some dioceses, today marks the feast of Bernadette Soubirous, the teenager who, combing a refuse heap for firewood, saw a "beautiful lady" who identified herself in words Bernadette faithfully reported to the bishop, though she did not understand their meaning: "I am the Immaculate Conception." Relentlessly interrogated, she never wavered in her story or sweetness. Chronically ill all her life and dead at thirty-five, Bernadette left behind the shrine at Lourdes where healing waters still flow from the spring that her "beautiful lady" pointed out to her.

### Second Sunday of Easter X-treme Christians

You may notice that Acts of the Apostles is the source of the first reading during the Easter season. This book describes how Christianity grew from a handful of disciples to a major religion. Today's reading about an ideal Christian community is meant to show ordinary believers how to be extraordinary, using three examples I call power, property, and prayer.

Power means the "signs and wonders" (Acts 2:43) performed by the disciples through the power of the Holy Spirit. This should be named last because it takes a lot of faith to heal the sick. If you had the same faith as the apostles, you just might be able to cure the sick. Or you might study to become a doctor and cure them with medical skills. As long as you acknowledge that God gave you the brains and the talent to become a doctor, you are doing God's work.

By property, I mean sharing what you have with those in need. Many disciples were moved to sell their goods and share them with the poor, and word of that must have spread. If you are not called to sell all your goods and become a monk or a nun, you can still tithe to your church or the poor, tutor disadvantaged kids, or help build or repair houses in poor areas. The point is that followers of Christ are not just individual do-gooders. They are a community of believers who care about each other and also care about the non-believers who need help of any kind.

So where did these first disciples get the faith to cure the sick and the love to help the needy? The answer is the third example—prayer. In the first reading we hear how "they devoted themselves . . . to the breaking of the bread" (Acts 2:42, 46)—their name for the Eucharist. They also went to the temple to pray, because at that time most disciples were Jewish Christians. As they heard the Hebrew scriptures, they saw how God's promises were fulfilled in Christ. All of these practices helped unite them to Christ and to each other.
