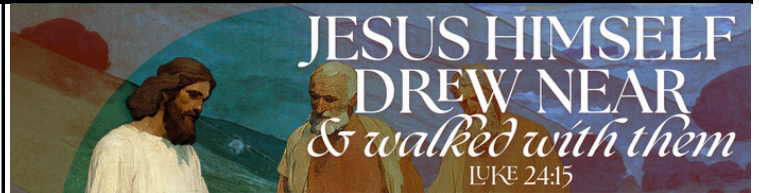
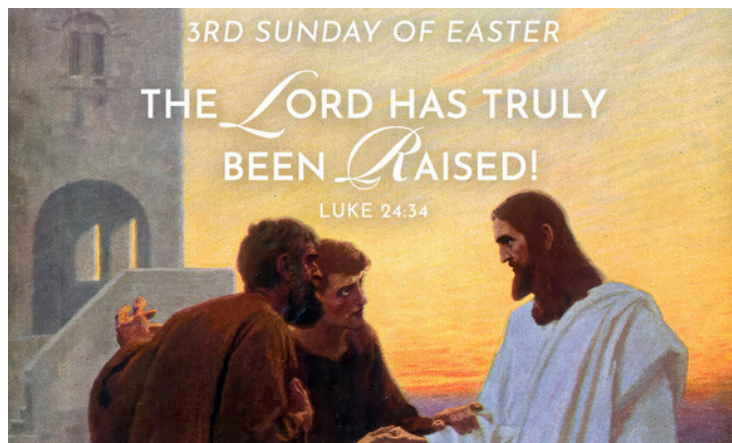

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Dear Parishioners,

In the Gospels, many times we see Christ walking with his disciples. Sometimes it was on a long journey, such as the time when he had to rest by the well in the Samaritan village. Other times, it was a short walk from the upper room to the Garden of Gethsemane.

In the story of the journey of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, again, we see our Lord walking with two of the disciples. This time, however, they don't realize it is Christ.

The story began on a stretch of road between Jerusalem and Emmaus, a seven-mile journey, and took place early on the first morning of the Resurrection. However, the full truth of the Resurrection was not yet entirely known. These two disciples, one named Cleopas, were on their way back home. They had been in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and now they wanted to return to their families. They were disciples of our Lord, and they had expected great signs from Jesus that Passover. Yet all their hopes were dashed; Jesus had been defeated.

So, we have two very heavyhearted men walking on the road, hoping to find some consolation in returning home to their livelihood. It is at this precise moment, when they are downtrodden and in need of Christ's presence, that Christ comes their way.

In this post-resurrection appearance, Christ chose to hide his glory. He adopted the image of a "foreigner," one who was simply visiting Jerusalem, a pilgrim like so many others. Christ walked with these two disciples for seven miles, which could have taken around three hours. We can assume they started mid-morning, since the disciples already knew of the empty tomb and had doubtless lingered a bit in the city to try and understand what had happened. Just imagine Christ's gentle voice revealing mystery upon mystery to these fortunate men for over three hours! The words of Christ were gentle yet strong, easy to understand yet with an eternal ring of truth to them. As they listened, the two disciples' hearts began to burn with enthusiasm and renewed joy. They were enthralled with Christ's preaching; the Word of God was alive and active in their hearts. They were now on fire, and thus Christ knew they were ready for another and greater revelation. As they approached Emmaus, Christ indicated that he was going on a little farther. Christ never imposes his will. He is always in the soul as an invited guest. He does not want to force any of us to accept him; instead, he respects the beautiful gift of freedom we have been given.

The two disciples picked up on Jesus's plans to continue on his journey and would have nothing of it. They wanted Christ. They desired his presence even when they didn't recognize him. Christ was easily persuaded to remain with the disciples that evening, as the sun was setting and the day was almost over. In fact, this is what he most desired in his heart: the invitation to make his home with his beloved children. Christ sat with them at table. Christ, the high Priest, took the bread, blessed it, and broke it. The two disciples suddenly recognized Christ. He allowed them this brief grace, and for an instant Christ was there before them, handing them a piece of bread, which is actually his sacramental Body. Mesmerized by the beauty of Christ and taking the bread almost without thinking, Christ disappeared from their sight. Although he didn't totally disappear, his appearance changed. He remained present, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, in their hands. They looked down at that bread, and the Gospel says they "recognized him."

In the Eucharist, devout Catholics also "recognize" Christ! The beauty of his presence is so amazing, so awesome, that you will find in every parish many souls who spend long hours in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. The Eucharist is truly a window into another world.

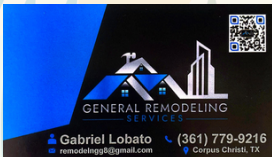

SAINT ANSELM (1033-1109)
April 21

For anyone disheartened at how easily contemporary discussions of disputed Church-State issues escalate from civil discourse to shrill polemic, Anselm provides perspective. Grounded in the Benedictine Rule's balanced "prayer and work," this monk-scholar, called from his Abbey to become Archbishop of Canterbury, was thrust into firestorms of political intrigue, himself the target of warring bishops and nobles, kings and popes. Yet from depths of inner peace, Anselm wrote this moving exhortation by which today's Liturgy of the Hours celebrates him: "Rise up, insignificant man! From your preoccupations, flee a while. From your turbulent thoughts, hide for a time. Your crushing responsibilities cast aside. Your burdensome business lay down. Free a little space for God. Rest a little while in him!" "Faith seeking understanding" was his strikingly contemporary motto; and though renowned as an erudite philosopher-theologian, Anselm also left personal letters, profound for their insights on Christian friendship. Along with those, he composed "A Prayer for My Friends" and "A Prayer for My Enemies," reminding us that those who love God most passionately are also those who love others most humanly.

Third Sunday of Easter Emmaus Amazement

Today's Gospel has some surprises for the disciples going to Emmaus. The first is that Luke tells us Jesus appeared to them, "but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him" (Luke 24:16). More likely, they were prevented by their lack of faith. They knew that Jesus had died, so this man who looked familiar couldn't be him. All they had heard was that Jesus' body was missing from the tomb.

That leads to the second point. They were amazed at how Jesus explained the scriptures. Even the disciples had not thought of them as predicting Jesus' suffering and death. Yet they seem to know the truth of what Jesus was saying. Their story can help us, too.

If you find you are not always able to see Jesus in the people or events of your life, you may need to stretch your faith. One way to do that is to discuss it with others. The two disciples were stretching their faith as they discussed what they had heard. Your faith will grow as you learn to express it. Another way to stretch your faith is to read and pray over the scriptures. Ask what God is trying to tell you in them. The disciples on the way to Emmaus began to see how Jesus fulfilled the promises found there.

Ask God to help you see Jesus in other people. Receive Jesus in Communion as often as you can (at least once a week). Trust him and expect to see Jesus both in people around you and in the changes that come into your life. The more you look for Jesus, the easier it is to see him.
