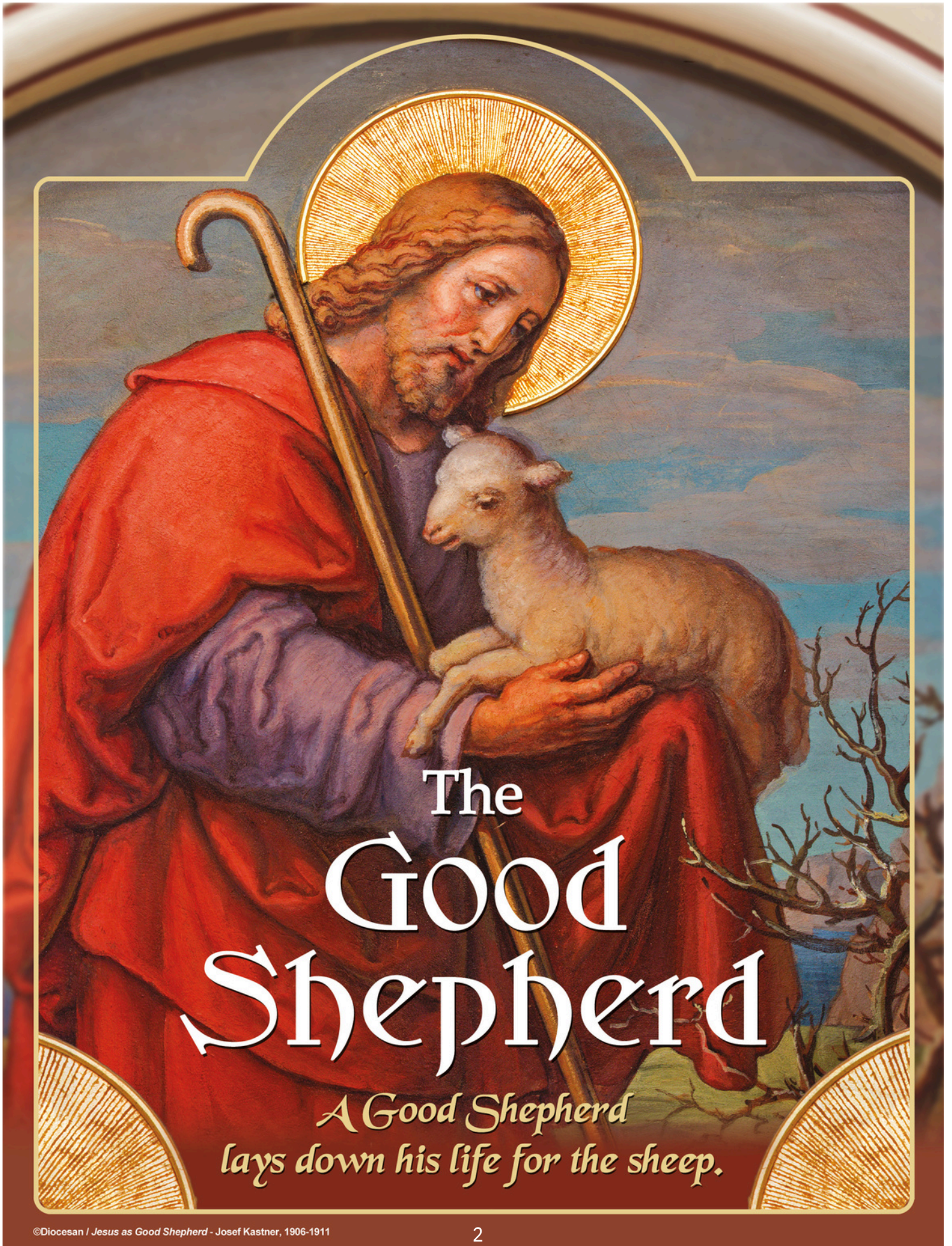

Dear Parishioners,

Jesus is the Good Shepherd.

This is both a consoling message for us today, as well as a deeply theological message. Jesus adds that not only is he the shepherd, but he is also the gate. And he makes clear that he is the ONLY gate. When Jesus uses the shepherding imagery, he is making sure to fulfill a prophecy about the Messiah from the Prophet Ezekiel: *For thus says the Lord God: I myself will search for my sheep, and will seek them out. As shepherds seek out their flocks when they are among their scattered sheep, so I will seek out my sheep. I will rescue them from all the places to which they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness (Ezekiel 34:11-12).*

The "day of clouds and thick darkness" is a reference to Good Friday. This is why, in Easter, we reflect on Jesus as the Good Shepherd, who, in his Resurrection, seeks out and gathers his apostles and disciples. To better understand this Gospel passage, we should call to mind what shepherding looked like in first-century Palestine. Sheep wherein many ways the main form of sustenance for the people. They gave milk, wool, and meat. As well, they could be bartered or sold for money. Having a strong herd of sheep was thus a sign of wealth and important for life.

Archeology in the Holy Land has unearthed the ruins of stone sheepfolds, often located in the center of ancient villages. These enclosures are made by piling rocks high enough to keep the sheep inside. Being located in the center of the village, surrounded by homes, the sheep were better protected from thieves and wolves. These stone enclosures were common -use sheepfolds. This meant that different shepherds used the same enclosure, mixing their herds every evening. Because of this, there was a need to distinguish the sheep from each other. The shepherds used their distinct voice and unique sounds so that their sheep would hear their voice and follow after them. They could thus call out to their sheep inside the enclosure, and their own sheep would go out the gate.

Jesus uses this image to explain how he calls out to us, by name, to form part of his flock. The image of the Good Shepherd, and the poetic and calming words of Psalm 23, are some of the most consoling and profound images that Jesus uses to explain his relationship to us. And to think, Jesus probably saw a sheepfold every day of his life. Each time he did so, he thought of himself as the Shepherd, and we his flock. But he also uses the sheepfold imagery to say something deeply theological. He says that he is the gate: *I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved (John 10:9).* Jesus says he is the gate. Not a gate. Not one possible gate. But the only gate. Many people today, with the relativism that surrounds them, would balk at this statement. There is a relativistic way of thinking and talking that, with variations, goes something like this: *Each person should find God however they can. Each person has their own truth. And all roads can lead to God. No one road is perfect. No one road is above another road.* They would think that people can all find God and salvation in whatever religion they prefer, all things being equal in their minds. But this is false. This is not the message of Jesus Christ. Relativism, to define it simply, is to think that there is no objective truth. It is the denial of absolute, objective, and universal truth.

The Church has addressed the problems of relativism on numerous occasions. There are two main points to consider here. First, in relation to "other ways to God", such as other religions, the Church teaches that: *"The Catholic Church rejects nothing of what is true and holy in these religions. She has a high regard for the manner of life and conduct, the precepts and teachings, which, although differing in many ways from her own teaching, nonetheless often reflect a ray of that truth which enlightens all men".*

-Second Vatican Council, Declaration Nostra aetate, 2

But the Church then clarifies that Jesus is the one and only Savior. The Church teaches: *The revelation of Christ will continue to be "the true lodestar" in history for all humanity: "The truth, which is Christ, imposes itself as an all-embracing authority". The Christian mystery, in fact, overcomes all barriers of time and space, and accomplishes the unity of the human family: "From their different locations and traditions all are called in Christ to share in the unity of the family of God's children... Jesus destroys the walls of division and creates unity in a new and unsurpassed way through our sharing in his mystery. This unity is so deep that the Church can say with Saint Paul; "You are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are saints and members of the household of God" - (Eph 2:19)".*

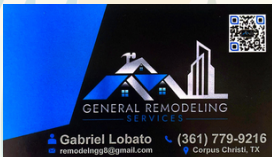

SAINT CATHERINE OF SIENA (1347-1380)
 April 29

Imagine the pope receiving a young woman still in her twenties who addresses him as "my sweet Christ on earth," then orders: "Get back to Rome where you belong!" Amazingly, Gregory XI complied! Yet this was but one astonishing incident in the extraordinary life of Catherine of Siena, a truly unique medieval woman. Youngest of twenty-five children, Catherine refused marriage and became a Dominican Tertiary at sixteen, cloistering herself at home in contemplative prayer, austere penances, and mystical experiences, culminating in "spiritual espousal" to Christ. Then, incarnating the Dominican ideal of "passing on to others the fruits of contemplation," Catherine left her solitude to care for the poor, nurse the sick, comfort the dying, and bury the dead. Increasingly renowned for converting souls and healing bodies, she was sought after to broker peace during civil wars and Church schisms. All this, and like Jesus, whom she called "my "Divine Spouse," she died at thirty-three! Four hundred letters and her spiritual classic *The Dialogue* inspired Paul VI to name her, together with Teresa of Ávila, the first women "doctors of the Church."

Fourth Sunday of Easter
A Lot of Nerve

Peter, the apostle who had denied knowing Jesus before he died, now comes out and accuses the crowd of killing Jesus. Considering that he was outnumbered three thousand to one, it took a lot of nerve. So the Spirit gave him the courage to face that crowd. He asked them to repent, but not just profess a rejection of sin. What we call repentance, in Peter's time meant a change of heart away from sin and toward a new way of acting or believing. We too can make a change of heart. We can turn away from selfishness and begin to love as Jesus did. We can relinquish anger and begin to forgive. We can put aside fear and boldly proclaim our faith.

Peter also shows us another gift of the Spirit—the ability to suffer for doing good. That also takes a lot of nerve. It's hard enough to suffer for our sins. Yet that is just what Jesus did for us. Following the example of Jesus on the cross, we accept the suffering that comes to us. It may be ridicule for expressing our faith, the pain of losing someone we love, or the eventual pain of dying ourselves. We accept pain because we love the Lord and so love others enough to bear the pain of helping them. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to help us repent from selfishness to live a new life of love for God and our neighbor.

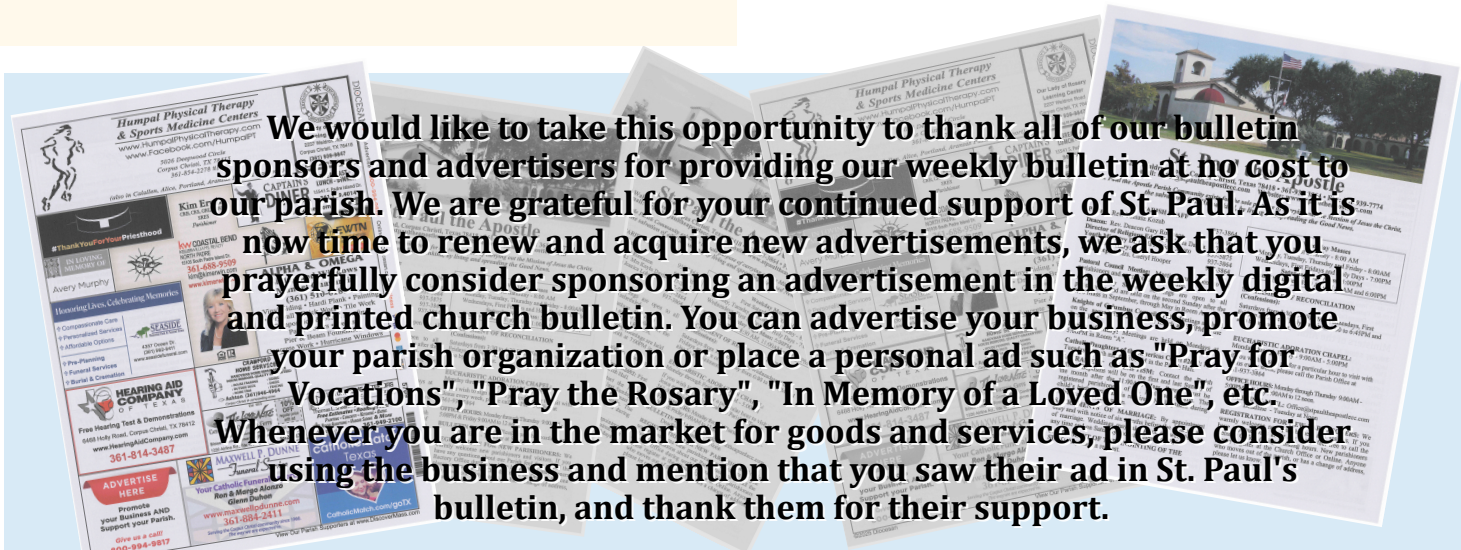
