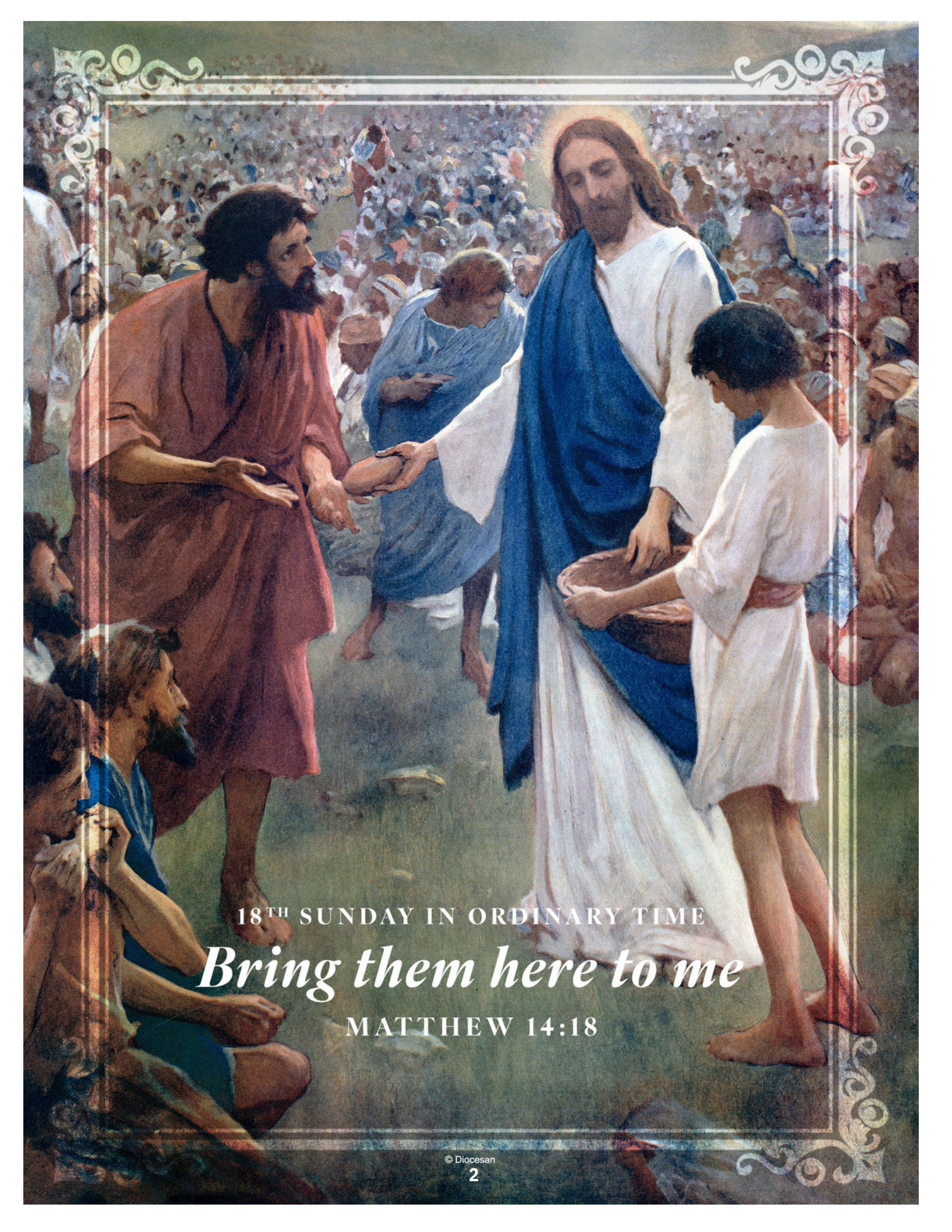

Dear Parishioners,

The few verses we have just heard from St Paul's Letter to the Romans are some of the most beautiful and glorious that he ever wrote. He claims that no power in the universe is strong enough to separate us from Christ's love. In other words, God, who knows all of our sins and sinful tendencies (even the ones we don't know about) never stops loving us. But that's not all. Paul goes on to present a shocking list of different kinds of suffering and tragedy. He includes war, starvation, injustice, death, poverty, fear, and depression. And he says that God's love is even more powerful than these horrible realities that swarm around us in this fallen world.

Notice carefully that Paul doesn't blame God for these tragedies and sufferings. He doesn't raise his fist to God and say, "Lord, why do you let these things happen!" He is too wise for that. St Paul understands that in this fallen world evil affects even the most innocent and holiest people. But what matters a thousand times more than the reality of suffering in this life is the reality of God's everlasting love. The devil wants to use evil and suffering to drag people into despair, hopelessness, self-centeredness, and hard-heartedness. But the Christian foils the devil's plans.

We know that the sufferings of this life are temporary, and that glory awaits those who stay faithful in the midst of them - Good Friday dovetails into Easter Sunday. And so, in the face of tragedy, the Christian responds not with despair, revenge, and corruption, but with love, perseverance, and hope, following in the footsteps of the Lord. In so doing, we actually conquer those tragedies. As Paul writes: "In all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us." When life is going smoothly, it's easy to believe that nothing can separate us from God's love. But when tragedy and hardship strike, our faith is put to the test. There are two things we can do to strengthen ourselves for those times of testing. First, we can make small, voluntary sacrifices every day, uniting them to Christ's great sacrifice on the cross. This helps us learn to see things as Christ does, and to find God's presence even in the darkness of suffering. Second, we can strengthen our Christian hearts by reaching out to others who are experiencing tragedy and hardship, by helping others carry their crosses. By offering small sacrifices to Christ and by helping others carry their crosses we become, like Christ, experts in suffering-with-love, and flaming beacons of hope and faith in this dark and discouraged world.

And that, after all, is what being a Christian is all about.

SAINT JOHN MARY VIANNEY (1786-1859) August 4

A busy pastor jokingly suggests the secret of John Vianney's holiness: "He died seventeen years before telephones!" Call they didn't, but visit they did, keeping Vianney eighteen hours a day in the confessional. Stories abound of reading hearts and exorcisms, but Vianney's first miracle was getting ordained. Difficulty with studies delayed him, prompting the rector's apology to the bishop, "So far to ordain just one, especially this one!" The bishop, who could not know he was ordaining the future patron saint of parish priests, replied, "No burden to ordain one good priest!" In Ars, only an elderly handful attended Mass, "praying," one told Vianney, "for a priest with brains." But he stayed forty-two years, fulfilling the promise he made the day he arrived. In a sculpture just outside the village Vianney points skyward: "Show me the way to Ars," he tells a boy, "and I'll show you the way to heaven." To someone who feared there was no heaven beyond the grave, Vianney smiled, "My child, it would have been heaven enough to have lived as Jesus' disciple on earth."

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Lessons to Be Learned



The miracle of the loaves and fishes is one of the best known in the Gospels. When Jesus performs a miracle, he is not trying to show off his power. His actions always illustrate a lesson. This miracle can teach us many things. Let's look at a few of them.

One is the compassion of Christ. He takes pity on the crowd and first shows his love by curing their sick. Then he sees that they are hungry and he feeds them. This reminds us that Jesus knows what we need and cares about us.

The bread reminds us of Jesus' temptation in the desert, where he told the tempter that "man does not live on bread alone." Just as the miracle satisfied the hunger of five thousand families, so his word will satisfy the spiritual hunger of millions. The miracle also reminds us that Jesus will give us himself, his Body and Blood as bread and wine, to be our food and drink.

So the question is, do we learn from this miracle? Do we trust the Lord to care for all our needs? Do we try to live by God's word? And finally, do we take advantage of the great gift of the Eucharist? The miracle may have happened two thousand years ago, but the lessons are meant for us today.
