Every July 4th, this blessed land celebrates Independence Day, the day that brings justice and peace to this blessed land. We celebrate our Independence Day, freedom from any oppression, suppression, or threat from any other country. The freedom to respect each other, respect of differences, and respect of religion that unite us all to be the United States of America, the land of freedom and respect that draws many people around the world to come to this blessed land. Those who seek justice and peace, freedom and happiness, respect and honor, don't mind even taking risks to come. Some die on the way to come. Others sacrifice separation from loved ones to come. Still others physically suffer on the way to coming. Regardless of how people live in the country and how people seek to live in this country, this country is a peaceful place to live.

As a peaceful land to live in, does it mean every household is a peaceful place to live in, or every community is a safe place to reside? We heard on the news lately. Government workers were even attacked in their residences. A worship place, a church, was attacked by someone. Of course, it doesn't happen in many places in this blessed land, but it does happen.

Reflecting on the words of Jesus reported in today's Gospel, when he sent out his disciples, he instructed them, saying, "Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' 

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

It's high summer now, school is out, the pace of work slows, and some people drift away. There are visitors in the churches every summer, and familiar faces are "among the missing." Some find the summer's call more appealing than the summons of the church bells. Many, however, would not dream of missing a Sunday, and so they make their way to Mass in unfamiliar places, watching the locals for clues as to when to sit or stand, where the Communion stations are. In answering the call, they keep the "sabbatical" rhythm of the Christian life: every seventh day, the Body of Christ assembles for worship.

For centuries, there was no obligation to Sunday Mass in the sense of a written law, but Christians have always yearned to be together on Sunday. In the city of Abitina, during a persecution by the Emperor Diocletian, a group of Christians were urged to stop worshipping together on Sundays. They responded, "Then take our lives, for without the Sunday we cannot live." By a curious coincidence, the appointed readings today center us on thoughts of peace. On our Independence Day, the experience of worship situates us in community, and evokes a commitment from us to be advocates of peace in all aspects of our society's life.

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

False Humility?

There seems to be a lot of rejoicing in today's readings. Isaiah talks about rejoicing with Jerusalem. The Gospel shows the disciples rejoicing when they came back from visiting towns to tell about the Kingdom. St. Paul is happy to be suffering for Christ. So what is the reason for such joy?

The readings make clear that it is not a result of our efforts. Isaiah writes that "the Lord's power shall be known to his servants" (Isaiah 66:14). Jesus tells his disciples not to rejoice that they cast out demons, but "because your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20). In other words, we are to rejoice over all the Lord has done for us, not what we have done for him.

Does that sound like false humility? No; when we do anything for others, we can honestly say that God does the real work. Knowing that frees us from expecting everyone to be happy, everything we do for others to be successful. Instead of being discouraged when we seem to fail, we can trust that God's plan is working in ways we just can't see.

St. Paul has a similar theme in the second reading. You would think he would be proud of all the converts he made, or the people he cured. He boasts only about his suffering because that is how he is most like Jesus. He sees all of his accomplishments as the work of God. All three readings remind us that what changes our lives and changes the world is not how hard we work, or how holy we are; what really makes the difference is how much God loves us. That is the real reason to rejoice.

"At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit." Luke 10:1
