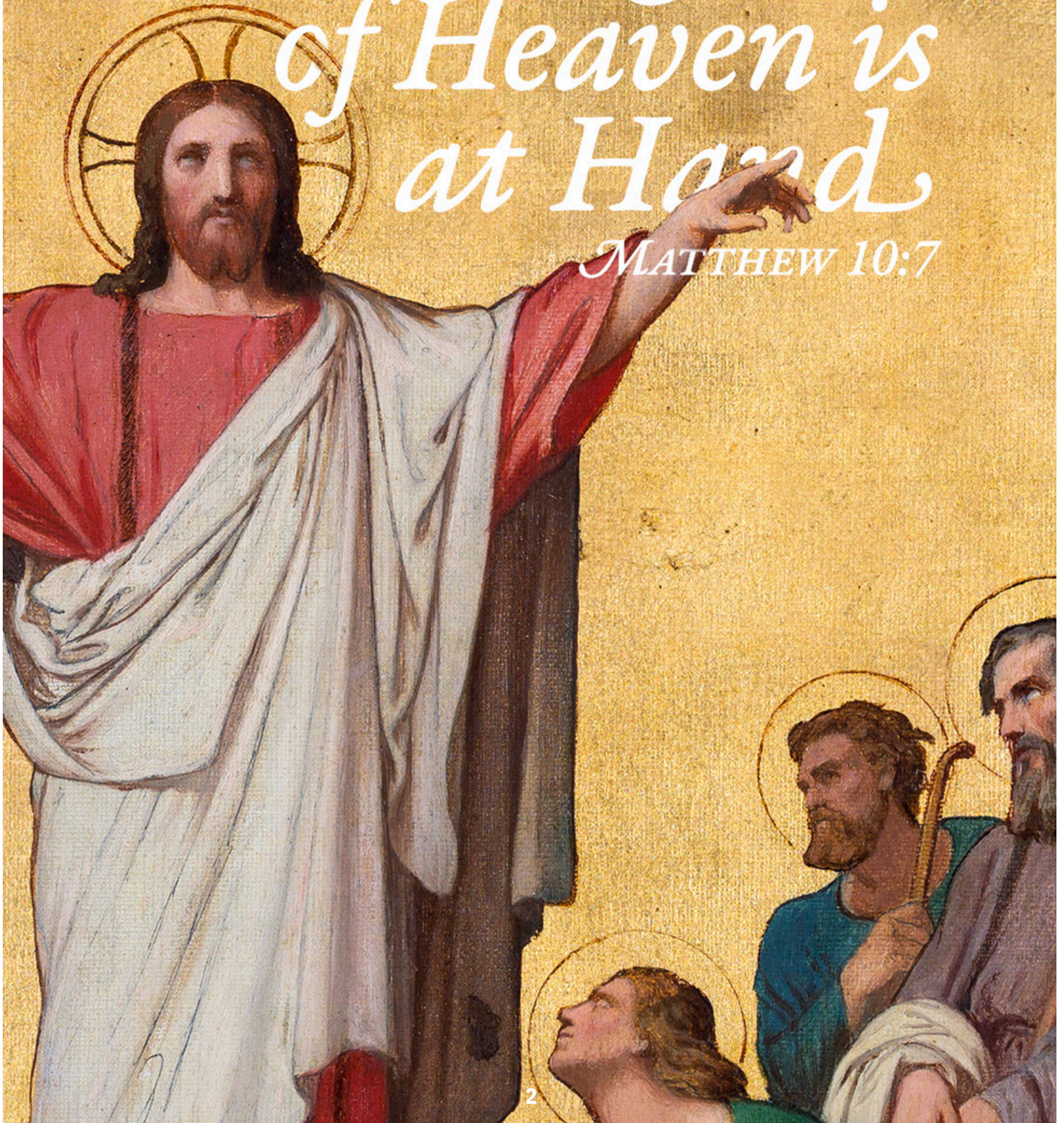

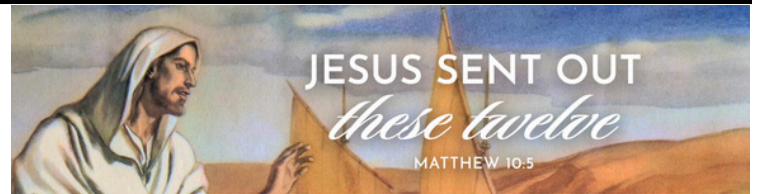

Dear Parishioners,

Jesus Christ is a team player. As God, he could have chosen to fulfill the mission of salvation all alone, to stay on earth bodily forever. He could have wandered around the entire world, throughout all of history, healing the sick and teaching the crowds, just as he did in Galilee and Judea during his three years of public ministry. And yet, he chose not to.

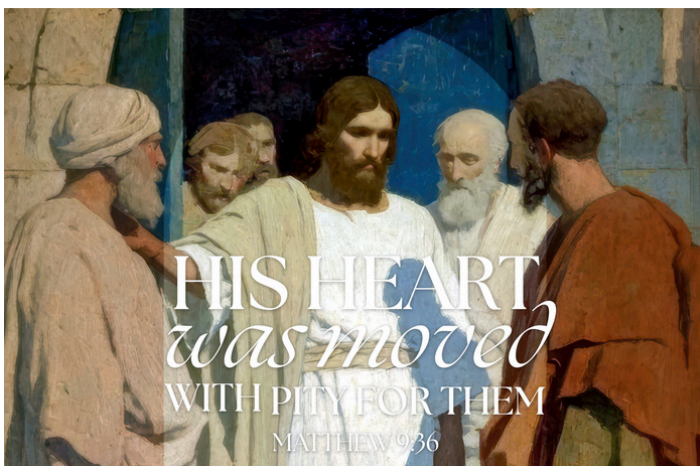
When his heart was moved at the suffering crowds, instead of doing all the work of salvation alone, he decided to multiply himself. He summoned his Twelve Apostles, whom he lived with and trained for three years. And through them he laid the foundation for his Church. And that Church has become the extension of his incarnation and mission throughout all ages and in every land. Christ chose to administer his salvation through the cooperation of missionaries, of men and women who would roll up their sleeves and help him bring in the abundant harvest.

Think about how remarkable that really is. God chose to involve the very sinners he came to save in the project of their salvation. It really was a brilliant move, because it gives us a chance to have real, everlasting meaning and purpose in our lives. If we actively help Jesus build up his eternal Kingdom by building up his Church on earth, then our lives take on an eternal weight of glory, they can have eternal repercussions. We really can store up our treasures in heaven, making a difference that will last forever and ever. Jesus, by establishing his Church, wanted to give us that chance. He is asking us now to contemplate the injured world around us and respond generously by working with him to bring life - true, eternal life - to all.

This is why we should love the Church - it is Christ's bride and chosen instrument of salvation. And this is why so many saints and martyrs have preferred to suffer horrible persecutions before cutting themselves off from the Church. St Anysia was one of these. She lived around the year 300, in Macedonia. She was about 15-years-old when her parents died. She used her considerable inheritance to benefit the poor and destitute throughout her city. But soon a cruel persecution broke out. The Roman governor forbade Christian worship, on pain of death. He was afraid it would displease the local pagan gods. But the Christians continued to gather for Mass on Sundays anyway, in secret. They knew that saving their souls was worth risking their bodies. While on her way to one of these secret Masses, Anysia was apprehended by a city guard. He grabbed her and asked where she was going. She was frightened and made the sign of the cross on her forehead. The guard shook her, demanding to know who she was and where she was going. Then she boldly answered, "I am a servant of Jesus Christ, and I am going to the Lord's assembly." The guard reacted violently and tried to drag her to the pagan sacrificial service instead, but she resisted. Filled with hatred and superstitious fear, he drew his sword and killed her, right there in the street. Anysia recognized that her faith was not just a me-and-Jesus type thing. She knew that being a Christian meant being part of a visible, structured body of believers. And being there, being an active member of the Church, meant more to St Anysia than life itself. That's someone who recognized Christ's presence in and purpose for his Church.

Today as we pray the Creed, let's consciously join our voices to the millions of other Catholics who are praying the exact same Creed throughout the world. And when we receive the exact same Body and Blood of Jesus that they will receive, let's renew our commitment to be faithful to our mission in the Church by being faithful to Christ, wherever his Providence has put us.

SAINT ROMUALD (c. 951-1027)
June 19

"God so loved the world," declares John 3:16. "Do not love the world," warns 1 John 2:15. The "world" to love: this planet, entrusted to our stewardship, and its people, God's children all. The "world" to flee: "sensual lust, enticement for the eyes, and a pretentious life" (1 John 2:16). Born in nobility, Romuald's conversion followed the shock of witnessing his father murder an enemy. Renouncing his privileged world, Romuald sought God's world in monastic life. Its winding turns and several dead ends make Romuald's journey resonate with all who find life more maze than superhighway. Both the hermit's solitary struggle and community life's unique challenges shaped Romuald's legacy: his vast Camaldolese Benedictine family of monks, nuns, and lay associates who, these thousand years later, from the mountain solitude of Camaldoli, Italy to an urban monastery in Berkeley, California—in Asia, Africa, South America, Europe—integrate Romuald's experience into their witness of solitary prayer, communal charity and worship, and promotion of contemplative spirituality in this world that can so easily distract us from the God who loves it still.

Knowing that God keeps his promises is part of being a believer. And how do we know this? Because we see how he has kept them throughout history. Christ died for us while we were sinners, and that's why Saint Paul concludes that since we are saved from sin, we will also be saved from death. Jesus shows us that God can do even more. When he saw the crowds in today's Gospel, he felt compassion for them because they were "like sheep without a shepherd." They seemed to need leaders, someone who could show them the way to God. So Jesus responds in two ways. First, he teaches his disciples to pray for more leaders. Jesus is teaching us to pray for the leaders of the Church today. He also teaches us to pray for vocations to religious life. The second thing Jesus does is act by sending the apostles. For us, taking action might mean offering our help to parish leaders, serving a term on the parish council, or encouraging our children to consider a religious vocation. God gives us these gifts at no cost. He simply asks us to spread the good news of salvation. That's what leadership within the Church is all about. Tom Schmidt 5

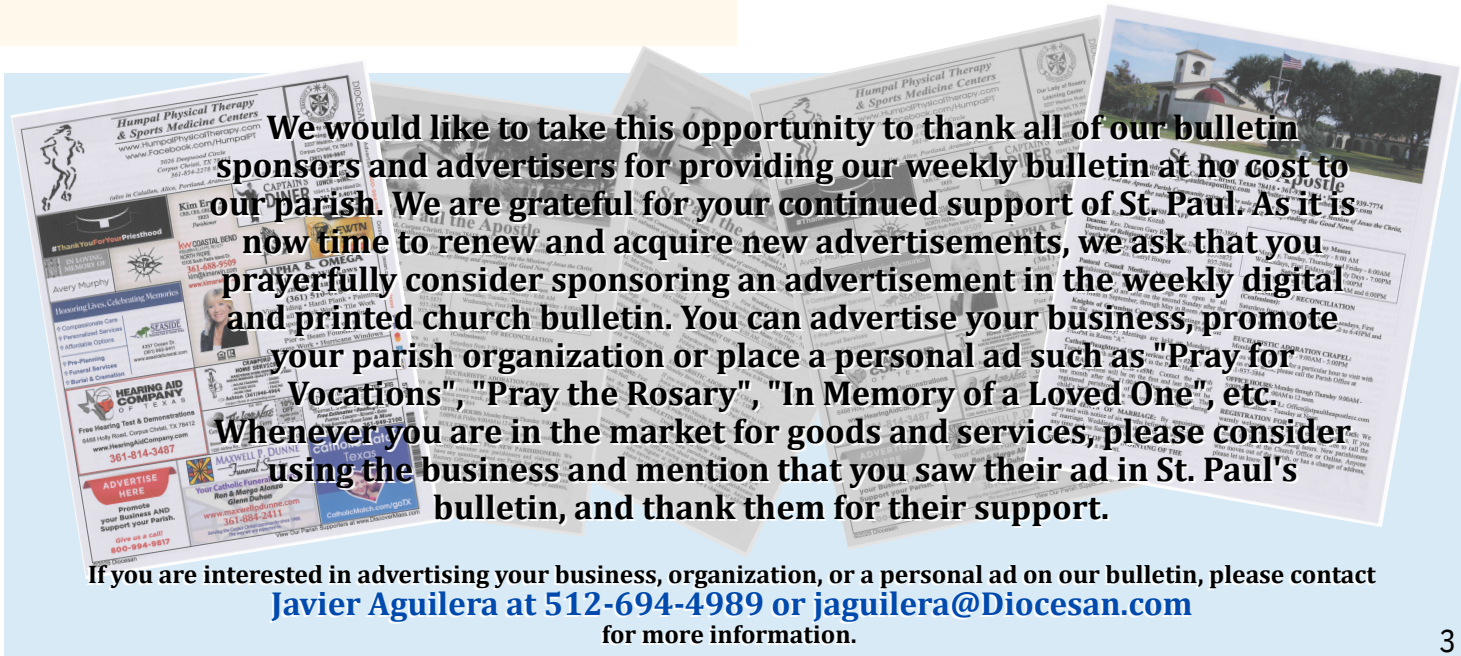
