
Dear Parishioners,

Christ invited Peter, James, and John to follow him up a mountain. It is always helpful to remember that the work of Jesus in the Gospels is meant to continue on in each of our lives. The work of Jesus did not stop when he ascended to heaven. Rather, his work achieves its fulfillment in us, by our salvation and growth in holiness. In this light, it is good to recognize that Jesus is inviting each and every one of us to climb a mountain with him. And this mountain imagery can also reveal to us much about what it means to be a Catholic in the world today. First and foremost, climbing a mountain requires consistent hard work. In this type of journey, we are putting one foot in front of the other, slowly ascending the heights. It is not accomplished all at once but takes time and perseverance. Therefore, we can see that becoming a saint is a daily grind and effort.

Over a lifetime, these small steps upward do lead us to true growth in holiness. But it takes time. Second, we can think of a spiritual meaning for mountains in the Bible. Many saints, notably St. John of the Cross, see in mountains a symbol for virtue, and a mountain climb symbolizes the acquisition of these virtues. Part of our duty, as baptized Christians, is to strive for the narrow way. This entails keeping the commandments, embracing the Beatitudes, and working on acquiring virtue. All of this is part of the great mountain climb of life. Another element of the imagery regarding mountains is that a spiritual mountain helps us to gain perspective. Up high on a mountain, we can look around. The land, far below, and the trail we ascended, now become visible. It all begins to "make sense". This is why a spiritual mountain is a transcendent moment in our lives. Like Peter, James, and John, we "see" clearly.

With faith and growth in the spiritual life, the twists and turns of our lives can be seen not as chances of fate but as part of God's overarching plan. Mountains also symbolize the vast and awe-inspiring power of God. His grandeur, beauty, and permanence are perfectly revealed in its essence. When viewed from a distance, their towering presence evokes feelings of reverence and admiration. They stand tall and unwavering against the harshest conditions, embodying constancy and permanence. Like mountains, God never changes. Finally, a mountain is a place of refuge and safety. By climbing a mountain, our ancestors could avoid a flood, defend themselves, or make a home. Going high up a mountain is akin to going up to the heavens, closer to God. The experience of being on the mountain with Jesus can be and should be for all of us a life-changing moment in our lives.

SAINT KATHARINE DREXEL (1858-1955) March 3

Born into Philadelphia society, Katharine was an infant when she lost her mother. Her father remarried and the couple taught their daughters that their wealth was a "gift on loan" to be shared with the poor, whom they fed and cared for in their home. Invited by priest-friends to witness firsthand the destitution on Native American reservations, Katharine resolved to devote her inheritance to this apostolate and enter a contemplative order. When, however, in private audience, she begged Leo XIII to send missionaries to staff the schools she was building, the pope replied, "My child, why not become a missionary yourself?" Katharine renounced a twenty-million-dollar fortune and founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, adoring Christ present in the Eucharist and ministering to Christ suffering in victims of racial discrimination. Her Sisters established over sixty schools nationwide, including Xavier University, New Orleans, the first dedicated to professional education for African Americans. In 2000, John Paul II canonized "Mother Drexel," praising her "excellent example of practical charity and generous solidarity with the less fortunate, long the distinguishing mark of American Catholics."

Second Sunday of Lent Transfiguration Manifestation



It may seem odd to hear the Gospel of the Transfiguration of Jesus during Lent. Wouldn't it fit better after Easter? An answer is found a few verses after our Gospel selection. Jesus tells the disciples that he will suffer (Matthew 17:12). The vision of Jesus' glory shared by Peter, James, and John was meant to help them not to become discouraged by Jesus' death on the cross. Some of the details in the Gospel can help us understand how Lent leads to Easter.

First, we hear about Jesus' appearance, that "his face shone like the sun" (Matthew 17:2). If the disciples didn't believe that Jesus was the Son of God before, they surely did now. For us this can be a reminder that God is with us during this season of Lent, helping our faith to grow.

Next, the three disciples see Moses and Elijah, symbols of the Old Testament. Peter wants them to stay, but the voice of God interrupts and tells them that now they should listen to Jesus. The Gospel tells us to keep our eyes on Jesus throughout Lent. Do I grumble about Lent, seeing it is as another set of laws to be obeyed? Perhaps I'm forgetting that Lent is not about how much I do for God, but a time to reflect on what God has done for me.

The last line of the Gospel has Jesus telling the three not to tell anyone about their vision until after his resurrection. Maybe the disciples were tempted to brag that they were better than the other followers of Jesus. This reminds us that the sacrifices of Lent don't just make us look holy; they lead us to the new life of Easter.


