



Dear Parishioners,

In our Church, during the season of Lent, there are many catechumens preparing to receive the sacraments. The readings for this fourth Sunday of Lent have been specifically chosen to help prepare the catechumens for the Easter Vigil.

The readings are overflowing with sacramental signs: in the first reading, David is anointed with oil by Samuel, marking him as chosen by God for a special mission; in the Psalm, the Lord, as the Good Shepherd, cares for his flock and with oil, he anoints the heads of his followers; in the second reading, Paul tells us that we have been brought out of darkness and made children of light; in the Gospel, a man born blind is healed by Jesus, who brings sight to his eyes in a way that is filled with sacramental imagery, especially that of baptism.

In the Christian sacrament of baptism, a person is ushered into the life of Christ and salvation. From antiquity, this rite of entrance has been full of biblical symbolism. Ancient writings from the early church tell us that a Catechumen went through various stages, such as a presentation before the bishop, a naming, a signing with the Cross, rejections of sin and Satan, pronouncements of faith, water being blessed and poured, and anointings with oils, to name a few. The prophet Samuel marked David with oil, signaling to all the world that David had been given a special mission by God.

In a similar fashion, all Christians have been "marked" as well. In fact, we "mark" ourselves all the time! We do this with the sign, or "mark", of the cross. The early Christians called this the sphragis. During the rites of baptism, the sphragis was placed on the forehead of the elect. The word sphragis means "mark" or "seal." In this way, the early Christians began to "mark" themselves as belonging to Christ by placing the "marks" of Christ on themselves. Biblically, God has placed his "mark" on his chosen ones and has ordered his faithful on multiple occasions to do so. We read in Genesis that "the Lord put a mark on Cain, so that no one would kill him at sight". As well, in the Book of Ezekiel, we read that God ordered a man clothed in linen to "pass through the city, through the midst of Jerusalem, and mark an X on the foreheads of those who grieve and lament over all the abominations practiced within it". Paul may have been recalling this symbolism when he stated: "I bear the marks of Jesus on my body". The word sphragis in the time of Jesus had various uses even outside of religion. *"The sphragis was the mark with which shepherds branded the beasts of their flock in order to distinguish them; again, it was the custom in the Roman army to mark recruits as a sign of their enlistment."* We should be proud of carrying on our souls this indelible mark of Christ.

It is in the Book of Revelation that we find a fulfillment of this. Contrary to the mark of the beast in Revelation 13, we find the mark placed on the elect: *Then I looked, and there was the Lamb, standing on Mount Zion! And with him a hundred and forty-four thousand who had his name and his Father's name written on their foreheads.* - Revelation 14:1 As we follow Christ into his public ministry and stand with him before the world, let us proudly stand publicly as men and women of faith.

We are the sheep of his flock.

Today, let us be proud of the name Christian.



**SAINT JOSEPH, HUSBAND OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY**  
 March 19

Joseph, someone once joked, was indeed the perfect husband: the only major character in Jesus' story who never utters a word! But the Gospel recounts and the liturgy celebrates his silent witness of faith-filled deeds: "With a husband's love he cherished Mary, the Virgin Mother of God; with fatherly care he watched over Jesus" (Preface of Saint Joseph, Sacramentary). Catholic devotion, therefore, hails him as patron-protector of the universal Church. Some cultures set a festive "Saint Joseph's Table," welcoming the poor and strangers to feast with family and friends. Tradition keeps today as the anniversary of his death, which we presume was peaceful, with Jesus and Mary present. Thus, Catholics invoke Joseph as "patron of a happy death." Descended from David's house, which God finished "building" through Joseph's provision of a home for Mary and Jesus, he was, fittingly, a carpenter by trade; thus, patron of workers. Spring, nature's rebirth, begins between his feast and Annunciation (March 25), appropriately, since Joseph's silent obedience and Mary's "Let it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38) usher in humanity's spiritual rebirth.

**Fourth Sunday of Lent**  
**Beware of the Dark Side**

Do you remember the Star Wars movies, in which the Dark Side was a symbol of evil? In our second reading Paul tells the Christians in Ephesus that they were once darkness. Paul uses darkness as a symbol of shame. Shame is not just sorrow for sins; it is the fear of being caught in sin, or of telling our weaknesses to another because we think the other will look down on us. Paul was a sinner himself and was blinded when Jesus appeared to him, asking, "Why do you persecute me?" So he knew that the only way to be free of shame is not to hide sins, but to expose them.

Does that mean we have to broadcast our sins on the evening news, or post them all on our social media pages? No; we just need to confess them to God and receive God's forgiveness. We can do this through the sacrament of reconciliation. The priest shows that God loves sinners, no matter what they have done. If you wreck your car, you take it to the repair shop and tell the mechanics what is broken so they can repair it. In reconciliation we bring our sins to the priest so that we can experience forgiveness.

Sometimes other people try to shame us. In the Gospel, Jesus told the Pharisees that they were the sinners, because they had judged the blind man. So when we know that God forgives us and still loves us, we don't have to fear what others might think. Let us instead hold our sins up to the light of forgiveness and be free of our shame.
