



Dear Parishioners,

As Jesus crosses the threshold of the city of Jerusalem, we accompany him, liturgically crossing the threshold to Holy Week. Something that should be pointed out is that when Jesus enters Jerusalem, he passes by the place where he will be crucified on Friday: Calvary. His heart must have been full of emotion in that moment, as the crowds applauded him, cheering for him. He knew that in a few days, there would be a crowd in the very same spot, jeering at him.

This foreshadowing of the crucifixion reminds us of a central fact about Jesus Christ. Jesus has been, in a sense, making his way to Jerusalem during his entire life. The entire reason for His coming to Bethlehem, for his public ministry, and for his miracles and teachings is this: his death and Resurrection. We call this the Paschal Mystery. The Paschal Mystery, the salvific death and resurrection of Jesus, is the point. It is the central revelation of the Bible, the foundation of our faith. At the start of Mass, we read from the last section of Matthew's Gospel. The entrance into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday is followed by the final teachings of Jesus. After these teachings, St. Matthew will then tell us about the final actions of our Lord, leading up to his Resurrection.

In Holy Week, the focus becomes not so much the words of Jesus, but his divine actions: The Cleansing of the Temple, Cursing the Fig Tree, The Anointing at Bethany, The Last Supper, Gethsemane and The Cross. The Gospels all reveal to us very clearly that everything Jesus said and did was because he needed and wanted to die on the cross to redeem the world. The four Gospels are all preambles and foreshadowing's that point to Holy Week. This is the theological atmosphere of the final chapters of all the Gospels, which creates an overwhelming sense of the convergence of all things to this moment on Good Friday.

Jesus has prepared this moment well. As he is about to enter Jerusalem, he gives very specific orders to his apostles about where and how to find a donkey and where and how to find and prepare the Upper Room. The specificity of Jesus' instructions, and the mysterious owners of both the donkey and the Upper Room, who readily make themselves available to serve the Lord, adds a touch of mystery and theological depth to all of Holy Week. As we read the Passion narrative, we also enter into this mystery of Holy Week.

One aspect of the deeper meaning present in the Gospel account of Palm Sunday is that Jesus chose to ride a donkey into Jerusalem, rather than to go on foot. The beast of burden that carries upon its back the Lord of All is foreshadowing what Jesus himself will do in short order: he will become a beast of burden at the service of all mankind under the weight of the cross. At the start of Holy Week, we recognize that the fate of the world depends on Jesus. He is Savior, not by some quaint title we have pinned upon him, but because he has truly and actually saved the world.

Truly, as even the donkey's presence in the story highlights, the fate of all creation is held in the pierced hands of the gentle King who has emptied out the last drop of his blood for our salvation.

SAINT FRANCIS OF PAOLA (1416-1507) April 2

A witness to miracles from a young age, Francis of Paola later went on to perform many himself. His parents struggled with infertility, so turned to the intercession of St. Francis of Assisi. Their devout prayers bore them a son, whom they named Francis out of gratitude. As an infant, Francis suffered from swollen eyes and was again healed by his namesake. His parents promised him a friary education, where young Francis voluntarily abstained from meat, practiced solitude, and prayed fervently. After a year, he went on a pilgrimage with his parents to Assisi which deepened his devotion. Upon their return, Francis committed to the life of a hermit, first on family property before moving to a remote cave near the sea. A couple others were inspired by his journey and joined him, forming a small hermitage with a chapel. Over several decades, they expanded to a larger church and monastery as more followers joined. They became known as the Minims Friars, minim meaning least to convey their humility. They valued poverty, chastity, obedience, and later added veganism to their vows. Francis is said to have performed many miracles: prophetic speaking, food appearing from nothing, casting out demons, and raising the dead. Despite a life of solitude, he was sought out by many, popes and kings even calling on him for counsel. In his old age, Francis returned to complete solitude for three months, before passing on Good Friday—fitting for a life of perpetual Lent. Francis embodied love for God through radical vocation, giving his all in everything he did. While we may not be as radical in our own lives, the same call of love is extended to us today.

Palm Sunday My Will Be Done

One of the most comforting parts of the Passion story for me is the agony in the garden. If the Son of God had to tell himself and his Father, "not as I will, but as you will" (Matthew 26:39); I should be able to say the same. There are times when I would much rather have things always go my way, but that is not going to happen. So it's comforting to know that Jesus did not take the easy way out, but accepted the Father's will that he should suffer and die.

Whenever we say the Lord's Prayer we pray, "Thy will be done." But how often do we still take the easy way out? When I have a chance to help someone in need, do I tell myself it's none of my business, or do I ask if there is anything I can do? When I am hurt by the death of a loved one, or am injured in an accident, do I get angry at God for letting this happen, or do I say with Jesus, "Not my will, but yours be done"?

Luke's Gospel ends the temptation of Jesus in the desert with the phrase, "When the devil had finished every test, he left him until an opportune time" (Luke 4:13). That time came in the garden, and again Jesus had the last word, choosing to do his Father's will. Even though we know God always does what is best for us when we would rather have what we think is best, at least remember to say, "Not my will, but yours be done."


