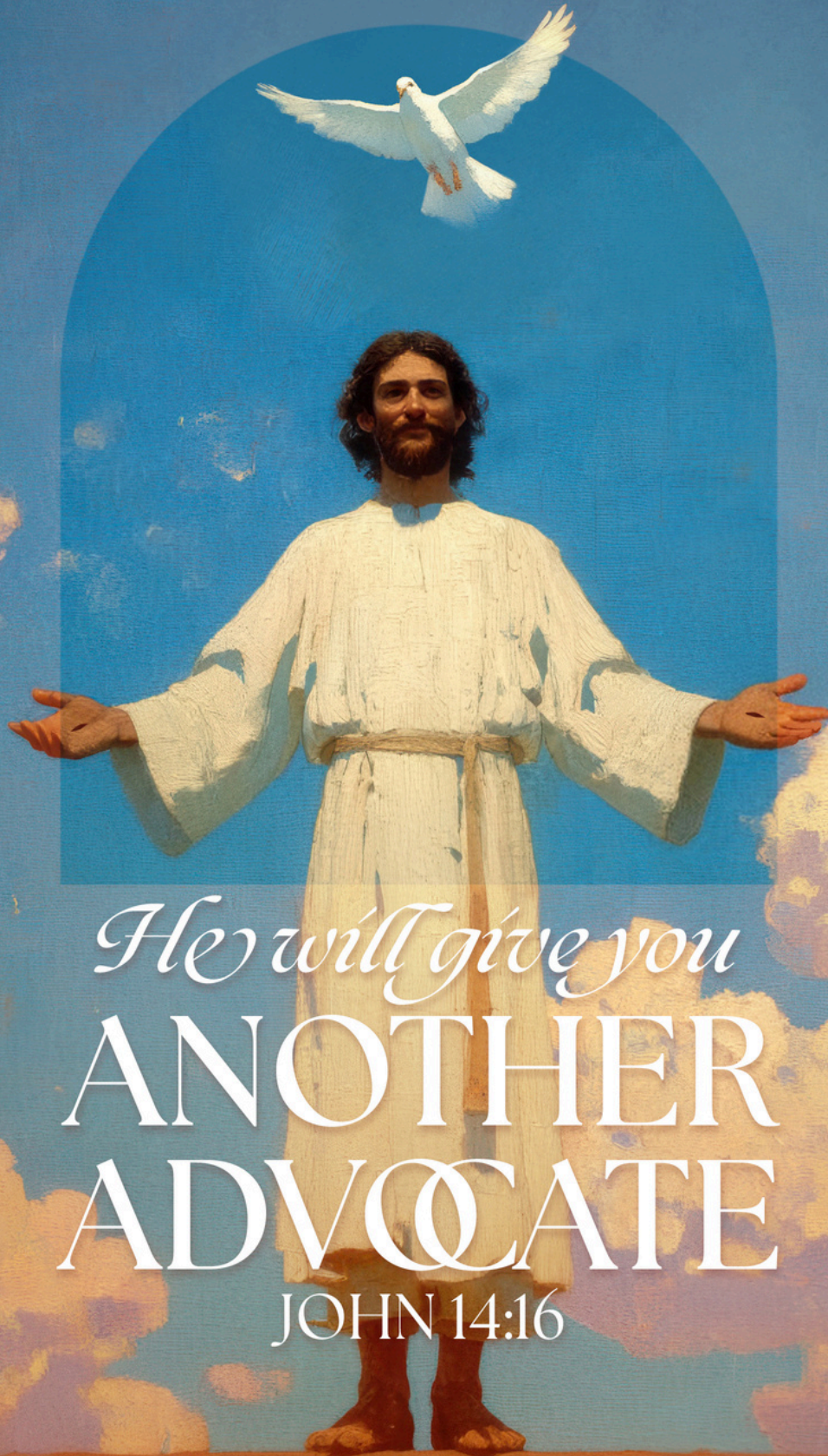

Dear Parishioners,

We are coming close to the end of our Easter season.

Jesus is about to make his ascension into heaven, and soon after, we will celebrate the great feast of Pentecost. The Gospel for today gives us a section of the words Jesus told the Apostles at the Last Supper. They are a sort of farewell address: *I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you.* Jesus promises us that he will still be with us, even after he ascends into heaven. Perhaps we could ask a question that some people may struggle with. Since we don't see Jesus in person, we may wonder, exactly how it is that Jesus is still with us, as he promised? One answer to this question is found in the seven sacraments of the Church. Because of them, Jesus never abandoned us. In fact, the greatest way to stay connected to him is through the Sacraments: Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Communion, Reconciliation, Holy Matrimony, Holy Orders, and Anointing of the Sick. These are seven gifts that take care of all the needs we have in life. They bring us into real contact with Jesus. Consider them in light of our life journey.

Birth: Life begins at birth. There, we encounter the first sacrament of the Church. From the outset, we are born through Baptism into God's family. Infant Baptism beautifully symbolizes the deepest truth about Baptism: It is all grace. We don't earn it. Baptism is a gift. It is gift of God! And that is why a helpless child is gifted with Baptism from the very beginning. And so, when we are born, we have a sacrament. We are brought across the abyss of sin and into the family of God.

Growth: After we are born, there's a period of growth. We grow and learn and begin to understand who God is, and begin to recognize the gift of Baptism that we have received. As we mature, there is a point in life where we leave behind childhood and enter adulthood. In this moment, there is another sacrament: Confirmation. The Catholic Church teaches that the Sacrament of Confirmation is a crucial part of a Catholic's journey of faith. In the sacrament, a baptized person is sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ. Confirmation deepens our baptismal life and calls us to be missionary witnesses of Jesus Christ in our families, neighborhoods, society, and the world. By confirmation, we are now able to enter into an adult faith and way of life.

Death: We are welcomed at birth by Baptism, prepared for adulthood by Confirmation, and greeted at the end of our lives with a third sacrament: Anointing of the Sick. Illness, suffering, and death are consequences of original sin. We must all face them. Even if illness and suffering begin early on in our lives, the sacrament is available for us. Jesus Christ came to earth to take on the weight of sin in the world and to suffer and die for us. The fact that Jesus has suffered and died means that when we suffer and approach death, we can do so in imitation of Our Lord. We can suffer in a Christlike way. We do this primarily by offering our suffering to God the Father as Jesus did. This is one of the secrets of the saints. To offer your suffering to God is to elevate that suffering, to give it a new meaning, a redemptive meaning. And so, in the different epochs of life, birth, growth, and death, we have different sacraments.

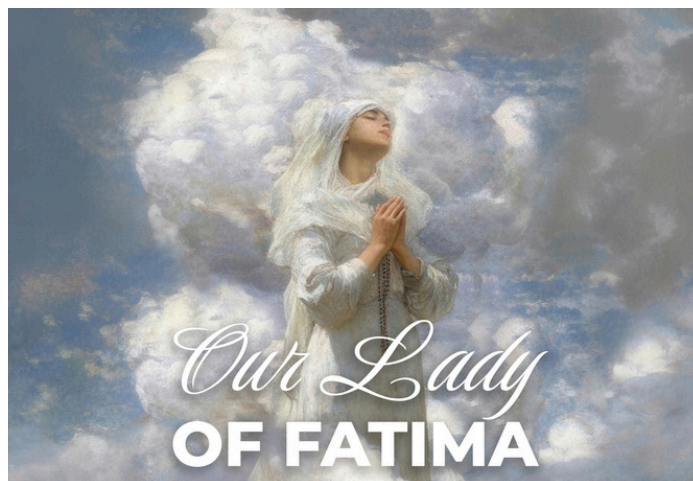
But there is more! Marriage-As we become adults, most people will make fundamental decisions about their life journey. This includes the decision to enter into holy matrimony. Most people will find themselves at a crossroads in their life journey where another person of the opposite sex is met along the way. This other person becomes a center of love for them. After a time, the real possibility of marriage begins. These people, in prayer and discernment, may choose to join their lives together so that there are no longer two paths, but one. When this monumental life change happens, the Church has a sacrament for us: Holy Matrimony. Holy Orders: Marriage is the natural vocation for all of humanity. But because of our fallen world, we need another group of people. These are men and women who help sanctify the world. These are the priests and nuns and monks that make up a beautiful part of our Church. If we never had original sin, we could argue that we would never have need of the Sacrament of Holy Orders by which men are ordained as bishops, priests, and deacons. But because we do need the sacraments, we need men who offer themselves to the service of the Gospel. These men lay down their lives so others can have life. Through them, we can receive the sacraments. For priests are the ones who take the sacramental place of Christ on earth. When the priest performs the sacraments, it is Christ through them who actually performs the sacrament. In life, we need food to survive. Spiritually, we need to be fed daily. Jesus has provided for us a splendid source of nourishment: the Holy Eucharist. Daily or weekly received, by means of receiving our Lord sacramentally, we are given life to the full.

In life, we also get sick. We need medicine. We need to be healed. The Church also has her last sacrament to offer us: Reconciliation. In this sacrament, the sin that destroys us and makes us sick is washed away, and we are strengthened for the journey. Now made whole, we can enter once again into the journey of life and orient ourselves to the kingdom. We see through all these moments and needs of life that Jesus has left us a visible sign that performs invisible wonders of grace in our hearts and souls. Simply put, a sacramental life is the Christian life. A sacramental life is life with Christ.

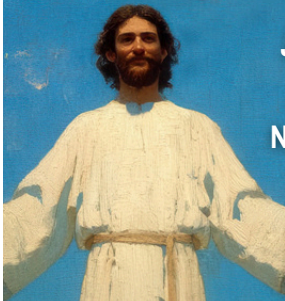

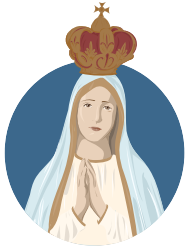

OUR LADY OF FATIMA
May 13

I recently listened to an audio version of the book *Heaven is for Real*. I will not go into the amazing experience this young boy went through, but I will share what he repeated over and over to his parents following the ordeal: "Jesus loves children...Jesus really loves the little children...Jesus loves children so much!!" This is made evident by the repeated Marian apparitions three Portuguese children experienced in 1917. Jesus sent his Mother to Francisco, Jacinta and Lucia, to ask them to pray the rosary for world peace, an end to World War I, for sinners and for the conversion of Russia. Our Lady also confided in them three secrets, which were revealed publicly at different times. These apparitions were approved by the local bishop in 1930, at which time they began celebrating her feast day in Portugal. It was added to the calendar of the Catholic Church worldwide in 2002. May Our Lady's words continue to touch the hearts of God's beloved children and motivate us to pray the rosary frequently, begging our Lord for world peace and the conversion of sinners.

Sixth Sunday of Easter
Share in the Power

This Sunday is two weeks before Pentecost, but already the readings prepare us for that feast. The first reading from Acts shows us the conversion of the Samaritans, thanks to Philip's preaching and curing the sick. He did this through the power of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit makes Jesus present today, not just in the sacraments, but through us, his disciples.

Jesus knew that after his Resurrection appearances, he would not be visible as a man. Instead, he would live in all of his followers through the power of the Holy Spirit. That's why he tells the disciples that the Spirit will be with them and in them. So the Sacrament of Confirmation, the laying on of hands (Acts 8:17), reminds us that when God lives in us, we share in the power of the Holy Spirit.

In the second reading, Peter gives us practical advice. First, he tells us to be ready to explain our hope in the Lord. That hope comes from our faith in the Resurrection. When you hear that people saw and talked to Jesus after he rose from the dead, then hear that anyone who follows Jesus will share in that resurrection, you begin to have real hope. Next, Peter tells us to avoid sin, not because we won't be forgiven again, but to show that we can live a life free from sin, selfishness, and hatred. Freedom from sin allows us to give a good example of how to live. Abandoning selfishness allows us to love others without counting the cost. When we are free from hatred, we are able to forgive others as we have been forgiven. As we live in Jesus and he in us, our happiness will attract people to God.

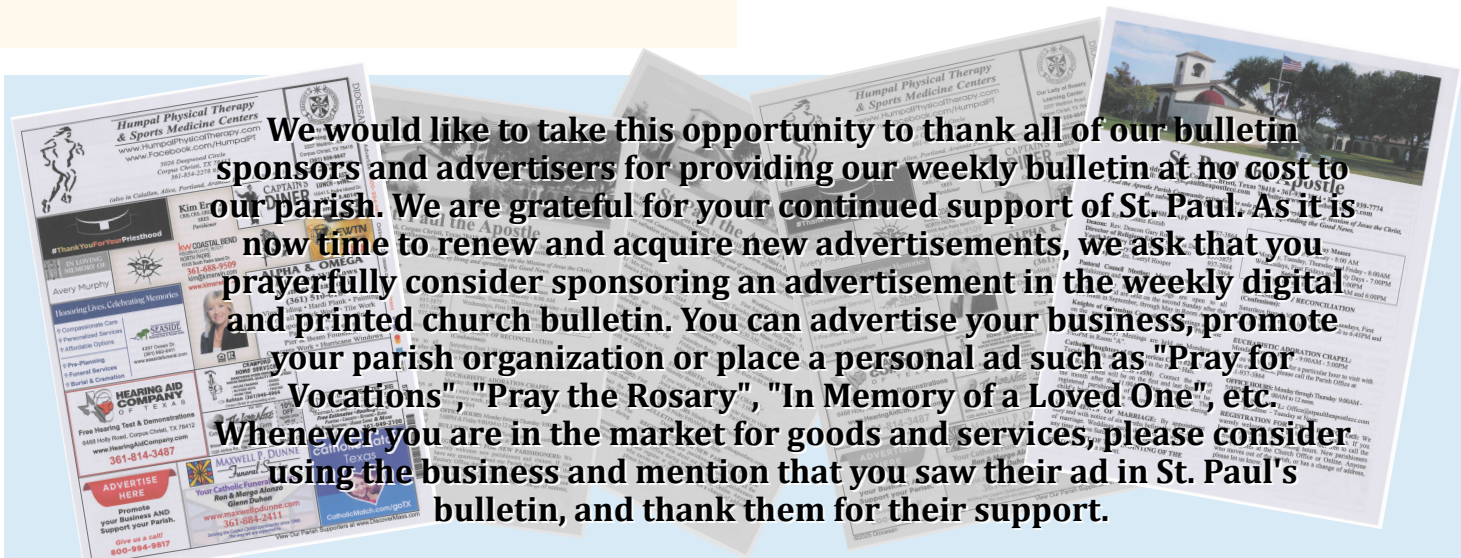
