

Dear Parishioners,

We begin Lent out in the desert, with Our Lord, during the time of his temptations.

Lent is a time to mirror in our own lives the forty days that Jesus spent in the desert. We do this by more prayer, penance, and good work. A well-lived Lent, one in which we grow in spiritual strength, is going to help us fight against the temptations that assault us Christians on every side. Having to live in the world of today is not easy, especially for those in Western societies dominated by a post-modern worldview. Jesus was tempted with things like bread, power, and presumption.

We, on the other hand, may have different temptations. Perhaps we have enough food in our pantry that the temptation to turn stones into bread doesn't resonate with us. We may not grasp the depths of the temptation on the Temple parapet personally. As we don't readily understand all that is in play in this diabolical temptation, it doesn't resonate.

While the temptations of Jesus may sound outlandish to us, we all understand temptation! In the culture we live in, of course, there are all the capital sins: greed, lust, vanity, pride, envy, sloth, and gluttony. We can fall into any number of them daily.

But in our post-modern culture, there are other temptations that we should be aware of. Here are five not-so-visible temptations to overcome in this Lent: Relativism - Truth is unchanging and objective. God is the Truth, Goodness, and Beauty. But our culture tries to make truth just a matter of opinion. It is easier to think of truth as being only subjective and personal so that no one person's "truth" is better or more right than another. In this type of culture, we can get pulled into this way of thinking.

Think of the times we've scrolled through endless debates online, shrugging our shoulders with a casual, "To each their own." Or think of when a friend has shared a moral dilemma they have and how they have begun to compromise their beliefs and morals. Sometimes we are tempted to just nod along, perhaps afraid to say anything. We could say "But doesn't God call us higher?" Isolationism- We are tempted to isolate ourselves. We move on past suffering, society's problems, our neighbors' needs.... All because it's too big and too messy to get involved in.

Have you ever said to yourself, "It's not my place to get involved?" Social Media Faith - Here we are tempted to have a mere performative faith. This is going through the motions with no inner resonance. We might post Bible verses online for likes. But we are chasing vanities and the approval of others over any real desire to be faithful to God. Online culture tempts us to be shallow Christians. Cozy Spirituality - We all have a tendency to want comforts. It's nice when things work around the house, when we have an easy schedule, when things that we like just happen. But in spiritual life, we are called at times into the desert, or to climb a mountain, or to pause on our journey to help the person suffering alongside the road. When we fall into comfort-seeking or embrace a "cozy spirituality", we are skipping the hard parts of our faith in favor of just the easy stuff. We make God into a warm blanket that we can use to comfort our guilty consciences. Consumerist Christians - We can treat God like a cosmic vending machine. We bring the nickels and dimes of our prayers and push the button of whatever we feel like in the moment. In spiritual consumerism, God is a cosmic Amazon. We expect next-day blessings and miracles at the push of a button.





SAINT POLYCARP (died 155) February 23



"Eighty-six years I have served Christ, and he never did me any wrong. How can I blaspheme my King and Savior?" Boldly answering the official who demanded he worship pagan gods, Polycarp, today's "Senior Citizen Saint," demonstrates that courage, far from being the preserve of the young, is a virtue cultivated through life-long fidelity and crowned by final perseverance. A disciple of Saint John, who is said to have consecrated him bishop of Smyrna in modern day Turkey,

Polycarp witnesses to the truth that, whatever time and space may separate us, Jesus' gift of the Eucharist unites us. Polycarp's final words, preserved by the Church of Smyrna, sounds like a Eucharistic Prayer in which the saint offers himself: "Lord, almighty God, Father of your beloved and blessed Son Jesus Christ, through whom we have come to the knowledge of yourself . . . may I be received among the martyrs as a rich and pleasing sacrifice . . . through the eternal priest of heaven, Jesus Christ . . . through him be glory to you, together with him and the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen."

First Sunday of Lent Connections

The second reading this Sunday is not easy to follow, especially when some of Paul's sentences are more like paragraphs. But you will notice that he makes several important connections: between sin and death, between Adam and Jesus, and between obedience and disobedience.

Sin, he says, is the cause of death. Of course, everyone is subject to death at some point, even if they haven't sinned. A less serious sin can be a little "death" when it makes us feel that we are not as close to God as we could be. And sins that we might think are not a big deal, like smoking, can lead to serious health problems.

The connection between Adam and Jesus is not so obvious. Adam was the first to bring sin and death into the world. Jesus is the first to bring forgiveness by his death on the cross. The main difference between them is that Adam disobeyed God, while Jesus was obedient to his Father. Adam reminds me of a child who knows what he is supposed to do, but thinks that he can do the opposite and get away with it.

In the Gospel, Satan can be thought of as trying to get Jesus to do things the easy way. When he tempts Jesus to turn stones into bread, he shows Jesus an easy way to feed the people. But Jesus takes a better way, when he feeds us with himself in the Eucharist. The devil says Jesus can throw himself off the temple as a dramatic way to attract followers; Jesus lets himself hang from the cross to draw people to himself. Satan promises the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will only worship him. But Jesus chose to be crowned with thorns and receive his kingdom when he rose from the dead.


