Ashley L. Cheek

Reverend Ashley L. Cheek is the pastor and head of staff at First Presbyterian Church in Hartsville, South Carolina. First Presbyterian Church is an inclusive, affirming, and growing congregation with a thriving preschool and kindergarten program and serves as a hub for community outreach and support. Ashley is passionate about connectional ministry as she believes the church thrives when all of God's people experience belonging and are able to discover God's call and claim on their lives.

Ashley also serves the Presbyterian Church USA as moderator of New Harmony Presbytery. She is co-chairing the development of an emergency shelter for the under-housed and homeless in Hartsville, South Carolina, and is engaged in the ministry of Mother Esther School and Rescue Center in Nairobi, Kenya. Ashley is a recent graduate of the Liberty Fellowship Program of South Carolina.

Ashley is married to Rev. Nick Cheek and is the mother of Lydia, Nicholas, and Ada. When Ashley is not at church, you will likely find her playing pickle ball with her family, crossing the state to visit her college freshman, or out for a walk with friends.

History of First Presbyterian Church Hartsville

As you sit in this beautiful sanctuary, we give thanks for our church's history and the impact it has had on this corner in Hartsville. Our lineage goes back to the Williamsburg church of Kingstree, our great-great grandmother. Our great grandmother is Indiantown Presbyterian Church. Eventually it was determined that there was a need for a church in Darlington County, so Darlington Presbyterian Church was formed, and from that church Hartsville Presbyterian Church was established in 1867.

Our church buildings have grown from a small wooden building to include a new sanctuary, an educational wing, staff offices, our Memorial Fellowship Hall, and finally a renovation of our sanctuary, but what has truly mattered most are the people of our congregation here at the corner of Home Ave and 6th St. Our focus is to be God's Kingdom breaking forth, serving our community here in Hartsville as well as our state and beyond. Our mission statement is—FPC is a body of Christ followers compelled by God's love to strengthen all of God's community through the way we worship, serve, and live. Each Sunday, we are challenged to widen God's table and to make space for all to have a place at God's table.

FPC has a long lineage of pastors that have served and led our congregation through the years. Rev. Ashley Lewis Cheek came in 2019 and serves alongside our dedicated staff who strive to enhance the lives of members of our congregation, as well as those in our community.

We are ending 2025 with an exciting new addition- Susie Burns, our Pastoral Resident, who will serve the families, children, and youth of FPC. Susie joins us December 1, 2025.

FPC has a thriving music program, with multiple choirs, after school piano lessons, and community concerts. We have educational programs for all ages and are grateful to have a full-time preschool with over 100 children ranging from 6 months to 5k.

Over the past few years, our focus has been strengthening our service within our community and around the world. We have several support groups open to the community- a Dementia Support group, Grieving Together, two AA meetings, and a new group — Navigating Illness. Our missions include serving local organizations such as Hartsville Interfaith Ministries, the Soup Kitchen, The Trent Hill Center, House of Hope — Hartsville House, Thornwell, Black Mountain Home for Boys, and globally- Mexico, Dominican Republic, Kenya and most recently, Costa Rica.

FPC is committed to bringing God's kingdom to earth on the corner of Home and 6th in Hartsville in our individual and communal lives. It is a gift to be the church.

Mother Esther School & Rescue Center



Mother Esther History

Mother Esther School and Rescue Center was founded when 26 young women demanded a better life and a brighter future for themselves. In December 2015, these girls, ages 10-14 years old, fled their rural homes for fear they would be forced into child marriage like so many of their peers. They ran to Loodokilani Presbyterian Church to seek sanctuary and searched specifically for Reverend Charles Maina, a vocal advocate for the rights of girls and women in the area. The Loodokilani congregation responded by turning their church sanctuary into a dormitory and classroom for the girls - a place where they could learn and grow in safety.

By the beginning of 2025, Mother Esther School and Rescue Center had grown into a center that has welcomed and supported more than 350 girls in their journey of education and empowerment. The original sanctuary has become a preschool classroom and the compound has grown to include many additional buildings. It is a thriving center of hope and possibility for the girls and the surrounding community.

Everything Mother Esther School is today and everything it will become is based on the courage and resilience of those young women who stood up to declare that they are made in God's image and deserve the future of freedom and possibility that God intends for every human being. The empowerment of young women remains the center of the mission of Mother Esther School: to give girls the safety and opportunity to choose a future for themselves.



NETWORKS

Synod Networks are open, collaborative groups, centered around a shared interest, purpose, mission, or ministry, building relationships and connections across the Synod. Networks are organized by people and/or ministries that come from multiple presbyteries. They may form for various lengths of time to accomplish their purposes. They build on the example of our existing Racial Ethnic Ministries to provide a space for people to gather to support one another, deepen their work, and broaden their connections with interested persons around the Synod.



Beyond these connections, Synod Networks provide openings for people to step into the work of the Synod. A representative of each approved Synod Network has voice in the deliberations of the Synod and its committees, providing better communications and opportunities for wider impact.

Funding is included in the Synod budget for 2025 and beyond to provide seed money for Synod Networks, and these networks will be eligible to apply for grants through an expanding grant program to sugport their work.



GRANTS & SCHOLARSHIPS

The Grants and Scholarships program of the Synod has been deepened and broadened to offer more support to Synod Networks, partnerships, and new ministries.

The creation of a Youth and Young Adult Grant Program beginning in 2026 will support networking and leadership development efforts, with our young(er) Presbyterians.

- 2. Approve the establishment of a Covenant Partnership between NHP and Kajiado Presbytery of the Presbyterian Church of East Africa (PCEA), empowering the NHP Moderator, the Rev. Ashley Cheek, and the Executive Presbyter and Stated Clerk, the Rev. Gavin Meek, to oversee that process with regular progress reports.
- 3. Conduct a second reading of the attached Proposed 2025 Operating Budget (attached) for debate and approval.

The Guiding Council (GC) reports the following actions taken on behalf of NHP:

- 1. Approved the minutes of the August 23, 2025 Stated Meeting of NHP.
- 2. Approved the dates and locations of the upcoming 2026 NHP Gatherings:

Feb. 21 (Saturday) Georgetown (last hosted 2/15)

May 19 (Tuesday) Indiantown (last hosted 10/18)

Aug. 15 (Saturday) ZOOM

Nov. 17 (Tuesday) Presbyterian Communities of Florence (last hosted 7/18)

3. Received any and all reports and acted on recommendations from its committees (Cultivation and Empowerment [CEC] and Personnel and Finance [P&F]) including the following:

Approved from P&F: reviewed 3Q financials; proposed 2026 Budget for a second reading for discussion and action; renaming and repurposing the Church Extension Fund to the G.I.V.E. Fund; moving the EP&SC from 4 to 5 weeks of vacation (NHP policy recommends an additional week of vacation for every 15 years of ministry experience. Rev. Meek has 37 years of ministry experience and would be eligible for 6 weeks of vacation; he requested 5.); approved the Assoc. for COM position description and the hiring of Rev. Joel Long to fill it.

- 4. Received the following report from the EP&SC: as Stated Clerk, he consulted to the Session of Swan Lake on the sale of a small portion of property to provide financial resources to repair and enhance its main facilities, ruling that it does not need presbytery approval, according to the Trust Clause in the Constitution, only congregational approval which has occurred; Rev. Dr. Busby secured a \$60,000 Black Church Cornerstone Collaborative (BCCC) grant from Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary in 2026 for strengthening rural black congregations by way of micro-grants to NHP black congregations; he will be part of a PCUSA Presbytery Leader delegation to Palestine (Dec. 9-20) to learn firsthand what is happening there.
- 5. Received a report concerning the South Carolina Inn at Montreat Review Team, assessing its ministry, discerning its future direction, and presenting recommendations to the respective five SC presbyteries; Elder Johnny Dennis (Kingston, Conway) is serving as NHP's representative and will likely meet for the last time in January to approve recommendations for the five SC presbyteries to act upon.
- **6.** Received a report by the council appointees (Rev. Larson and Elder Wilson) on a Team reviewing the **boundaries of the five South Carolina presbyteries**. It was reported that the Team will zoom with the Corey Schlosser-Hall and with some presbytery leaders that have experience with these efforts and discussion.
- 7. Approved unanimously the recommendation of an appointed team consisting of the Rev. Tony Larson, Geneva Sharp, and Orby Ferguson to repurpose and rename the former Church Extension Fund, which was exclusively for new church development, to the Growth, Innovation, Vitality and Evangelism (G.I.V.E.) Fund in order for it to be used by our NHP congregations and NHP for other similar purposes. (see attached)
- 8. Established an Administration Commission (AC), to be populated by COM (CP Bob Henry, Fork, Mod; RE James David Lane, Fork Clerk of Session; TE Robert Bannan, Kingston, Conway; TE Jen Kottler, John Calvin, Florence; RE Janice Rosier, Bennettsville), for Fork Presbyterian Church (Fork), Fork, South Carolina, with the authority to assume Original Jurisdiction if necessary should the Session of three decrease to two or one (It has.). As with all AC's, the Stated Clerk or designee, shall be an ex. officio member, with voice, no vote, and this AC, its commission and work, will be reviewed annually by the COM. The commission includes the following:
 - 1. to assume original jurisdiction (G-3.0303e) for Fork, if and when the Session of three decreases to two or one;
 - 2. to dissolve the congregation after ascertaining that it is no longer viable, preferably at its request;
 - 3. to arrange for the pastoral care of the members;
 - 4. to publicize the dissolution of the congregation;
 - 5. to ascertain the financial status and outstanding financial obligations of the congregation;
 - 6. to secure the Session records;

- 7. to secure the legal rights to all property (real or personal) held by or for the benefit of the congregation;
- 8. to dispose of the moveable personal property of the congregation;
- 9. to secure the building and property;
- 10. to deal with matters of insurance;
- 11.to dispose of the building and grounds (subject to any guidelines established by NHP or the Guiding Council) or convey the building and grounds to the corporation of the Presbytery of New Harmony Inc. of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.);
- 12. to recommend to NHP the use of any part of the assets of the congregation;
- 13.to plan and conduct a closing worship service celebrating the life and ministry of the congregation; and
- 14. to secure the assistance of other individuals, as appropriate, to assist with this effort, and to do such things and take such actions, for, in the name of, and on behalf of NHP as shall be necessary to accomplish the general purpose of this resolution.

BACKGROUND: It was reported by the Fork Session Moderator, Commissioned Pastor Bob Henry, that the congregation has dwindled to only a few active and regular members and attenders, it has little remaining financial resources, and one of the three Session members has quit attending and another is moved out of state. There are only a few possible replacements and half of them are immediate family members of the remaining Session member, who serves as Clerk, Treasurer, and groundskeeper. The CP Henry believes the time has come to dissolve the congregation and believes the remaining elder agrees.

- **9.** Established an Administration Commission, to be populated by COM (RE Johnny Raffield and TE Stewart Rawson, co-mods; TE Frank Colclough (clerk); RE Margaret Cooper; RE Ellaree Hampton,), for Salem Black River Presbyterian Church (SBR), Mayesville, South Carolina in order to work with the Session. As with all AC's, the Stated Clerk or designee, shall be an ex. officio member, with voice, no vote, and this AC, its commission and work, will be reviewed annually by the COM. The commission includes the following:
 - 1. Pray for the Session and congregation of SBR, in particular for reconciliation;
 - 2. Be committed to Jesus' directive, in the Sermon on the Mount, to resolve matters among believers prior to litigation and going to court (Matthew 5);
 - Contact the Session of SBR, appointing a new moderator when appropriate, to learn their concerns and issues that led to this situation and try to create a way forward that respects of their concerns and issues, abides by our Constitution, and honors our Lord Jesus Christ; and
 - 4. Utilize whatever resources needed to accomplish this commission.

BACKGROUND: It was reported at the August 6 Guiding Council that the Stated Clerk and the COM Liaison for SBR received noticed that SBR wanted to leave the PCUSA.

Growth, Innovation, Vitality, and Evangelism Fund

New Harmony Presbytery

(Approved by the Guiding Council: 10/29/25)

Purpose

The G.I.V.E. Fund exists to assist and support the witness of New Harmony Presbytery and its congregations to the sovereign activity of God in the world, so that all congregations become communities of faith, hope, love, and witness. The fund provides resources for strategic investments that grow discipleship, innovate ministry approaches, enhance congregational vitality, and extend the church's mission in new and creative ways giving new life and purpose to funds that were once used for new church development.

The G.I.V.E Fund Alings with NHP's Mission and Goals

The G.I.V.E. Fund directly supports New Harmony Presbytery's mission:

- Nurturing togetherness through collaborative initiatives and resources that address 21st century challenges
- Walking alongside pastoral leaders by funding efforts that equip and encourage their faithfulness, growth, and creativity
- Supporting racial equality, social justice, and diversity in all forms of worship and ministry

The fund advances NHP's ministry goals by:

- Engaging in new and creative ministries as we live out of (not on) Presbyterian and Christian traditions
- Embracing and being empowered by our diversity through connecting congregations and communities
- Discovering, highlighting, celebrating, and utilizing the various resources in our midst to grow, innovate, revitalize, and extend the witness of the Presbytery and its congregations.

Principles

The G.I.V.E. Fund operates as an endowment, with ordinarily 5% of the fund balance available annually for distribution. This approach ensures the fund's sustainability and ongoing impact across generations while providing substantial resources for significant ministry initiatives.

Eligible Initiatives

The G.I.V.E. Fund may support initiatives in four key categories:

Growth Initiatives

Projects that grow communities of faith, hope, love, and witness by deepening discipleship, expanding participation, or strengthening spiritual formation.

Examples may include:

Discipleship & Formation

- Comprehensive faith formation programs for youth and adults
- Small group ministry infrastructure (curriculum, leader training, coordination)

- Intergenerational programming that connects age groups in shared ministry
- New member incorporation pathways with mentoring and spiritual gift discernment

Targeted Outreach

- · Young adult and young family ministries
- · Bilingual or multicultural ministry development
- · Digital discipleship strategies for online community building and faith formation
- Community listening projects that lead to relationship-building and invitation

Strategic Partnerships

- Joint ministry ventures with neighboring congregations to reach new populations
- Partnerships with schools, community organizations, or businesses that create natural connection points

Innovation Initiatives

New and creative ministries that live out our Presbyterian witness in our contemporary context while addressing contemporary challenges and opportunities.

Examples may include:

Fresh Expressions of Church

- Dinner church models (worship around shared meals)
- Outdoor or nature-based worship communities
- Jazz vespers, contemplative services, or other alternative worship formats
- Micro-churches or house church networks
- "Church on Tap" or cafe-based faith communities

Creative Use of Resources

- Reimagining building use (community co-working spaces, after-school programs, farmer's markets)
- Shared or collaborative staffing models between congregations
- Bi-vocational ministry models that connect pastors to community contexts
- Social enterprise ministries (coffee shops, thrift stores, community kitchens)

Digital Innovation

- Hybrid worship excellence (intentional online community, not just streaming)
- Virtual small groups, classes, and fellowship
- · Podcast or digital content creation for faith formation
- Online giving and engagement platforms that lower barriers

Experimental Ministry

- Ministry prototyping with permission to fail and learn
- Pop-up worship experiences in public spaces
- · Arts-based ministry and community engagement

Vitality Initiatives

Multi-year strategies that renew congregational energy, embrace diversity, promote justice, or build capacity for sustained ministry and witness.

Examples may include:

Organizational Health

Strategic planning and congregational visioning processes

- Conflict transformation and mediation support
- Transitional ministry consultation for congregations in pastoral transitions
- Financial sustainability planning and stewardship renewal

Pastoral Care & Renewal

- Programs addressing clergy burnout and resilience
- Peer learning cohorts for pastors
- Spiritual direction and sabbatical support for ministry leaders

Worship Renewal

- Music and worship arts investments (equipment, musicians, training)
- Liturgical education and worship planning resources
- Preaching excellence workshops

Justice & Equity Work

- Anti-racism training and implementation (Facing Systemic Racism, Sacred Conversations on Race)
- LGBTQ+ inclusion processes (More Light, Covenant Network resources)
- Accessibility audits and improvements for full inclusion

Evangelism Initiatives

Extending the witness of the church by being bearers of good news particularly to vulnerable, under-served, and excluded areas or populations through means other than new church planting and construction.

Examples may include:

Community-Engaged Ministry

- Food security partnerships (community gardens, food pantries, community kitchens)
- Affordable housing advocacy and development partnerships
- Health ministry collaborations (parish nurses, mental health first aid, health fairs)
- Educational partnerships (tutoring, literacy programs, GED preparation)

Justice & Advocacy

- Living wage and economic justice campaigns
- Environmental justice and creation care ministries
- · Immigration accompaniment and advocacy
- Gun violence prevention initiatives
- Maternal health and reproductive justice education

Ministry with Marginalized Populations

- Prison and jail ministry (reentry support, family ministry)
- Ministry with those experiencing homelessness (shelter partnerships, street outreach)
- Refugee resettlement partnership and welcome
- Ministry with those experiencing addiction (recovery groups, harm reduction)

Ecumenical & Interfaith Collaboration

Shared ministry in rural areas or where multiple small congregations exist

Geographic Extension

- Satellite worship or ministry sites in underserved areas
- Ministry in non-traditional locations (apartment complexes, community centers, parks)
- Regional ministries serving clusters of rural congregations

Alternative Models

- Chaplaincy in non-traditional settings (workplaces, public schools, hospitals)
- Community organizing training and participation
- · Social enterprise that combines mission and sustainability

Distinction from CEC Grants

While the Cultivation and Empowerment Committee provides grants for specific congregation-initiated projects with defined scopes and timelines, the G.I.V.E. Fund supports:

- Strategic, transformational initiatives rather than individual projects
- Multi-year investments requiring sustained funding beyond annual grant cycles
- Larger-scale efforts that may exceed CEC grant limits
- Capacity-building and systemic change that creates lasting organizational, ministry, or justice infrastructure

CEC grants empower congregations to experiment with specific ministry projects; G.I.V.E. Fund investments create the conditions for sustained growth, innovation, vitality, and extension across the presbytery.

Eligible Recipients

G.I.V.E. Fund recipients may include:

- New Harmony Presbytery itself for presbytery-wide initiatives, including engaging part-time
 consultants as a resource to work on developing new worshiping communities and new
 outreach/transformation efforts within current congregations. Consultants to implement Antiracism training, LGBTQ+ inclusion training, as well as justice and advocacy training for
 work with marginalized groups can also be included in these initiatives.
- Individual congregations pursuing transformational change
- Clusters of congregations working collaboratively
- New Worshipping Communities
- Partnerships between NHP congregations and community organizations advancing shared mission

Application and Accountability

Proposals should demonstrate:

- Strategic approach to growing faith communities or extending witness
- Emphasis on creativity, diversity, justice, or collaborative resource-sharing
- Defined goals with measurable outcomes
- · Plan for sustainability beyond initial funding
- · Potential for significant, lasting impact

The **G.I.V.E. Fund** shall be administered by [the Guiding Council/appropriate committee], which will develop detailed application guidelines, evaluate proposals, approve funding, and monitor outcomes. Recipients will be required to provide regular progress reports and final evaluations demonstrating faithful stewardship and results.

ASSOCIATE FOR COMMITTEE ON MINISTRY

(Guiding Council approved: P&F draft October 27, 2025)

PURPOSE: To assist and support to the Executive Presbyter and Stated Clerk (EP&SC) of New Harmony Presbytery (NHP) in matters involving Committee on Ministry (COM) responsibilities.

ACCOUNTABILITY: The Associate for Committee on Ministry (ACOM) is directly accountable to the EP&SC and to NHP through its Personnel and Finance Committee.

RELATIONSHIPS: Relates to the COM, the minister members, pastoral leaders, Sessions, and staff of NHP.

RESPONSIBILITIES: In collaboration with the EP&SC, the ACOM will be responsible for:

- A. COM Staff Support, particularly in the following ways:
 - 1. Attend COM meetings.
 - 2. Collaborate with the COM Moderator and EP&SC in the development of the COM agenda.
 - 3. Equip, assist and support the COM liaisons in their work with congregations and their pastoral leaders.
 - 4. Provide staff support to Administrative Commissions when directed by the EP&SC.
 - 5. Assist and support the ministry of the Presbyter for Pastoral Concerns and Fellowship by making them aware of relevant issues and collaborating in shared ministry.
- B. Life and Mission of the Presbytery:
 - 1. Advocate for the mission and ministry of NHP to its congregations and their pastoral and congregational leaders.
 - Attend NHP Gatherings and meetings
 - 3. Pray intentionally and fervently for the NHP, its minister members and pastoral leaders.
- C. Perform other tasks as time allows and assigned by EP&SC.

EXPERIENCE/SKILLS/QUALIFICATIONS:

- A strong and growing faith in God in Jesus Christ and grounded in a keen understanding, acceptance and practice of Reformed theology and Presbyterian polity.
- A Teaching Elder/Minister of Word and Sacrament in Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

- Be practiced at and delight in collaborative and collegial leadership.
- Demonstrated ability to relate to diverse of theological perspectives, cultures, races, ethnicities, ages, and socio-economic levels and to move comfortably between and within them and ability to work with a variety of personalities.

Faith Journey

Rev. Chris Weichman

I was born in Evanston, IL and moved to Pittsburgh, PA at the age of four. I grew up with three younger sisters. I did not grow up in a Christian family. My mother was raised Catholic and attend parochial school; my father had no faith background.

My youngest sister began attending a youth group at a Presbyterian church. One evening she returned from youth group and announced to the family, "We need to go to church." We attend four or five times a year. It wasn't until I went to Westminster College that I became interested in church, the Bible, and faith. I was invited to Sunday evening vesper services and was greatly encouraged by Rev. Wayne Nickerson, Dean of the Chapel. His messages connected the gospel to real life. Through the chapel office I began volunteering with our Habitat for Humanity student group. This helped me grasp faith not just as an intellectual exercise, but as something that is lived out. When I was twenty-one, I was baptized and joined the church.

My faith has always been connected to mission. After a brief stint with Dun & Bradstreet after graduation I began to volunteer with a Christian housing Ministry called Hosanna Industries in Pittsburgh. Hosanna specializes in home repairs for families in need. Eventually they offered me a full-time position. It was during my time at Hosanna Industries that I felt a call to ministry. After a long season of prayer and discernment I enrolled at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. In seminary I was discerning if was being called to the mission field or to the pastorate, so between my middle and senior year I spent ten months in Berlin Germany working with Kurdish refugees from Iraq and Turkey. My senior year I committed to pursue pastoral ministry. I was ordained in June 1998. I am grateful God has graced me with this call.

I have been blessed to serve in churches with a strong missional identity. My current church is First Presbyterian Church of the Covenant in Erie, PA. As a downtown church we are very active in our neighborhood, with an outreach to Gannon University students and a vibrant ministry with the unhoused and families that struggle to make ends meet. This ministry has had a powerful impact on me and the church. We now advocate for our neighbors and friends who work to find stability for themselves and their families. We strive to be a place of welcome for our neighborhood.

I enjoy serving the church in various ways. I have served as the moderator of Shenango Presbytery and as a presbytery representative to the Synod of the Trinity. I am currently serving on the board of directors for The Outreach Foundation and as a Trustee at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary.

I have been married to my wife Karen for twenty-six years. We have two daughters, Emma and her husband live in Charlotte, NC and Noelle will be graduating in December from Clarion University with a degree in psychology and early childhood intervention.

Statement of Faith

Rev. Chris Weichman

I believe in the Triune God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. There is only one living and true God, the author of creation, who was before the foundations of the world. In scripture, prayer, and worship the living God encounters human beings. God desires to be in relationship with us and in grace covenants with us strengthening the bonds of relationship and reconciliation.

I believe in the sufficiency of God's grace. In the fullness of time God sent Jesus Christ into the world, to bear the sins of the world and to reconcile the world to himself. BACKGROUND: The congregation has dwindled to only a few active and regular members and attenders, with little remaining financial resources. One of the three Session members has not been attending for many months and another has moved out of state to be near children. There are only a few possible replacements and many of them are immediate family members of the remaining Session member, who serves as Clerk, Treasurer, and groundskeeper. The Commissioned Pastor Henry believes the time has come to discuss with the congregation dissolution and he believes the remaining elder agrees.

Thus, at the unanimous request of the Committee on Ministry, the Guiding Council established an Administrative Commission (AC) for Fork Presbyterian Church (FPC) with Original Jurisdiction (G-3.0303e) with the following persons and responsibilities:

- Commissioned Pastor Bob Henry (AC Moderator) Commissioned Pastor for Fork Presbyterian Church (FPC) and Cultivation and Empowerment Committee member;
- Rev. Robert Bannan: Pastor, Kingston PC, Conway; Committee on Ministry member and FPC COM Liaison;
- Rev. Jen Kottler, Supply Pastor at John Calvin and Committee on Ministry member;
- Elder James David Lane: Clerk of Session, Fork PC
- Elder Janice Rosier: First PC, Bennettsville
- Rev. Gavin Meek: EP & SC, ex. officio with voice, no vote.

The AC for Fork Presbyterian Church shall have the following responsibilities:

- 1. to assume original jurisdiction (G-3.0303e) for Fork, if and when the Session of three decreases to two or one;
- 2. to dissolve the congregation after ascertaining that it is no longer viable, preferably at its request;
- 3. to arrange for the pastoral care of the members;
- 4. to publicize the dissolution of the congregation;
- 5. to ascertain the financial status and outstanding financial obligations of the congregation;
- 6. to secure the Session records:
- 7. to secure the legal rights to all property (real or personal) held by or for the benefit of the congregation;
- 8. to dispose of the moveable personal property of the congregation;
- 9. to secure the building and property;
- 10. to deal with matters of insurance;
- 11. to dispose of the building and grounds (subject to any guidelines established by NHP or the Guiding Council) or convey the building and grounds to the corporation of the Presbytery of New Harmony Inc. of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.);
- 12. to recommend to NHP the use of any part of the assets of the congregation;
- 13. to plan and conduct a closing worship service celebrating the life and ministry of the congregation; and
- 14. to secure the assistance of other individuals, as appropriate, to assist with this effort, and to do such things and take such actions, for, in the name of, and on behalf of NHP as shall be necessary to accomplish the general purpose of this resolution.

As is now standard practice in NHP, this AC, its commission and work, will be reviewed annually by the COM.

The Fraser Administrative Committee has met four times since our last report. The church grounds and have been prepared for the closing service on November 8, 2025 – service from 11:00 A.M. to 12:30 with a meal to follow. Also, as determined in an earlier meeting the antique curio cabinet, containing pictures and information denoting the history of Fraser church and two large tables all given to the church by the Claudia Fraser Family would be shipped to First Presbyterian Church, Sumter, S.C. to be displayed in their Archive room. There are some other designated pieces that will be given to certain members of the church family.Fraser Church was a mission church started out of First Presbyterian in the 1950's.

The AC reviewed Fraser Church' financial Statements – it is determined that Fraser funds of \$14,115.75 would be adequate to cover the expenses of the church and closing service, balance after church closing will be transferred to Presbytery. The church has been appraised at \$268,000.00. The sales price of the church was discussed. Ean Geddi Ministries made an offer of \$274,000.00 for the Fraser Church and property and has been accepted by the Fraser Administrative Committee with an approximate closing on December 1, 2025. The congregation of Fraser Memorial Presbyterian Church requested that 15% of the proceeds of the sale be donated to Sumter United Ministries and 10% be given to Sumter Christian Charities with the balance going to Presbytery to be used in the Small Church Support/Redevelopment Fund and other places to be determined. The Fraser AC approved a motion to suggest these amounts to the Guiding Council.

Given the amount of the anticipated donation to Sumter United Ministries, Gavin Meek suggested contacting this ministry about having the donation recognized in a special way as coming from Fraser Memorial Presbyterian Church. A meeting will be held with Mark Champagne, Director of Sumter United Ministries, on November 3, 2025.

The Hebron Administrative Commission reports to the Presbytery we believe we have made great progress getting to know the Hebron families and friends, and understanding their desires for themselves and the property.

The actual Hebron congregation has been lost to time, even before COVID. Leadership dwindled, and with it, the possibility of forming a Session.

In the past year, friends of Hebron have made improvements at Hebron and added a storage building to the property. The sanctuary and fellowship buildings have been used well in this past quarter: Friends of Hebron have gathered for weekly Bible study led by Rob DuBose. The sanctuary has been in use for a wedding and a community gospel concert. The buildings also have been opened for several funerals (burials) on the grounds. Sunday Lord's Day worship has not been held.

We are reviewing 1918 documents that appear to indicate a separate incorporation of the Hebron Cemetery, under a Board of Trustees. There is a separate cemetery fund administered by the remaining trustees. The Commission itself receives financial reports of the general fund from its appointed treasurer, Will Fraser, a friend of Hebron and member of First PC, Sumter. We are regularly sharing prayers and concerns with the Hebron families. Together we are working towards an outcome and future that protects holy ground and nurtures the faith of all the Lord's people, within Presbytery and beyond, to the glory of GOD.
