

## God Will Give Me a New Purpose (Week 4)

### DAY 1 — “You Are God’s Handiwork” - Ephesians 2:10a

- **Reflection:** We live in a culture that often tells us our value is tied to our performance, productivity, or popularity. St Paul begins by reminding us that our worth is grounded in our Creator, not our accomplishments.
- **Question:** Where do you need to receive God’s affirmation instead of the world’s?

- **Prayer:** Jesus, thank You for making me new. Continue Your work in me. Shape my heart to look more like Yours.

### DAY 3 — “Created for Good Works” - Ephesians 2:10c

- **Reflection:** You are not saved **by** good works, but you are saved **for** good works. “Good works” include everyday faithfulness: loving your family well, serving your church, showing kindness at work, caring for those in need, and living with integrity.
- **Question:** Where is God inviting you to “good works”?
- **Prayer:** Lord, open my eyes to the good works You have placed before me. Give me a servant’s heart to act in love.
