20 trees planted in 2025

Through our partnership with Bulldog, our trusted clothing supplier, a tree is planted with every order we place. This initiative is at the heart of Bulldog's commitment to giving back to the environment and supports reforestation efforts around the world.



Reducing energy usage in buildings

We have a four-year ESOS action plan in place to reduce energy usage across our sites. As part of this, we have already upgraded boilers and improved roof insulation at some locations. We plan to replace all existing lighting with energy-efficient LED alternatives and install smart meters.




Food Waste composted



In 2025, we supplied all our nurseries with compost bins to recycle food waste. By turning food waste into a valuable by-product, that supports the generation of clean energy, we have significantly reduced the number of food waste collections needed by **50%**.

100% waste diverted from landfill



We are proud to confirm that **100%** of our waste is diverted from landfill. By working closely with Wastetech, we actively monitor and manage our waste output to minimise our environmental impact.

Currently, around **71%** of our waste is recycled, and we are committed to increasing this to **85%** in 2026.

Increase in sustainable product use



We work with Gompels, who supply our nurseries with sustainable products, including plastic-free wipes. We are also moving away from disposable aprons. This partnership has helped us reduce plastic use across all sites while switching to cleaner, more environmentally friendly products, reducing our carbon footprint.

We're always looking for simple ways to help children learn about caring for the world around them, and we've found a lovely resource to share with you.


