Hedgehogs

The children have worked incredibly hard, using their creativity, imagination and LOTS of sparkles. We loved seeing the children in their Christmas jumpers, it brought so much cheer to the room. Butterflies

The Butterflies have been fully embracing the Christmas season with lots of exciting activities! The children loved decorating our Christmas tree and exploring festive treasure baskets, filled with red and white items to spark their curiosity. We used gingerbread scented playdough, which encouraged the children to use all their senses, touching, smelling, talking and exploring together. Alongside this, Butterflies also enjoyed Christmas painting and sticking, creating some beautiful festive artwork. Extend learning at home

Get creative together – provide the children with simple craft materials like paper, stickers and crayons. Let your child make their own Christmas pictures or decorations, following their interest and using their imagination.



Create a treasure basket – a basket filled with a variety of safe, everyday household items for the children to explore. Include a range of materials for the children to feel and introduce new descriptive words as you explore together.



Encourage name writing at home by exploring a variety of writing tools. Try using fingers in sand or flour to help develop fine motor skills in a fun, hands-on way.



Recipe of the Month – Carrot and Date Slice



(Serves 6-8)

Ingredients

Self Raising Flour – 250g
Oil – 70 ml
Carrots (grated) – 200g
Apple – 1
Egg - 3
Butter (melted) – 50g
Dates – 150g
Raisins - 75g
Baking Powder- 1 tsp
Cinnamon – 1 tsp

Method

1. Set oven to 180 C and line a baking tray.
2. Pour boiling water over the dates and leave to soak while you measure out the ingredients and grate the carrot and apple.
3. Drain and finely chop the dates
4. In a large bowl, whisk the eggs together with the butter and oil. Add the grated carrots, apple, dates, raisins and mix well.
5. Pour in the flour, baking powder and cinnamon and fold in.
6. Scrape into the lined tray and bake for 40-45 mins.
