What we have been up to...

Hedgehogs

The hedgehogs have enjoyed watching their vegetables grow and helping to water and pick them. They have also been celebrating Hedgehog Awareness Week by painting their own hedgehogs and creating them out of playdough. They also developed their stirring and pouring skills by making their own chocolate milk. To support with the Hedgehogs fine motor skills, they decorated sticks to create their own wind chimes.

Butterflies

The Butterflies have enjoyed planting their own vegetables in their planter in the garden, including cucumbers, courgette and beetroot. They also developed their gross motor skills by painting on large paper in the garden. Using large movements and equipment. The Butterflies also enjoyed creating their own bubble solution and their own large wands.

Little Toads

The Little Toads have been really enjoying exploring the process of their vegetables growing. They have been helping to water them and sharing experiences of plants they grow at home in their gardens. These kinds of activities support our curriculum *children develop a curiosity for the natural world*. They have also enjoyed yoga in the garden to support the children's emotional wellbeing.

Owls

The Owls have been exploring lots of activities that support with saving the planet, to go alongside their planting in the garden and in support of *Earth Day*. They created their own earth pictures and participated in a water activity all about saving the planet and recycling. They have also been exploring different fruits and made fruit kebabs to support this. The children learnt about David Attenborough in celebration of his 100th birthday and made animal pictures to support this.

The Hedgehogs have enjoyed exploring the mud kitchen in the garden, using their imagination to create different foods and stories together. Outdoor play also sparked conversations about colours and colour mixing after the children spotted a rainbow.
