



The Ohio Summer Show Circuit (OH-PIGS) seeks to instill positive character-building traits in our youth, through the demonstration of great sportsmanship, respect for others, responsibility, and care of livestock. We ask that parents, children, grandparents, along with their guests attending OH-PIGS sanctioned shows/events help us by reflecting these character traits at the shows/events.

When attending OH-PIGS sanctioned shows/events, I/we therefore agree:

- I will be a positive role model for my child and encourage sportsmanship by showing respect and courtesy, and by demonstrating positive support for all exhibitors, judges, spectators, show personnel and the OH-PIGS Manager at every show/event.
- I will not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any exhibitor, judge, parent, spectator, or OH-PIGS manager such as taunting, using profane language, or lude gestures, etc.
- I will not encourage any behaviors or practices that would endanger the health and wellbeing of the show participants or any show animals.
- I will teach my child to show by the spirit of the rules and to resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.
- I will demand that my child treat other fellow showman, judges, show personnel and spectators with respect regardless of race, sex, or ability.
- I will never ridicule or yell at my child or any other showman for making a mistake.
- I will respect the judges and any member of the OH-PIGS Committee and their authority during shows/events; I will not question or confront judges or OHPIGS Committee members during shows, events, or in the barns and will take time to speak with the OH-PIGS Manager at an agreed upon time.
- I will not attempt to intimidate any showman, judge, parent, spectator, show personnel or any OH-PIGS Committee member or the OH-PIGS Manager.
- I will not engage in any other type of violent behavior, such as throwing equipment or other objects.
- I will refrain from using alcohol in the barns or show ring area while participating as a parent in any OH-PIGS shows or events.

I also agree that if I fail to abide by the aforementioned rules and guidelines, I will be subject to disciplinary action that could include, but is not limited to the following:

- **Written warning from Todd Price, OHPIGS Committee Chair and Cheryl Day, OPC Executive VP**
- **Respective parent in question will have NOT be allowed to attend the next weekend on the OH-PIGS Circuit**
- **Parental suspension from attending all OH-PIGS sanctioned shows / events indefinitely**

## **OH-PIGS EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY**

- 3-21 years (age as of January 1, 2026)
- Any exhibitor from other states may come to jackpot ages 3-21 years.
- **ALL pigs that show on the OH-PIGS Circuit are required to have an 840 tag.**
- Health papers are NOT required for Ohio exhibitors.  
Out of state exhibitors MUST provide health papers before unloading at any OH-PIGS venue.
- To accrue points, must be an Ohio resident, or Ohio 4-H member or Ohio FFA member to participate in membership for the OH-PIGS Circuit.
- Minimum age is 3, however, parents are to use their best discretion and a member's points will NOT count if they have someone helping them in the show ring.

## **OH-PIGS MEMBERSHIP FEE**

- \$40.00 – annual fee per OH-PIGS participant.
- Membership benefits: eligibility for points awards, t-shirts, opportunities from our sponsors
- Members must be signed up and paid before a show begins in order for points to accumulate.
- Fee can be paid at any sanctioned show.
- All pigs accruing points must be identified before points will be awarded on pig ID sheet.  
Points will not be backtracked if pig has shown prior to being identified for points

## OH-PIGS Sanctioned Shows INFORMATION

- Sanctioned shows follow the guidelines set forth by the OH-PIGS for record keeping and general fairness to all exhibitors when agreement is made to be an “OH-PIGS Sanctioned Show”.
- All results from the show will be turned into Kelly Morgan, Director of Showpig Programs, at [kmorgan@ohiopork.org](mailto:kmorgan@ohiopork.org) within three days from the date of the show.
- Ohio residents do NOT need to bring health papers. **However, out of state exhibitor health papers are required and will be presented in order to show.**

Out of state residents WILL need health papers stating the following information:

- Official ID (ear notch and metal 840 or RFD tag number)
  - Raw garbage statement stating that you do not feed your herd garbage.
  - Cannot be from a pseudorabies state.
  - Any questions, contact the state veterinarian’s office at (614) 728-6220
- 
- **ALL pigs that are planning to show on the OHPIGS Circuit are required to have 840 tags**
  - **ALL participants, members or non-members will follow Ohio Revised Code 901-19-33 - prohibited grooming practices (no paint or dye is allowed)**
  - **Participants cannot use 2 utensils to drive any pig while showing in the ring. Pigs should be controllable while using only one utensil. This allows the public to not consider over use of the driving utensil for the animal’s well-being.**
- ALL shows are non-terminal.
  - Barrows and gilts will be shown separately by all breeds and crossbreds. **NO BOARS CAN SHOW!**
  - Purebreds will be show separately by breeds. Barrows will show by weight and breeding gilts will show by age. Purebred gilts cannot show in market classes against their respective breed.
  - ALL purebred barrows/gilts and purebred influence gilts/ barrows must provide a pedigree.
  - ALL purebreds must meet respective breed characteristics listed by the breed associations.
  - All market classes will have weigh backs for top 2 in each class. Weigh back must be within 15 pounds of weight declared.
  - No minimum number of head per breed required to form a class.
  - Purebred classes will be determined by the show committee based upon number of entries on the show day.
  - There will be NO AOB classes at any show for breeding or market classes.
  - ✓ Purebred breeding gilts CANNOT be shown as a purebred market gilt. If you chose to show a purebred as a market gilt, it will have to show as a crossbred.
  - ✓ Each show will begin with showmanship. (Peewee, Senior, Intermediate, Junior, Novice); followed by Breeding classes; followed by market classes (purebred barrows, crossbred barrows and crossbred market gilts)
  - ✓ We as a committee ask that a selected judge can only judge 1 OH-PIGS Circuit show per that year’s season.

## COMPETITIONS

- Market Hog (purebred barrows, purebred influence barrow, light crossbred barrow, dark crossbred barrow, market gilts)
- Purebred Breeding Gilt
- Showmanship (Peewee, Novice, Junior, Intermediate and Senior divisions)
- Skillathon
- Livestock Judging contests
- Meats Judging contest
- Photography contest
- Promotional or Educational poster contest
- Overall High Points Exhibitors (all divisions and overall for the OH-PIGS Circuit)

## EXHIBITION

Members are required to show (exhibit and showmanship) their own pigs to earn points. Pigs cannot be shared among siblings. The respective pig in question must be listed to accrue points for a specific child. Exception only if exhibitor has more than one animal in a class/ ring. Exhibitors must also follow OH-PIGS Circuit rules while showing as well.

- Substitute showman must be 3-21 years of age.
- For exhibit and showmanship classes, members are required to show their own pigs to earn points; however, if an exhibitor has more than one animal in a given class, the member will show one animal and have a substitute showman (3-21 years old) show another. Also, no additional showman or drivers on that 1 pig.
- Must show own pig in showmanship, failure to do so will result in loss of points for that pig for that show on that day.
- ALL pigs that are planning to show on the OHPIGS Circuit are required to have 840 tags
- ALL participants, members or non-members will follow Ohio Revised Code 901-19-33 - prohibited grooming practices (no paint or dye is allowed)
- Participants cannot use 2 utensils to drive any pig while showing in the ring. Pigs should be controllable while using only one utensil. This allows the public to not consider over use of the driving utensil for the animal's well-being.

## Market

- Market barrows/gilts will not exceed 280 lbs.
- **Weigh backs will occur in all market classes. There is a 15-pound weigh back from weight declared.**
- All pigs will show by weight, sex and breed
- Purebred barrows must be born after November 1, 2025.
- Crossbred market gilts CANNOT be shown as crossbred breeding gilts in the same show (not dual entered). If this happens, points for breeding or market classes will not be earned.
- Classes will be: Purebred barrows – crossbred barrows (purebred influence, light crossbred, dark crossbred) – crossbred market gilts
- There are NO purebred market gilts shown on the OH-PIGS Circuit. If you want to show a purebred gilt as a market gilt, they will show as a crossbred if identified as market.

### **ALL purebred barrows must show a valid pedigree and meet the respective breed characteristics to show as a purebred, otherwise barrow will be shown as a crossbred**

- Members are required to show (exhibition and showmanship) their OWN pigs to earn points. Exception only if exhibitor has more than one animal in a class/ring.
- Members cannot show any other members pigs or share pigs among family members. If you show another member's pig, no points will be awarded in that particular class for that pig.
- Hogs that are brought back from Expo and were not owned and in the possession of the exhibitor prior to Expo, will not receive points

## Divisions for Market

**\*\*ALL market animals have a max weight of 280 pounds with a 15 pound weigh back.**

**\*\*ALL males shown are to be cut to be a barrow. No boars can show.**

- **Purebred Barrows**

Purebred barrows must be born on or after November 1, 2025. All purebred barrows must have a pedigree and meet their respective breed characteristics.

- **Light and Dark Crossbred Barrows**

Crossbred barrows will be divided into light and dark classes for the OHPIGS Circuit. The respective show committee and the OHPIGS Manager, will make the final decision on questionable barrows if any issue are to arise. There will be a Grand and Reserve Champion Light Cross Barrow and a Grand and Reserve Champion Dark Cross Barrow.

- LIGHT CROSS BARROW – to classify as a light cross, the animal must have white and non-black pigment showing no red or black pigmentation on the skin. (i.e. Blues, Blue butts)
- DARK CROSS BARROW – to classify as a dark cross barrow, the animal must have pigment showing color pigmentation on skin. (i.e. black belted, white hog with black head, white hog with black spots, Calico, red pigmentation or hair)

- **Purebred Influence Barrows**

Purebred influence Crossbred Barrow requirements are:

- A documented parent (sire or dam) that is a Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire.
- The animal must be recorded in the National Swine Registry (NSR) Crosscheck Verification Program and documentation provided (pedigree/ registration paper).

- Animals that may not meet purebred breed eligibility requirements but still maintain a pedigree would be eligible to show in this division.
- **Market Gilts**  
Crossbred gilts may choose to show in the market division. All crossbred market gilts cannot as a crossbred breeding gilt in the same show. Market crossbred gilts show by weight from lightest to heaviest.

### Market Grand Drive

Respective champions will be named in the purebred breeds and crossbred divisions.

On the crossbred side, the Grand and Reserve in each division (light crossbred barrows, dark crossbred barrows, purebred influence barrows and market gilts) will go head-to-head to name a Grand and Reserve Crossbred Market Hog that participates in the Grand Market Drive.

### Purebred Breeding Gilts

- Gilts will be shown by breed and age.
- **Gilts must be born on or after November 1, 2025.**

**ALL purebred gilt must show a valid pedigree and meet the respective breed characteristics to show as a purebred, otherwise gilt will be shown as a crossbred**

- Members are required to show (exhibition and showmanship) their OWN pigs to earn points. Exception only if exhibitor has more than one animal in a class.
- Members cannot show any other members pigs or share pigs among family members. If you show another member's pig, no points will be awarded in that class, for that pig.
- Hogs that are brought back from Expo and were not owned and in the possession of the exhibitor prior to Expo, will not receive points.

### Crossbred Breeding Gilts

- Crossbred breeding gilts will show by weight lightest to heaviest.
- **Crossbred breeding gilts cannot exceed 280 pounds weekends 1-3 (Fulton, Perry and Marion cannot exceed 325 pounds weekend 4 and after (Highland County and after).**
- **Weigh backs will occur in all crossbred breeding classes. There is a 15-pound weigh back from weight declared.**
- Crossbred breeding gilts CANNOT be shown as crossbred market gilts in the same show on the same day. If this happens, points for both breeding and market classes will not be earned.
- Members are required to show (exhibit and showmanship) their OWN pigs to earn points. Exception only if exhibitor has more than one animal in a class.
- Members cannot show any other members pigs or share pigs among family members. If you show another member's pig, no points will be awarded in that class for that pig.
- Hogs that are brought back from Expo and were not owned and in the possession of the exhibitor prior to Expo, will not receive points.

## Divisions for Crossbred Breeding Gilts

- **ALL breeding gilts have a max weight of 280 pounds weekends 1-3 (Fulton, Perry and Marion) and cannot exceed 325 pounds weekend 4 and after (Highland County and after).**

- **Light and Dark Crossbred Breeding Gilts**

Crossbred breeding gilts will be divided into light and dark classes for the OHPIGS Circuit. The show committee and the OHPIGS Manager, will make the final decision on questionable gilts if any issue are to arise. There will be a Grand and Reserve Champion Light Cross Breeding Gilt and a Grand and Reserve Champion Dark Cross Breeding Gilt.

- LIGHT CROSS BREEDING GILT – to classify as a light cross, the animal must have white and non-black pigment showing no red or black pigmentation on the skin. (i.e. Blues, Blue butts)
- DARK CROSS BREEDING GILT – to classify as a dark cross barrow, the animal must have pigment showing color pigmentation on skin. (i.e. black belted, white hog with black head, white hog with black spots, Calico, red pigmentation or hair)

- **Purebred Influence Breeding Gilts**

Purebred influence Crossbred Barrow requirements are:

- A documented parent (sire or dam) that is a Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire.
- The animal must be recorded in the National Swine Registry (NSR) Crosscheck Verification Program and documentation provided (pedigree/ registration paper).
- Animals that may not meet purebred breed eligibility requirements but still maintain a pedigree would be eligible to show in this division.

## Breeding Grand Drive

Respective champions will be named in the purebred breeds and crossbred divisions.

On the crossbred side, the Grand and Reserve in each division (light crossbred breeding gilts, dark crossbred breeding gilts, purebred influence breeding gilts) will go head-to-head to name a Grand and Reserve Crossbred Breeding Gilt that participates in the Grand Market Drive.

## Showmanship

- ✓ Peewee – ages 3-4
- ✓ Novice – ages 5-8
- ✓ Junior – ages 9-12
- ✓ Intermediate – ages 13-16
- ✓ Senior – ages 17-21

- The age the exhibitor was as of January 1, 2026
- Must KNOW and SHOW in your age/division
- If you show in wrong age/division you will NOT receive points for your correct division.
- Divisions are randomly broken into classes in each age division with no more than 10 in a class.
- Exhibitors cannot use sibling's pig in showmanship.
- If an exhibitor is late for the class/ heat, he or she will not be allowed to enter any other class/ heat in that age division.

## Skillathon

- ✓ Peewee – ages 3-4
- ✓ Novice – ages 5-8
- ✓ Junior – ages 9-12
- ✓ Intermediate – ages 13-16
- ✓ Senior – ages 17-21

- Skillathon will be given at **Pickaway County, May 23**. Skillathon will take place 11:00 am – 4:00 pm.
- No cell phones are allowed to be used during the skillathon.
- Exhibitors will have a packet skillathon and/or may have to rotate throughout stations that cover information from the swine industry.
- Parents cannot complete the skillathon helping their own child. We have helpers to help the little guys. 😊
- Exhibitors will be offered assistance with any trouble in reading or reading the questions.
- Exhibitors need to plan a time where the exhibitor can compete the skillathon test in one sitting.

## Judging Contests

OH-PIGS exhibitors are encouraged to judge at both of the judging events:

### A. Livestock Judging

- One class of market barrows/gilts and a one class of breeding gilts.
- Livestock Judging Contest will be held at **Marion County (May 3)** and **Clark County (May 31)**
- Exhibitors will have 4 placings to mark on card for breeding and market.
- Exhibitors will answer 4 questions for breeding and market classes.

### B. Meat Judging

- Meats Judging Contest will be held at **Perry County (April 26)** and **TBA**
- Meats judging will consist of retail meat identification and placing 2 classes of retail cuts.

### C. Judging contest expectations

- No cell phones are allowed during the contest
- Parents cannot assist their own child during the judging contest. We have the older exhibitors assist the younger exhibitors.
- OH-PIGS exhibitors only have to participate in one of the judging contests, however, if the exhibitor does both livestock and meats contests, the highest score for each will be tabulated into Overall Exhibitor Points.

## Photography Contest

OH-PIGS encourages our exhibitors to use photo to communicate about the swine industry. This is a standalone contest and will NOT be calculated in the Overall Exhibitor Point totals. All photos will be turned in by the last OHPIGS show of the season.

Entries will be judged in 3 categories: **Pigs** **People** **Industry**

- Photo must be taken by a 2025 OH-PIGS exhibitor.
- Photo submitted cannot have the exhibitor submitting the photo in the picture.
- Photo must be taken by the OH-PIGS exhibitor within the last calendar year.
- An OH-PIGS exhibitor may enter any number of photos into each category.
- Photos cannot be digitally altered or the photo will be disqualified.
- Photos should not have captions.
- Photos will be accepted in color, black/ white or sepia.
- All photos submitted must be a 5x7 print with an index card stating exhibitor name, age, and category to be judged in

## Promotional or Educational Poster and Social Media Contest

1. Youth are encouraged to choose an appropriate subject/theme that directly relates to swine which promotes a particular topic or educates the viewer about a swine related activity. This entry must be an original work (not submitted to any other contest/event).
2. Peewee, Novice and Juniors should create a poster to promote pork or educate about pork. Posters can be handmade or created digitally. The poster can be given to Kelly or take a photo of the poster by itself and a picture of child with poster then submit the photo through email to [kmorgan@ohiopork.org](mailto:kmorgan@ohiopork.org). In the submission email, please include the name, address, phone number, division, and birth date of participant.
3. Intermediate and Seniors should create 5 social media posts that would be suitable for Facebook or Instagram. The social media posts can be created and sent in as a Word Doc or PDF but should show the graphic and what the post would say. Please submit to [kmorgan@ohiopork.org](mailto:kmorgan@ohiopork.org). In the submission email, please include the name, address, phone number, division, and birth date of participant.
4. Copyrighted characters and photos cannot be used. All non-copyrighted photos' sources must be listed on your reference slide.
5. All text in the social media posts must be original and written by the contestant. Plagiarism will result in the submission being unacceptable.
6. Social Media posts will be judged off of the rubric provided to each age division. Please read the rubric carefully to fully understand in what areas you will be judged in and what will lead to points deducted. The rubric can be found on mipork.org.
7. OHPIGS and the Ohio Pork Council can use the posters and social media posts for educational purposes throughout the year.

**All entries must be submitted by Saturday, June 6, 2026 to be considered.**

## **OH-PIGS Overall Exhibitor**

Members of the OH-PIGS Circuit will accrue points once membership fees are paid. There will be a Top 5 OH-PIGS Exhibitors awarded in each age division and a Top 5 Overall OH-PIGS Exhibitor by earning points in the following areas:

- Pig points = 2 highest placing pigs (can be 2 market, 2 breeding, 1 of each)
- Showmanship
- Skillathon
- Judging Contest (may count highest score from each livestock and meats judging contests)

## **POINTS**

Points will be kept as follows: member can accumulate points from all shows; however, awards will be based on the grand total points from member's top TWO pigs earned from **ELEVEN (11)** of all OH-PIGS sanctioned shows (21) offered during the 2026 season. Showmanship points will be based off the best **6 out of 9** placings earned on Saturday showmanship in 2026.

- a. Show coordinators will record and send results to Kelly Morgan.
- b. The Ohio Pork Council ([www.ohiopork.org](http://www.ohiopork.org)) will have a link to the OH-PIGS website which will serve as the official site for the summer and fall circuit points.
- c. The show dates for the summer season will be verified by the OH-PIGS Committee. The 2026 OH-PIGS Circuit will have 21 total shows over 9 weekends.
- d. Points will be accumulated from all sanctioned shows, however overall awards will be based on points earned from the member's top two pigs at **ELEVEN (11)** most successful shows.
- e. Points will be accumulated from all sanctioned shows; however, overall showmanship awards for 2025 will be based on points earned from the member's top performances in **6 out of 9** showmanship competitions.
- f. Exhibitor **MUST** attend **ELEVEN (11)** shows to be in running for high points of a breeding or market category.
- g. Points will only be earned for the identified pigs of a specific exhibitor. That exhibitor is the only one who may show the identified pig(s).
- h. ALL pigs must be pigs eligible to show on the OH-PIGS Circuit meeting breed rules and characteristics.
- i. Any grievance must be presented to the OH-PIGS Senior Board, within 24 hours of incident, in writing and accompanied by a \$100 non-refundable fee.

## Point Breakdowns

- **Breeding and Market Classes** - top five placings in each:
  - 1<sup>st</sup> = 10 x number of head in class with max of 5 head
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> = 9 x number of head in class with max of 5 head
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> = 8 x number of head in class with max of 5 head
  - 4<sup>th</sup> = 7 x number of head in class with max of 5 head
  - 5<sup>th</sup> = 6 x number of head in class with max of 5 head
  - 6<sup>th</sup> and below = 5 points each
    - Examples
      - 5 head or over in a class: 1st = 50 points
      - 4 head in a class: 1st = 40 points
      - 3 head in a class: 1st = 30 points
      - 2 head in a class: 1st = 20 points
- **Breed winners:**
  - Champions = 10 points
  - Reserves = 7 points
  - No extra points are accrued when crossbreds are named Grand or Reserve Crossbred Breeding Gilt or Grand or Reserve Crossbred Market Hog as your points were accrued in your respective division/class.
- **Overall Breeding and Market winners:**
  - Grand Overall = 5 points
  - Reserve Grand = 4 points
  - Third Overall = 3 points
  - Fourth Overall = 2 points
  - Fifth Overall = 1 points
- **Showmanship Classes:**

The following points will be used to determine Champion Showman through 10<sup>th</sup> Overall in each age division at each show.

- 1<sup>st</sup> = 10 points
- 2<sup>nd</sup> = 9 points
- 3<sup>rd</sup> = 8 points
- 4<sup>th</sup> = 7 points
- 5<sup>th</sup> = 6 points
- 6<sup>th</sup> = 5 points
- 7<sup>th</sup> = 4 points
- 8<sup>th</sup> = 3 points
- 9<sup>th</sup> = 2 points
- 10<sup>th</sup> = 1 point

Exhibitors will be selected from each class to come back to an Overall Showmanship drive in that respective division. They will return at the end of their age division to compete for Overall Showman of that division. (ie: If there are four novice classes, the selected class exhibitors would return to compete for Overall Novice Showmanship drive).

- Exhibitors asked to come back will receive 7 points for being asked back to final.
- All kids that did not get called back will get 5 participation points for showmanship.
