



Sparking Curiosity, Honoring a Legend

This year, Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Southwest Michigan launched an exciting new tradition: our inaugural STEAM Dream event.

The event was held on July 12, 2024, at our Fettig Youth Campus in Benton Harbor. STEAM Dream 2024 brought nearly 500 Club members together for a full day of hands-on learning dedicated to Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math. The event was designed to show our youth that big dreams are within reach—and to help them see themselves as future scientists, engineers, artists, and innovators.

The event was held in honor of Dr. Ann St. Amand, a respected local scientist whose legacy of environmental research and community impact continues to inspire. By naming the event for Dr. St. Amand, we underscored for our youth that success in STEM isn't abstract or far away—it's something people from our own community achieve and give back through.

Throughout the day, members rotated through interactive workshops and stations led by Club staff, educators, and community partners, including Whirlpool Corporation, LECO, Abbott Laboratorires, Wightman & Assoc., Lake Michigan College, Ghostlight Theatre, and more!

Beyond just fun, these experiences were designed to reinforce core academic skills, nurture curiosity, and help members discover new interests they can keep exploring at the Club all year long.

STEAM Dream 2024 was more than an event. It was a promise to our members that we will keep investing in their futures, helping them expand their horizons, and supporting them as they reach for academic success every day.

Spotlight on Health & Well-Being

One of the most powerful examples of our commitment to youth health and well-being in 2024 was Unity Day—a summer tradition that brings together hundreds of Boys & Girls Club members from across Southwest Michigan for a day of fun, friendship, and shared learning.

On July 26, 2024, we hosted Unity Day at our Fettig Youth Campus in Benton Harbor, welcoming youth from all our summer sites for a day filled with field games, music, team-building challenges, and healthy activities.

Building Community Through Play

At its heart, Unity Day is about showing young people that healthy lifestyles include more than physical fitness—they're also about emotional well-being, social connection, and belonging. Members participated in team sports and relay races designed to encourage cooperation, communication, and good sportsmanship.

Fostering Inclusion and Belonging

True to its name, Unity Day is designed to celebrate diversity, promote inclusion, and strengthen a sense of shared community among our members. For many youth, it was a chance to meet new friends, learn from others, and see that they are part of something bigger.

This culture of inclusion is at the core of our health and well-being programming. When youth feel safe, welcome, and valued, they're more likely to take healthy risks, try new activities, and build the confidence they need to thrive.

Empire Avenue location to create new opportunities for teens—particularly those in Benton Harbor—to explore career paths, build employability skills, and prepare for a successful future.
