Middlesbrough Girls FC - Club Policies

These policies set out the standards, expectations, and procedures of Middlesbrough Girls FC. They apply to all players, parents/carers, coaches, volunteers, officials, and committee members.

1. Safeguarding & Child Protection Policy

Middlesbrough Girls FC is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all children and young people.

- We follow FA Safeguarding Children Policy and Procedures.
- All coaches and volunteers must hold a valid DBS check and complete FA Safeguarding Children training.
- A qualified Club Welfare Officer (CWO) is appointed and acts as the first point of contact for concerns.
- Any safeguarding concerns must be reported immediately to the CWO and, where necessary, the FA or statutory agencies.
- We operate a zero-tolerance approach to abuse, bullying, discrimination, or neglect.

2. Equality, Diversity & Inclusion Policy

Middlesbrough Girls FC is inclusive and welcoming to all.

- We do not discriminate based on gender, race, ethnicity, disability, religion, sexual orientation, or background.
- All players are given equal opportunities to develop and enjoy football.
- Discriminatory language or behaviour will result in disciplinary action.

3. Codes of Conduct

Players' Code of Conduct

Players are expected to: - Respect coaches, teammates, officials, and opponents. - Play fairly and within the rules of the game. - Display good sportsmanship at all times. - Listen to coaches and try their best at training and matches.

Parents & Carers Code of Conduct

Parents/carers are expected to: - Encourage positive behaviour and effort, not just results. - Respect match officials and opposition. - Communicate concerns through the appropriate club channels. - Never coach from the sidelines unless authorised.

Coaches & Volunteers Code of Conduct

Coaches/volunteers must: - Put player welfare before winning. - Be positive role models. - Maintain professional boundaries at all times. - Follow FA policies, club policies, and safeguarding procedures.

4. Anti-Bullying Policy

Bullying will not be tolerated in any form.

- This includes verbal, physical, emotional, online, or discriminatory bullying.
- All incidents will be taken seriously and investigated.
- Appropriate action will be taken, which may include suspension or removal from the club.

5. Health & Safety Policy

The club is committed to providing a safe environment.

- Risk assessments will be carried out for training and matches.
- First aid kits will be available at all sessions.
- At least one first-aid qualified adult will be present.
- Injuries must be reported and recorded.
- Players must wear appropriate kit and protective equipment.

6. Social Media & Communications Policy

- Social media must be used responsibly and respectfully.
- No inappropriate images, comments, or content involving players will be shared.
- Coaches must use group platforms approved by the club for communication.
- Direct messaging between adults and players is discouraged and must follow FA guidance.

7. Photography & Video Policy

- Parental consent must be obtained before taking or using images/videos of players.
- Images will only be used for club-related purposes.
- No personal details will be published alongside images.

8. Discipline & Complaints Policy

- Any breaches of club policies may result in disciplinary action.
- Complaints should be submitted in writing to the Club Secretary or Welfare Officer.
- Complaints will be handled fairly, confidentially, and promptly.

9. Data Protection (GDPR) Policy

- Personal data is collected and stored securely.
- Data is used only for legitimate club purposes.
- Data will not be shared without consent unless legally required.

10. Policy Review

- All policies will be reviewed annually or in line with FA guidance updates.
- Updates will be communicated to members.
