





Phyllis J. Loscig, 86, passed away peacefully on January 12, 2026, at her home surrounded by family in Painted Post, NY.


Phyllis was born on August 8, 1939, in Thurston, NY, to Harold and Laura (Wilhelm) Stewart.





#### 60-DAY NOTICE OF INTENT TO FILE AN APPLICATION

WEB Addison Solar, LLC, a New York limited liability company ("Applicant"), is proposing to construct a major electric generating facility under Article VIII of the New York State Public Service Law ("Article VIII"). This notice announces that on or after March 30, 2026, Applicant will file an Application pursuant to Article VIII and its implementing regulations (the "Article VIII Process") under Permit Application Number ORES DMM Matter No. 23-03015. The Article VIII Process has been implemented by rules enacted by the Office of Renewable Energy Siting and Electric Transmission ("ORES") and establishes a review process with uniform standards and conditions for all renewable energy projects. The uniform standards and conditions are available at Chapter XI, Title 16 of NYCRR Part 1100 and <https://dps.ny.gov/ores-regulatory-documents>.

The proposed solar energy generation facility and associated necessary infrastructure, including transmission lines, is designed for approximately 105 megawatts (MW) AC and will be sited on approximately 1,082 acres of land in the Towns of Addison, Campbell, and Erwin, in Steuben County, New York (the "Project" or "Facility"). The purpose of the proposed Facility is to generate solar-powered electricity that will provide a significant source of renewable electricity to the New York State power grid. The Project will include the installation and operation of solar panels, together with the associated inverters and other electrical equipment and systems, substation, access roads, and other ancillary facilities. The Applicant will also construct a new point of interconnect ("POI") switchyard and 115-kV high-voltage loop-in and loop-out transmission lines ("NYSEG Facilities") adjacent to its collector substation. Upon completion, the ownership of these NYSEG Facilities will be transferred over to NYSEG.

**Middle School "Red Ribbon Week" and Winter Events**





**Virtual Reality Educational Experience**



### Letter To The Editor

I attended the January Village Board meeting. I asked about the up and coming water project. I also asked about the cost of the project and the Mayor stated that most of the money was coming from grants and was pretty confident that another grant would pay for the rest of the project. I understand the importance of this project and, I myself, think that the influx of water in our sewer system is more of a priority. The reason being is that it costs us \$80,000-\$100,000 more per year. The mayor stated they had been in contact with Erwin about the water problem and we would get some sort of a break. This doesn't make me feel any better. We still have a problem until it is fixed. And we will still be overpaying for the influx of water. Not as much, but still overpaying.

I have asked if the Water and Sewer Dept. were solvent and I was assured they were. This means only one thing. As consumers, we are being overcharged for our service. I foiled this information from the Village Clerk and the records show the cost from 6/24/21-10/28/24 was approximately \$364,945. These are the only records that I was able to obtain. In my thinking, there are at least three more years without records. So does this mean another \$350,000 plus. Who do we blame? It's just neglect. Also, this administration has the ball. Don't let it go to the wayside.

I'm also aware of \$200,000 that we may receive or any we have received in insurance money. I stated that they could use the money to pay down two water bonds. Bond of 1997 balance is approx. \$77,000 and the bond of 2002 balance is approx. \$75,000. If they paid the bond of 1997, they would save about \$12,000 in interest. The bond of 2002 has no interest to be paid. These bonds will then be all paid.

As we know, we have an election coming up in March for two trustees. The last two elections haven't been the best for the village. In 2022, the mayor resigned after ten days in office. In 2024, a trustee was elected and served one year and then hasn't attended meetings to this date.

Because you don't meet your responsibilities, it puts the Village in a bad position, and also gives the election a bad name.

So, if you run for trustee in 2026, and win, don't let the people and village who voted for you down.
