## Riley Takes on the Legendary 2025 Baja 1000

Addison’s own Levi Riley, known to the off-road racing world as “The Notorious Levi Riley,” is gearing up for one of the most demanding races on Earth — the 2025 Baja 1000.



This year’s course covers 854 miles of brutal desert terrain, running the full length of Mexico’s Baja California Peninsula. But what makes Riley’s story stand out isn’t just that he’s competing — it’s how he’s competing. He’s racing in the Pro Moto Ironman class, which means he’ll be riding completely alone from start to finish. No teammates. No rest breaks. Just one man, one bike, and nearly 900 miles of unforgiving desert.

Riley will take on the challenge aboard his custom-built 2009 Honda CRF450X, a bike that’s become his trusted partner in some of the toughest endurance events

across the country. He’s already a multi-time 24-hour Ironman champion, with titles in Kentucky, Texas, Alabama, and New York. But even with all that experience, the Baja 1000 stands in a league of its own.

“The Baja is like nothing else,” Riley said. “You’re out there for 24 to 30 hours straight — through rocks, sand, mountains, and darkness. It’s just you and the desert. You have to want it more than anything.”

The Baja 1000 is famous for pushing riders to their breaking point. Competitors battle not only fatigue and dehydration but also unpredictable terrain — everything from deep sand washes and rocky mountain passes to endless miles of cactus and silt that can bury a bike to its handlebars. Nighttime brings its own dangers, as riders navigate by headlight with limited visibility and constant dust.

Riley will rely on his 2 chase trucks and pit support teams scattered across remote checkpoints, grabbing quick fuel stops and snacks before pressing on into the darkness. For most people, even finishing this race is an achievement few can imagine.

“It’s not about being fearless,” Riley said. “It’s about being prepared, staying focused, and never giving up — no matter what the desert throws at you.”

Representing Levi Riley Racing, he’ll carry the pride of Addison and the local racing community into the heart of Baja this November.



### American Bloodhound Club Visits Addison

Last Saturday, October 25 th , the American Bloodhound Club arrived in Addison to hold a daylong training seminar for new hounds and their handlers. Canine teams from New York, Pennsylvania, New Hampshire, and Ontario Canada came to town to attend this unique event. Folks driving through the village may have noticed teams working in two sessions at the OVH and Valerio parks.

Originally known as Saint Hubert’s Hounds, this breed was known for its superior tracking/trailing ability and became a favorite of European royalty. Centuries of evolution and genetic refinement have evolved the breed to what we today know as Bloodhounds. Gentle giants, these loveable, long eared hounds are blessed with loose skin that acts as a natural funnel, bringing scent from the ground to a nose that holds over 3 times as

many olfactory nodes than other hound breeds. Additionally, the bloodhound brain is what is referred to as “scent discriminant”, meaning that a bloodhound d can separate scents remember them to match a trail to a specific person. These qualities make bloodhounds the best of all tracking/trailing dogs and the preferred breed for law enforcement throughout much of the United States.

Participants were extremely impressed with the hospitality of our village, and the area provides a wide variety of possibilities for training in rural and urban areas on various surfaces with changing elevations. For those reasons, the club members are looking forward to come back to Addison next year to host a larger weekend event.

None of this would have been possible without the gracious support of Mayor Ed Soporowski and the Addison Volunteer Fire Department. Thank you all for your help in bringing this unique event to Addison.
