SUMMARY OF BOND RESOLUTION

Set forth below is a summary of said resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Addison, Steuben County, New York (the “Village”) on September 8, 2025.

1. The resolution is entitled “SECOND AMENDED AND RESTATED BOND RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ADDISON, STEUBEN COUNTY, NEW YORK, AMENDING AND RESTATING IN ITS ENTIRETY A BOND RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE DATED OCTOBER 12, 2021, AS PREVIOUSLY AMENDED BY A RESOLUTION DATED JULY 14, 2025, AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE TO UNDERTAKE CERTAIN WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS; STATING THE MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST THEREOF IS \$2,462,200; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$2,462,200 IN SERIAL BONDS OF THE VILLAGE TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION”.
2. Object or Purpose: water system improvements pursuant an engineering report entitled “Village of Addison Water System Study” dated January 2019 and revised October 2020, as prepared by Larson Design Group, the Village’s engineers, and on file in the office of the Village Clerk, incorporating certain technological changes and describing upgrades and improvements to be constructed, reconstructed and installed for the Village’s water system, including all related, ancillary and appurtenant facilities, improvements, equipment, machinery and apparatus, and all planning, design, engineering, legal and permitting costs in connection therewith and the financing thereof.
3. Period of Probable Usefulness: 40 years.
4. Amount of Debt Obligations Authorized: up to \$2,462,200.

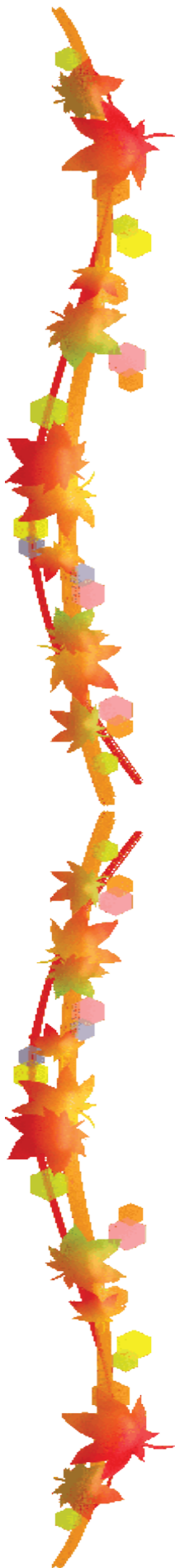

Keech and Specht as Co-Ex Officio Student BOE Members

Beginning July 1, 2025, New York State required school districts with a high school across the state to include at least one ex officio student member on their school board. Kaylee Keech and Seth Specht were selected as Addison School District's Co-Ex Officio Student Members for the 2025-2026 school year following adoption of this policy on March 25, 2025 by our Board of Education. The purpose of including student members on the board is to involve students' voices in its deliberations and provide direct and consistent communication between the student body and the Board of Education. Therefore, Board decisions will be informed by student needs and concerns as a result.

By participating, ex officio student board members also gain leadership experience and a greater connection to civic responsibility and active civic participation. Specifically, ex officio student members of the Board are expected to: Bring a student perspective to the Board's discussions, Bring student concerns to the Board's attention, Represent the student body on the Board, Report back to the student body on the Board's actions, and Solicit input from students on matters impacting the district, at the direction of the Board. Selected students must have attended the high school for at least one year prior to being selected.

All qualified students interested in serving as ex officio student members are encouraged to apply in the manner established by the administration. The district will advertise the position of ex officio student member of the Board to high school students, as well as the method of applying for the position, well in advance of the deadline for doing so. The ex officio student member represents the student body, and acts as an example for the students of the district. Such students are expected to abide by all applicable Board policies including the student Code of Conduct. Congratulations to Kaylee and Seth for being selected to this year's Board as Co-Ex Officio Student BOE members.

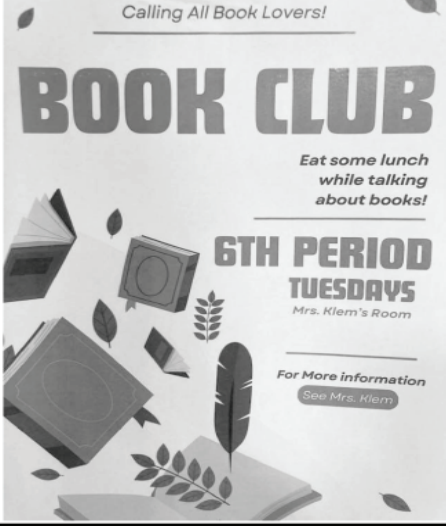


Introducing Addison High School Book Club

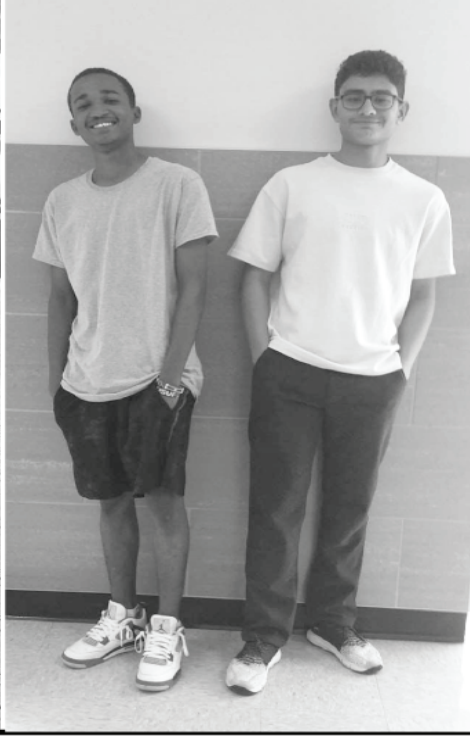
Getting to Know: Abdullaziz A.

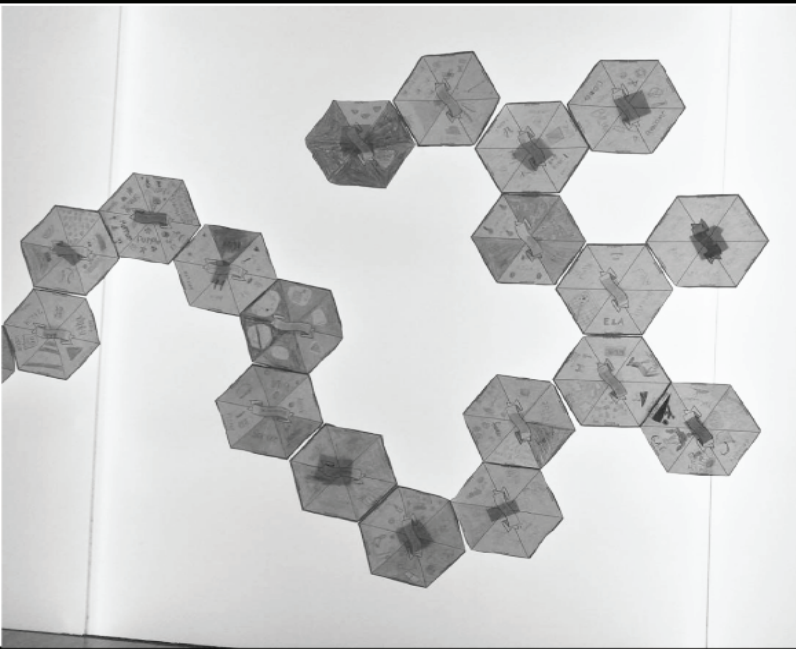
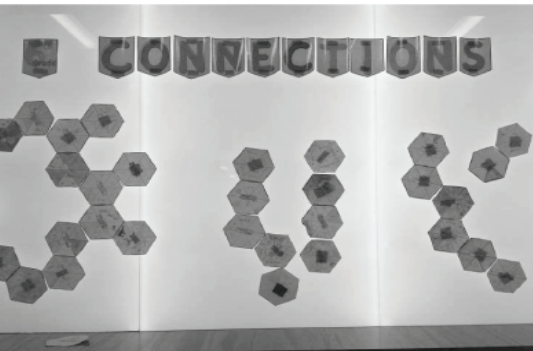
Mrs. Hunkele's and Mrs. Reed's 5th grade started their science unit by learning about how their shadows move/change in relation to the sun moving in the sky!

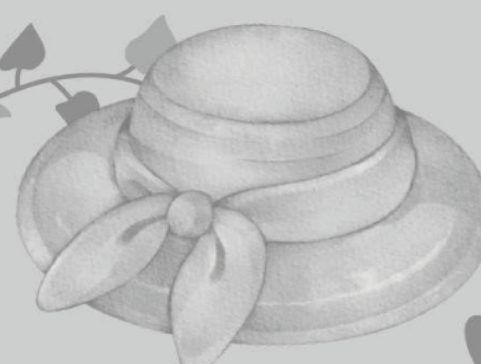
