

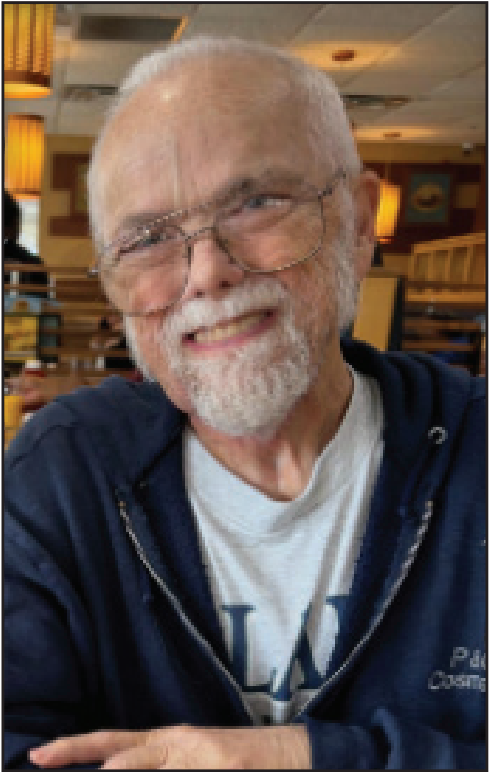

When his daughter Rose began training working border collies during the COVID outbreak, he and Camille would drive an hour away to sit in their car and watch the herding instinct come to life for a few minutes, before turning around and driving the hour home. As Rose began competing, Jim and Camille traveled to Savannah, GA, to watch her first trial, and from then he was hooked. Exploring the vast farmland of Ohio, New York, Kentucky, and Virginia to cheer on his grand dogs, Jim and Camille would be sure to “shop local,” checking out the local ice cream shops and vineyards. Jim found great joy in the adventures of life, always made better by good food, great songs, and wonderful company.
