Village of Addison Board Meeting Minutes January 12, 2026

The Village of Addison held its Regular Monthly Board Meeting on Monday, January 12, 2026, at 6:30 p.m. at the Addison Community Center.

Mayor Soporowski welcomed the community and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

IN ATTENDANCE: Mayor Ed Soporowski, Trustees Bo Graham, Lorne Hults, Tara Watson, and Village Clerk/Treasurer Donna Taylor.

Department Representatives: Code Enforcement Officer Nick Lewis-Nolton and Officer-In-Charge Ken Grover. **Absent:** Trustee Dennis Rattay, DPW Working Foreman Charles Wright, and Fire Chief David Hatch.

MEETING MINUTES/DEPARTMENT REPORTS/BILLS: The Board approved meeting minutes for the December 8 regular monthly board meeting, monthly department reports, payment of bills, and payroll certification.

PUBLIC COMMENT #1: Jim Gotshall inquired about the new water project, asking about its cost and how it will be funded.

He emphasized the importance of prioritizing the much-needed water/sewer infrastructure over taking on a new water project. Has the village considered paying down some of the outstanding bonds to help offset and lower future water and sewer rates? Derek Burrell inquired about the current water and sewer rates, questioning why they are so high and whether the village has considered adjusting the rates to align with the water and sewer fund balances. He also inquired whether it was true that two water leaks/breaks had been found on Highland Ave and behind Wades, and why the Christmas decorations were put up so late, and why not all the decorations were put up? Mr. Burrell commented that he has noticed much less work/visibility by the DPW and asked why this was. Rich Cilino asked the Board if they were aware that the Governor had recently passed a law for Senior Tax Relief, and if the village would look further into this on behalf of senior citizens within the village. He also asked if the village had considered looking into local utility companies to see if they have bucket trucks for sale. Gary Aumick inquired about when he might be able to be reconnected to the main water line on Grove Street instead of a direct connection to the fire hydrant.

PERSONNEL: The Village Board approved the following personnel appointments: (1) Appointment Amendment of Connor Woodworth as a full-time DPW General Laborer.

NEW BUSINESS: The Board of Trustees approved the following agenda items during New Business: (1) Purchase of Bobcat AT 450 Tractor using CHIPs funds, (2) 2025-26 CHIPs Budget Transfer, and (3) Resolution 1-2026: Village General Election Inspectors.

PUBLIC COMMENT #2: Hal Sisson asked if there was an update from Armstrong on the removal of the double utility poles throughout the village. Derek Burrell asked when the Republican and Democratic Caucuses were being held.

ADJOURNMENT: The Board adjourned at 8:15 pm.







A 1968 graduate of Hornell High School, Janice earned her bachelor's and master's degrees in classical languages from St. Bonaventure University.




