Addison 2026-2027 School Budget

In early February, Mr. Peiffer, Superintendent, and Mr. Everly, Executive Director of Finance and Operations, were interviewed to discuss the upcoming school budget in the interest of transparency. Each November, the budgeting process begins and extends to the budget vote in May of the current school year. Due to this deadline and to be best prepared, the process begins with asking general questions and trying to be ahead of upcoming costs. The budget is also discussed at every board meeting from January to May.

One of the biggest challenges of creating the budget is the price increase of important items needed for our school while also having money in savings. Another main priority for the school is maintaining people and programs that have been expected by the community and allow for growth, especially BOCES. Maintaining the valuable programs that we have in the district and prioritizing the "people" is the ultimate priority when planning a school district budget. The biggest increase in district expenses is the 30% increase in health insurance premiums followed by the skyrocketing energy (electric and natural gas) costs.

A big change pricewise for the upcoming school years' budgets is the Zero emission bus law starting in the 27-28 school year. Electric buses are triple the price of a diesel bus and when we need to switch, we will most likely need several more buses and drivers because of range issues. By 2035, the law states schools must have all electric buses.

There will be a budget hearing on May 12th. The information is also stated in the budget newsletter, which will be published and distributed to the community. People who have more specific question about the budget may contact Mr. Rich Everly at 607-359-2245 or via email at REverly@addisoncsd.org.

The voting numbers in the last several years has decreased. Less than 10% of people vote on the budget. The budget vote is May 19th from noon to 8:00 P.M. and anyone who is eligible to vote is encouraged to attend.

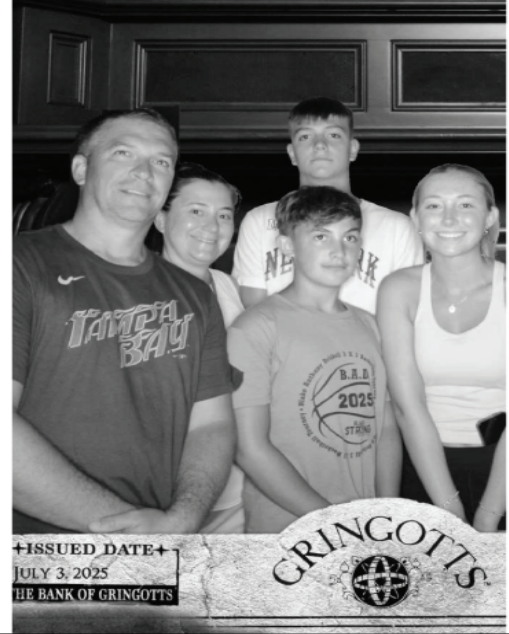
Welcome, Mr. Miller!

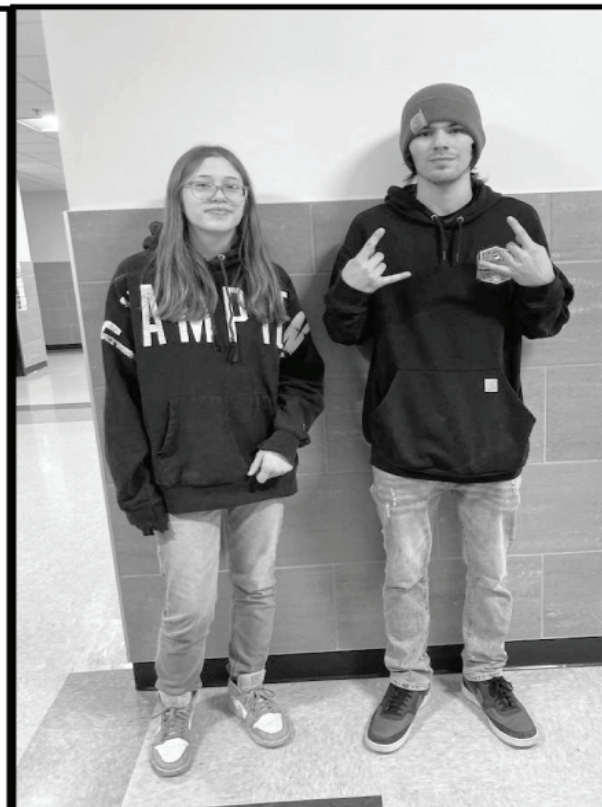

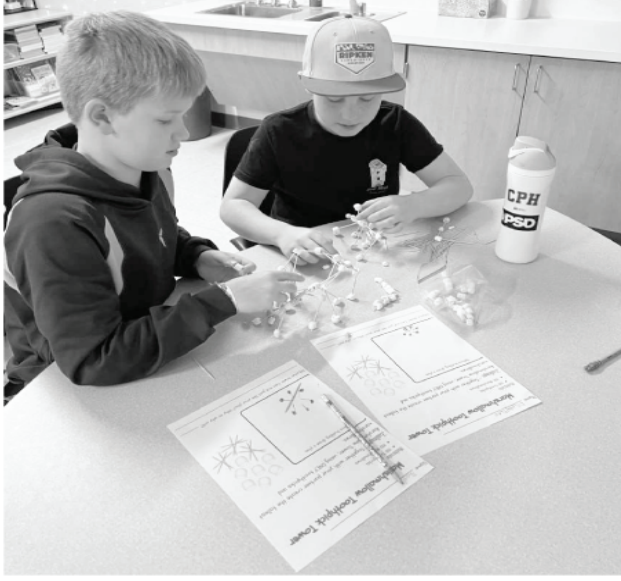

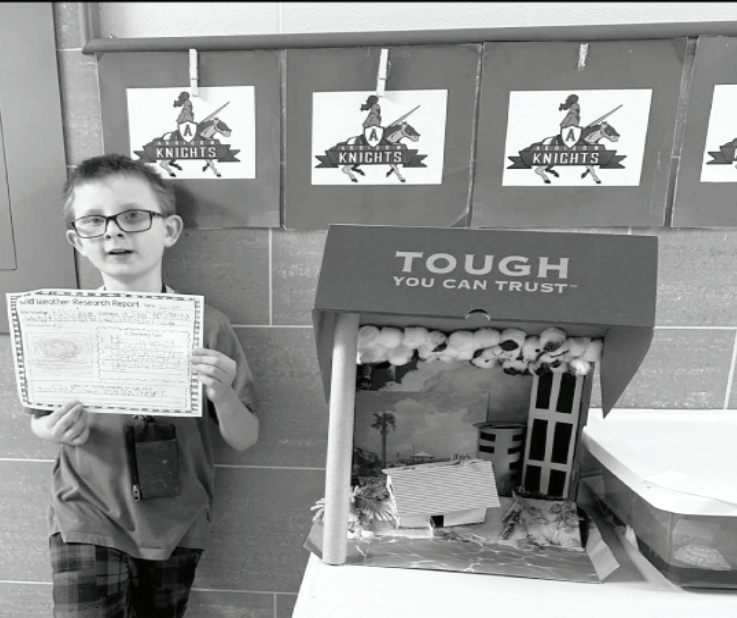
Active Floor

Village of Addison

Regular Board Meeting Minutes ~ February 9, 2026

The Village of Addison held its Regular Monthly Board Meeting on Monday, February 9, 2026, at 6:30 p.m. at the Addison Community Center. Mayor Soporowski welcomed the community and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

IN ATTENDANCE: Deputy Mayor Bo Graham, Trustees Lorne Hults, Tara Watson, and Village Clerk/Treasurer Donna Taylor. Department Representatives: Officer-In-Charge Ken Grover and Fire Chief David Hatch. Absent: Mayor Ed Soporowski, Trustee Dennis Rattay, DPW Working Foreman Charles Wright, and Code Enforcement Officer Nick Lewis-Nolton.

MEETING MINUTES/DEPARTMENT REPORTS/BILLS: The Board approved meeting minutes for the January 12 regular monthly board meeting, monthly department reports, and payment of monthly bills.

PUBLIC COMMENT #1: Amanda Cook inquired about the Village Sewer Plant and the operation of this plant. Jaime Shorthouse-Potts extended a Thank You to the DPW crew for their hard work in keeping the village streets clean and clear during this last snowstorm.

PERSONNEL: The Village Board approved Donald DuVall and Bocephus Graham as members of the Addison Volunteer Fire Department.

NEW BUSINESS: The Board of Trustees approved the following agenda items during New Business: (1) Addison Annal Car Show hosted by Jodi Mayo for July 19, 2026 (rain date July 26, 2026), and (2) Tyler Woodworth to attend Class B Water Training March 16-20, 2026

1st READ/REVIEW OF LOCAL LAWS: Village Board of Trustees were given the following local laws to read/review: Local Law #1-2026: Village Water Department Policy and Local Law #1-2018 Amendment: Granting Cold War Veterans' Exemption.

PUBLIC COMMENT #2: Kevin Shorthouse reported that there is still no water at the Food Pantry and that they have been unsuccessful in finding the shut-off valve. He is wondering if the village DPW crew could assist in locating it. Amanda Cook asked and was permitted to address the Village Board regarding several concerns.

Concern #1: The Village/Town Leash Law ~ the law states that all dogs MUST be leashed unless they are under reliable voice command when off their owner's property. Laws are only as effective as the examples set by those entrusted to uphold them. When a village board member does not follow the spirit and intent of this law, it sends a message to the public that the law is optional or open to personal interpretation. I respectfully ask the board to reaffirm the importance of this law for the safety of the community, especially those in leadership.

Concern #2: The accessibility of the Village Dump Site ~ Currently, the hours of operation, for lack of a better word, make it difficult for many residents to use the facility, especially those who work full-time during the week. For most families and working individuals, weekends are the only realistic time they have to clean up their properties and haul debris. When the dump site is not open or available, especially on weekends and even beyond 4 pm some weekdays, it unintentionally creates barriers for residents who are trying to follow the rules and who like to keep their property maintained. Limited access can lead to improper disposal because people do not have a practical option. I respectfully ask the board to consider adjusting the availability so that the facility truly meets the needs of all residents that it is meant to serve. **Concern #3: Ongoing concerns regarding the quality of our village water ~** Many residents have experienced issues that strongly suggest the water is not suitable for normal household use. Water leaves stains on clothing, causes significant calcium buildup on sinks and appliances, and at times, there is a very strong chlorine odor. These issues go beyond inconvenience; they impact daily living, damage personal property, and raise serious concerns about long-term health and safety.

Residents should not have to question whether their water is safe to drink, bathe in, or use for cooking and laundry. I am asking the board for transparency and accountability on this matter. What testing is currently being done? What problems have been identified? And most importantly, what steps are being taken to correct these issues and ensure safe, reliable water for our community? Clean, safe water is a necessity, not a luxury. I respectfully request clean answers and a plan for resolution so residents can have confidence in the water we rely on every day and pay for. **Concern #4: Article 15 of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law**

~ This law requires villages and towns to adhere to strict environmental regulations when conducting any work in creek beds and streams. Any disturbance to these ecosystems can take many years to recover, and such activities typically require permits and oversight by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.

o Was the Department of Environmental Conservation contacted prior to the digging that occurred in the Tuscarora Creek? **Village response was that NYS DEC was responsible for the digging of the Tuscarora Creek.**

o Were the proper permits obtained for this work?
o What steps are being taken to restore or rebuild the ecosystem that was disturbed?
Again, the Village stated that the NYS DEC was responsible for the digging and that all further questions should be directed to NYS DEC.

Concern #4: Enforcement and consistency ~ My husband and I drove briefly on the rock bed near the Tuscarora Creek to collect stones and were approached by a village police officer. We were told that we could not drive down there because the DEC does not want oil leaking and entering the creek. The officer himself also drove down to that location. Later on, we observed heavy-duty village equipment actively digging in the creek area, and those vehicles were leaking oil. I respectfully ask the board to explain:

- o How are environmental protections being enforced consistently?
- o Why are private citizens restricted due to environmental concerns while village equipment appears to violate those same standards, and
- o What corrective actions, if any, will be taken.

Richard Cilino inquired about the status of the Main Street light pole. He also asked who was responsible for shoveling Main Street during the last snowstorm and what kind of liability this may place on the village.

Additionally, Mr. Cilino asked whether the village had considered the recently passed Senior Citizen Exemption and the current status of the village's purchase of a bucket truck.

In 2000, he opened Bob's Automotive of Arkport to pursue his love of mechanics before officially retiring in 2010.

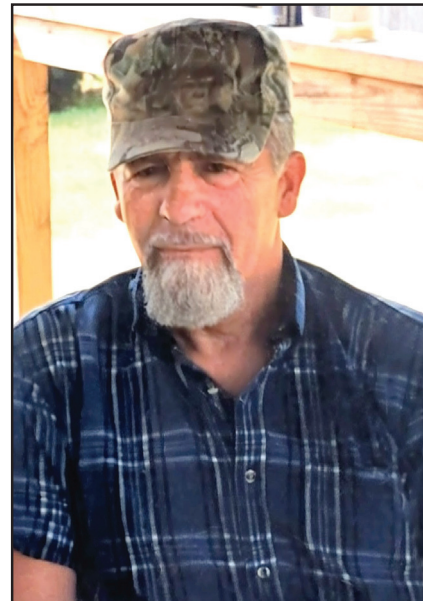
