

Letter To The Editor - School Budget

The current school budget has a 2.8 million dollar deficit.
 The new budget has a 6.15% increase in expenditures and a 1.88 million dollar deficit.
 They plan to increase taxes 1% but that will not be enough. They plan to air condition the school.
 They plan to spend \$8,811,800 on improvements and repairs to the Valley School
 They plan to spend \$35,427,900 on improvements and repairs to the Tuscarora School
 They plan to spend \$18,291,400 on improvements and repairs to the High School
 They plan to spend \$3,473,300 on the unnecessary annex storage building which no longer houses the district offices.
 They plan to spend \$185,400 on repairs to the Jenny Mose Center

The people of this district cannot afford their utility bills, nor their homeowner's insurance bills, Nor their car insurance bills, nor their medical bills, nor their rent/ housing expenses, nor can many afford food. This budget shows an administration more concerned with

BRIBING students to come to school than providing a quality education. see the 1 hour 33 minute mark. This budget shows a school board out of touch with reality.

One of the ways the board ignores reality are the bonds that are guaranteed by the homes of the residents. NY State promises to pay the bonds until they don't. NY City is increasing taxes by 9.5% and will still have a huge deficit they expect the state to pay while the state faces a cutoff of Federal Funds due to the State's using the sanctuary state law to block giving Federally funded program information. This would leave the State unable to pay its promises to the taxpayers in order to protect non taxpaying people.

If this school board had any concern for the welfare of the taxpayers of the Addison School District they would close the terribly expensive Valley School. They would close the annex. They would cancel the terribly expensive plans to air condition the school and the terribly expensive plans to redo the school district offices. In addition they must reduce staffing, both administration and teaching, to levels the people can afford!
 In these very difficult times the board needs to cut the budget and reduce the tax burden.

Science and Discovery in Ms. Gotshall's 1st Grade Classroom


The Science and Discovery ladies visited our 1st graders for an exciting hands-on exploration of sound! Students worked in pairs and rotated through stations with different metal objects—such as cans, pans, and various household items. Each object had two strings with finger loops attached. Partners took turns placing their fingers through the loops and gently pressing their pointer fingers to their ears. The other partner tapped the object with a plastic spoon. This allowed the sound vibrations to travel from the object, through the strings, through their fingers, and directly to their ears. Students were amazed at how clearly they could hear the sound through vibration alone! The activity was engaging, interactive, and perfectly connected to our Sound and Light Unit. The students had a wonderful time exploring how sound travels and discovering the science behind vibration and energy.



Adaptive Physical Education in Addison

In Addison, teachers do their best to accommodate all students' needs, whether they are in a general physical education class or an adaptive physical education class. The objective is for students to be safe and find success.

Coach Young stated that he takes pride in collaborating to ensure that students are given the most equitable physical education experience. Students with disabilities are first and foremost students—with strengths, interests, personalities, and potential just like their peers. To accommodate students with disabilities, Coach Young discussed how there are equipment modifications, rule modifications and boundary modifications for students to participate and find enjoyment. Throughout the year, students in Coach Young's middle school physical education class have played soccer by using PVC pipe attachments as their legs. These students are in wheelchairs, yet they were able to participate as everyone else. This class also has participated in bowling, skee ball, a fitness circuit, obstacle courses and swimming. The students have said that swimming is their favorite unit. The students had a very fun time with smiles on their faces as they took part in the curling unit. During the curling unit, students started off by using scooters on an 8 foot folding table as a ramp. Since then, the activity has evolved with the use of the 3D printer to produce curling stones and the ramps are now used for rolling and moving the curling stones. Coach Young said, "At the end of the day, my goal is for every student to enjoy movement and know that I care about them." **By Emma Burgess**




Welcome to Addison, Mr. Richer!




