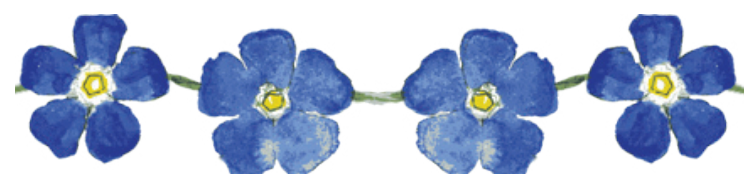

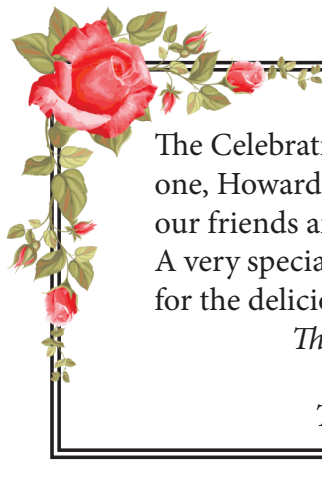

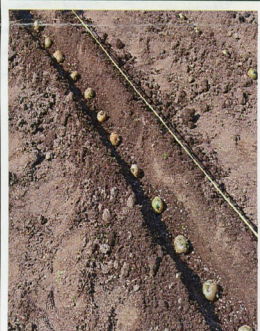

Foliar spray 3-4 oz. **Bug Beater Juice** per gal of water can help to **control insects**. This is a mixture of nutrition and organic insecticides.

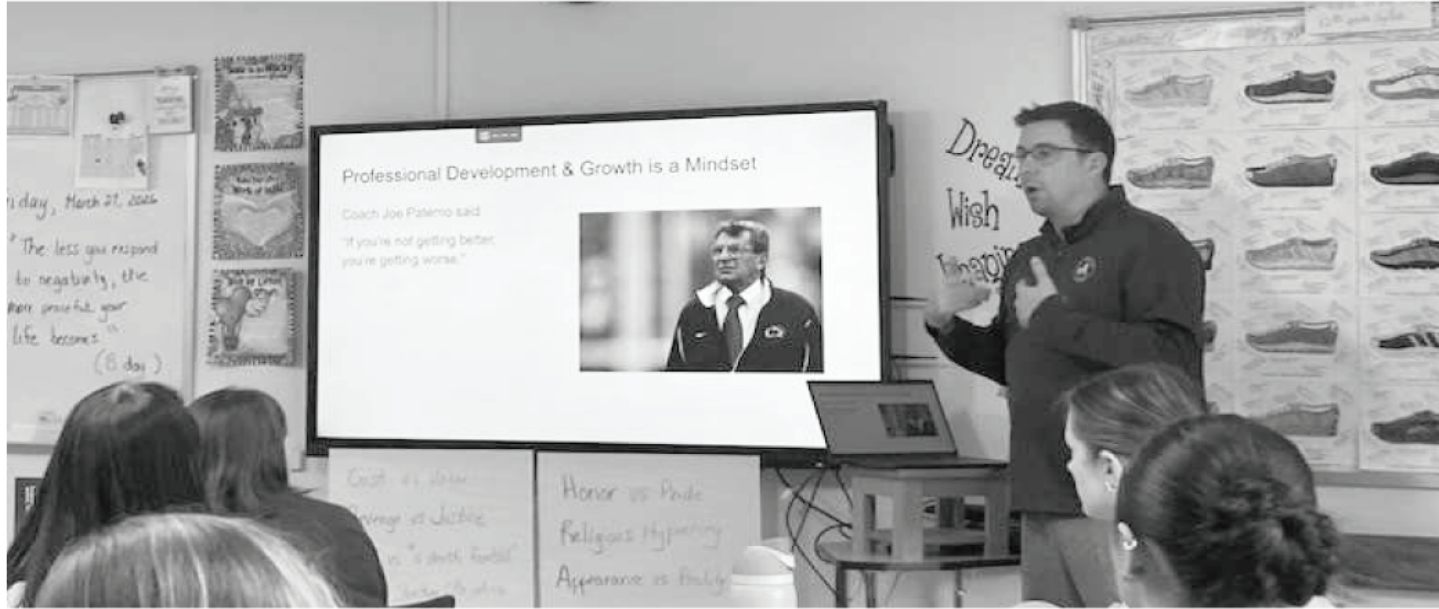

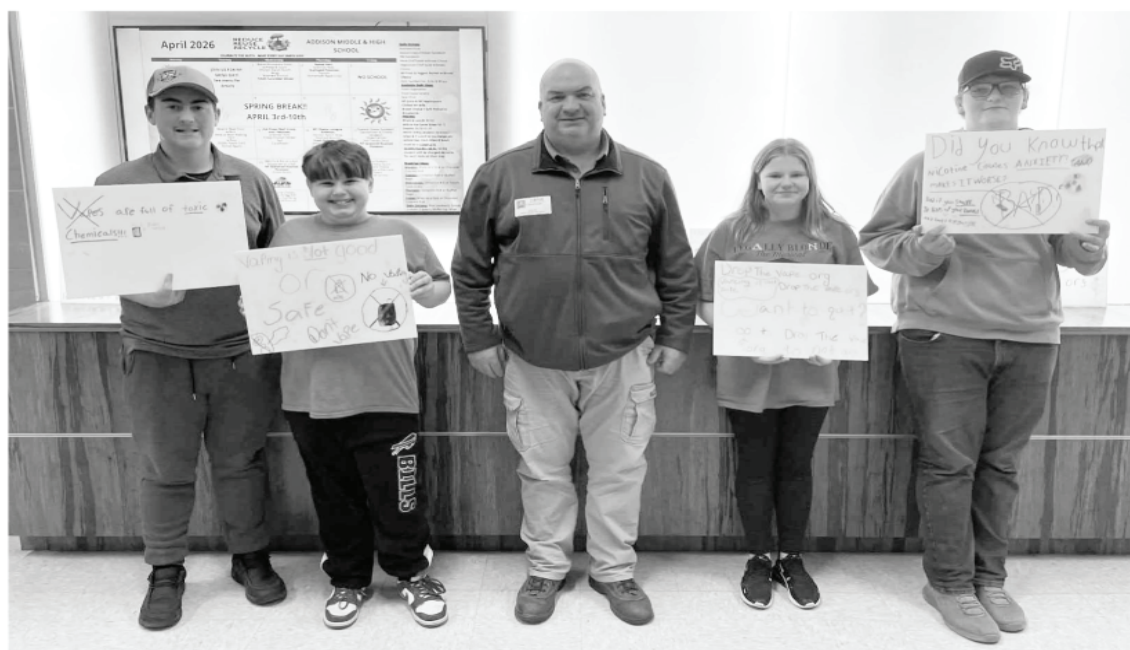


Reality Check Youth Meet with Mayor to Discuss Tobacco Prevention

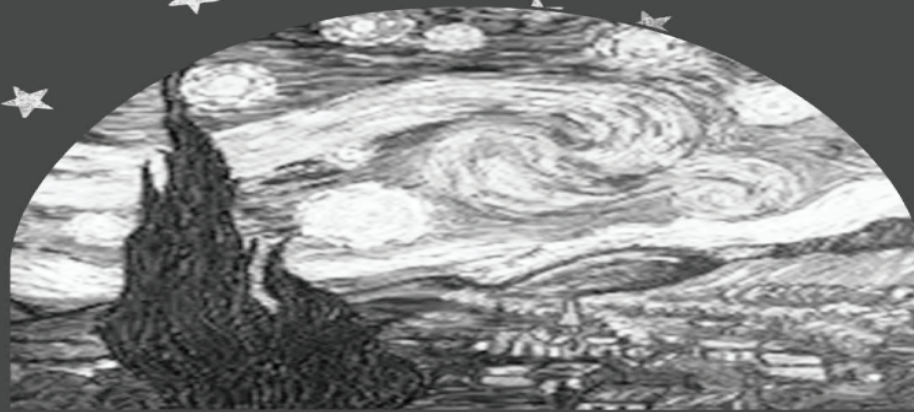

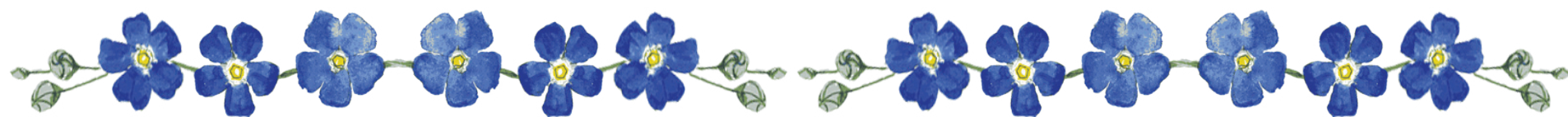
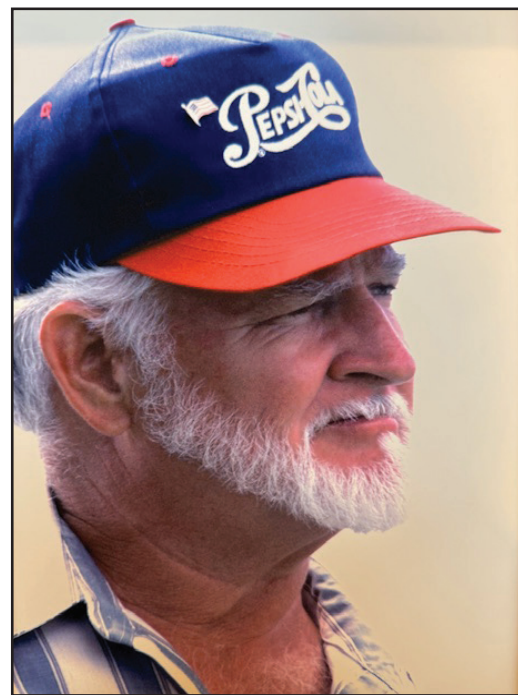

The Village of Addison held its Regular Monthly Board Meeting on Monday, March 9, 2026, at 6:30 p.m. at the Addison Community Center. Mayor Soporowski welcomed the community and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

IN ATTENDANCE: Mayor Ed Soporowski, Trustees Bo Graham, Lorne Hults, Tara Watson, and Village Clerk/Treasurer Donna Taylor. Department Representatives: Fire Chief David Hatch and Code Enforcement Nick Lewis-Nolton. Absent:

Trustee Dennis Rattay, DPW Working Foreman Charles Wright, and Officer-In-Charge Ken Grover.

MEETING MINUTES/DEPARTMENT REPORTS/BILLS: The Board approved meeting minutes for the February 9, 2026, regular monthly board meeting, monthly department reports, and payment of monthly bills.

PUBLIC COMMENT #1: Robert Miles inquired about Crooker's trucking of liquid spread within the village limits. Has anyone questioned the truck weight limit or the potential damage being done to the village roads? Mr. Miles followed up with a complaint he made in the spring of 2025 regarding a commercial business and the noise level it generates. The noise levels are very disturbing to individuals both sitting on their porches and inside their homes. The board was asked to investigate this complaint further. Bruce Vitulli spoke about his attendance at the Town Meeting last week and asked about the status of the Dissolution Study and when the residents would be informed. Bridget Burke asked about the mileage usage reported by the police department and what actions were being taken regarding it.

OLD BUSINESS: The Board of Trustees approved the following items during Old Business: (1) Ratification of the DPW Contract, effective from June 1, 2025, through May 31, 2027, and (2) Retroactive payment for DPW employees for all hours worked from June 1, 2025, to February 22, 2026, as a result of the contract ratification.

NEW BUSINESS: The Board of Trustees approved the following agenda items during New Business: (1) Authorization for the Mayor to execute the Proposed Water Improvement Project Grant Agreement with the NYS EFC and any and all other contracts, documents, and instruments necessary to bring about the project and to fulfill the Village of Addison's obligations under the Grant Agreement. (2) To enter into an agreement with Hillmann to provide asbestos sample testing on the Sewer Plant roof at a cost of \$1,7800. (3) Local Law 1 of 2018 Amendment: Cold War Veterans' Exemption that establishes no time limit for this exemption, effective March 1, 2026. and (4) place on file for public inspection the 2024-2025 External Audit Report.

READ/REVIEW OF LOCAL LAWS: Village Board of Trustees were given the following local laws for a read/review:

Local Law #1-2026: Village Water Department Policy and Local Law #2-2026: Relative to Senior Citizens' Income Limit to qualify for Tax Exemption on Property.

PUBLIC COMMENT #2: Rich Cilino expressed his concerns about the water quality on the south side of the village. Are there other water issues that the village might not be aware of? Should we consider involving the state? Bridget Burke inquired about the election being held on 3/18/2026 – whose seats are up? And who is running?

ADJOURNMENT: The Board adjourned at 7:40 pm.

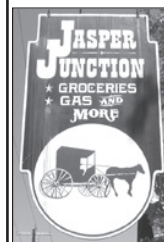
