Twin Rivers CB Club Formed In 1965

Approximately 1965 the Twin River CB Club formed.

They had a couple of acres on Goodhue Hill at Stikers Farm. During the 1972 flood they were a go-to-place. They made Christmas baskets and had Easter egg hunts and much more for the community.

Every first Saturday and Sunday in August every year they had a three-day Country Jamboree and campout. The first couple years local groups from the surrounding areas, with Silly Jim Sutton and Ed Button, host of the entertainment. Campers came in from all over the State's CB enthusiast to camping folks and country music people. By the third year they were able with so many campers and large crowds they brought in WWVA Wheeling West Virginia artists such as Kenny Biggs, Roy Scott, Skinny Clark, Doc and Chickie, Crazy Elmer, Penny DeHaven, Barbara Allen, Betty Amos and Judy Lee, Dick Curlis and others. In the next years as the weekend grew increasingly, they brought in legendary acts from Nashville. Such as Hank Snow, David Frazell, Vern Gosdin, Tex Ritter, Box Car Willie, Mark Chestney, Cheryl Wright, Peggy Wright, Del Reeves, Hank Thompson, Georget Jones, Jet Williams, Gene Watson, Dotty West, Billy Walker and many others. Starting from humble beginnings they bought the hill property approximately 1975. It has approximately 50 camp sites. And now for 61 years they have been trying to hold on. This July 31st and August 1st&2nd will make their 61 years Jamboree on the Hill. They still strive to have a friendly, working campground. Peaceful, yet active, quiet, *Our Happy Place.* (more to come next week! Keep watching.)

The library is requesting a budget increase of \$61,409 in the upcoming May 19, 2026 vote. For a property valued at \$100,000, this means an annual increase of only \$1.98 or approximately \$50.21 for the entire year!

Why the Increase Is Needed

NOTICE OF BUDGET HEARING AND VOTE JASPER-TROUPSBURG CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

Budget Hearing

A budget hearing for the qualified voters of the Jasper-Troupsburg Central School District will be held in the Elementary Cafetorium in Troupsburg at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 12th, 2026 where there shall be presented the proposed School District Budget for the following school year.

Date of Vote

The vote upon the appropriation of the necessary funds to meet the estimated expenditures or for any propositions involving the expenditure of money or the authorizing of levy of taxes, as well as the election of members of the Board of Education shall be held on May 19th, 2026 in the Troupsburg Pre-K Wing Entrance between the hours of 12:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.

Absentee Ballots

Applications for absentee ballots may be applied for at the office of the District Clerk. Applications must be received by the District Clerk at least seven days before the vote set in this notice if the ballot is to be mailed to the absentee voter, or the day before the vote if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the absentee voter. Absentee ballots must be received in the office of the District Clerk not later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of the vote. Military voters who are qualified voters of the School District may apply for a military ballot by requesting an application from the District Clerk. For a military voter to be issued a military ballot, the District Clerk must have received a valid ballot application no later than 4:00 pm on April 22, 2026. In a request for a military ballot application or ballot, the military voter may indicate their preference for receiving the application or ballot by mail, facsimile transmission, or electronic mail. The School District will transmit military ballots to military voters on April 23, 2026. Completed military ballots must be received by the School District by 4:00 p.m. on the day of the vote in order to be counted. A list of all persons to whom absentee voters' ballots have been issued shall be available for public inspection by contacting the District Clerk. Any qualified voter, may upon examination of such list, file a written challenge of qualifications as a voter of any person whose name appears on such list, stating the reasons for the challenge. Such written challenge shall be transmitted by the Clerk or designee to the Inspectors of Election on election day.

Statement of Money Required for Next School Year

A copy of the statement of the amount of money which would be required for the next school year for school purposes shall be completed seven days before the budget hearing and may be obtained by any resident of the District by contacting the District Clerk during the period of 14 days immediately before the annual meeting and election between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., except Saturday, Sunday, or holiday.

Vote for Board Members

Petitions nominating candidates for the office of member of the Board of Education must be filed with the District Clerk between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. not later than April 20, 2026. *Each petition must be addressed to the Clerk of the District, be signed by at least 25 qualified voters of the District, shall state the residence of each signer, and the name and address of the candidate. Vacancies upon the Board shall not be considered separate specific offices. The individuals receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected to the vacancies in the following order:*

A five-year term ending June 30, 2031 presently held by Dylan Price

A five-year term ending June 30, 2031 presently held by Laura Eggleston

Propositions

The following propositions shall be voted upon at the same time as the vote upon the appropriation of monies and for Board members:
Shall the Board of Education of the Jasper-Troupsburg Central School District be authorized to purchase and expend an amount not to exceed the estimated maximum cost of \$270,000, including costs incidental thereto, the following motor vehicles: one (1) 2026 or newer 60 passenger school bus, two (2) 2022 or newer 66 passenger school buses with funds from the 2022 Capital Reserve Funds?

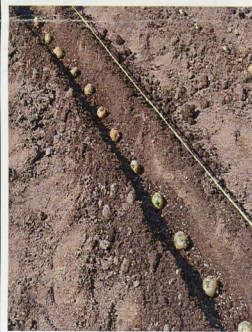

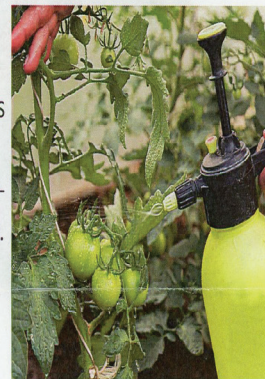

SUMMARY OF THE VILLAGE OF ADDISON PROPOSED DISSOLUTION PLAN AND

VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES PUBLIC HEARING VILLAGE OF ADDISON PROPOSED DISSOLUTION PLAN

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Village of Addison Board of Trustees endorsed a Village of Addison Proposed Dissolution Plan on April 29, 2026. This document is available for the public to view at the Addison Village Clerk’s Office located at 35 Tuscarora St., Addison, New York 14801, on the Village website at <https://www.villageofaddisonny.gov/> and on the project website: <https://labergegroup.com/addison/>.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that the Village of Addison Board of Trustees has called for a public hearing on the Proposed Dissolution Plan for **Monday June 8, 2026 at 6 p.m.** at a special meeting of the Board to be held at the **Addison Community Center, 13 Community Drive, Addison, New York 14801.** The purpose of this hearing is to provide the public the opportunity to provide comments on the Proposed Dissolution Plan. After the public hearing, the Village Board may amend and adopt a Final Plan of Dissolution or may opt to stop the process. If the Final Plan is adopted, the Village Board of Trustees shall contemporaneously with the adoption of the Final Plan set a date for a referendum on dissolution.

SUMMARY OF THE PROPOSED PLAN outlines possible impacts of dissolution should the Village voters elect to dissolve the Village of Addison and be governed by the Town of Addison. The proposed date of dissolution is December 31, 2027.

- The elimination of all existing Village governance structures, including the Village Mayor, the Board of Trustees and all departments.
- The Town Board would assume all governance responsibilities for the area currently known as the Village.
- Loss of the Police Department. The Town does not plan to create a Town police department.
- Village public works functions, including water and sewer, would be provided by an expanded Town Highway Department.
- The Town of Addison would create a Hamlet Water District and a Hamlet Sewer District with boundaries the same as the current Village. The cost for water and sewer services, including debt service, would be a charge upon the users of the water and sewer districts.
- The Town would create a Hamlet Fire Protection District and a Hamlet Lighting /district both with boundaries the same as the Village to provide fire protection services and street lighting respectfully and make the costs a charge the properties within the Districts for those services.
- Village local laws, including Village zoning, may continue for up to two years post dissolution; however, within those two years, the Town’s plan is to evaluate the local laws and decide whether to adopt, repeal or amend the Village laws. At the end of two years, any Village laws, not adopted or integrated into Town laws shall be deemed repealed.
- The Town would establish a Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals post dissolution and would create a part-time code enforcement officer to enforce Zoning and other municipal code enforcement responsibilities. Enforcement of the NYS Uniform Code would be assumed by Steuben County.
- The Town will increase the Town Clerk and Bookkeeper positions full-time to handle the increased volume of administrative duties.
- The proposed Plan transfers all Village assets including but not limited to the water plant, sewer transfer station, the community center, Fire House 1, public works garage, parks, public spaces, vehicles and equipment to the Town for continued public use with the following exceptions. The Village would sell Village Hall, police vehicles and equipment and other miscellaneous equipment. The net proceeds of the sales of the real property and equipment would be used to offset Village liabilities.
- Outstanding Village liabilities would be a charge upon the taxpayers of the Village.
- The Town would receive an annual New York State Citizen Empowerment Tax Credit (CETC) equivalent to 15% of the combined Village and Town levies in the year prior to dissolution estimated to be \$167,790. A minimum of 70% must be applied for property tax reduction.
- It is projected that Village property tax payers would see a reduction in their combined Village and Town property taxes as follows: Village property taxpayers would experience an approximate 39% reduction in their combined Village and Town taxes before application of the CETC, an approximate 46% reduction with 70% CETC application and an approximate 49% reduction with 100% of the CETC applied to offset taxes.

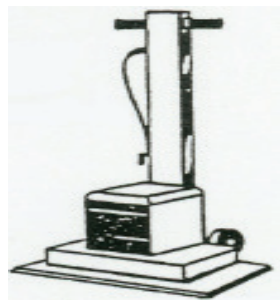

Addison 2026-2027 School Budget

In early February, Mr. Peiffer, Superintendent, and Mr. Everly, Executive Director of Finance and Operations, were interviewed to discuss the upcoming school budget in the interest of transparency. Each November, the budgeting process begins and extends to the budget vote in May of the current school year. Due to this deadline and to be best prepared, the process begins with asking general questions and trying to be ahead of upcoming costs. The budget is also discussed at every board meeting from January to May.

Creating the budget is especially challenging due to rising costs for essential school needs while also ensuring money remains in savings. Another main priority for the school is maintaining people and programs that have been expected by the community and allow for growth, especially BOCES. Maintaining the valuable programs that we have in the district and prioritizing the "people" is the ultimate priority when planning a school district budget. The biggest increase in district expenses is the 30% increase in health insurance premiums followed by the skyrocketing energy (electric and natural gas) costs.

A big change pricewise for the upcoming school years budgets is the Zero emission bus law starting in the 27-28 school year. Electric buses are double the price of a diesel bus and when we need to switch, we will most likely need at least 18 more buses and drivers based on ZEB range estimates. The law currently states that by 2035, schools must have all electric buses.

This year the district is proposing a budget of \$38,941,581 and a 1.75 percent increase in tax levy for the 26-27 school year. This is \$2 million or 5.59 percent increase for the upcoming budget which is caused by the continued increase in pricing however it is anticipated that there will be a decrease in the tax rate for the thirteenth consecutive year, this year alone the tax rate decreased by more than 4 percent.

There will be a budget hearing on May 12th. The information is also stated in the budget newsletter, which will be published and distributed to the community. The voting numbers in the last several years has decreased. Less than 10% of people vote on the budget. The budget vote is May 19th from noon to 8:30 P.M. and anyone who is eligible to vote is encouraged to attend. By Peyton Hager

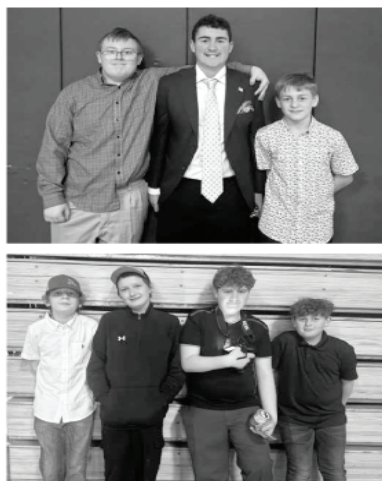

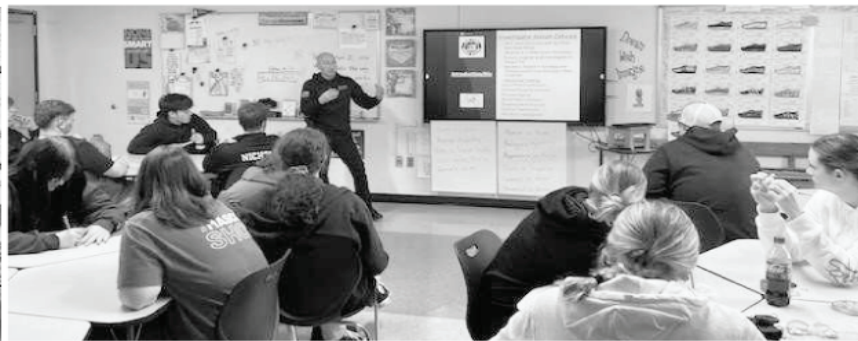
