Annual Water Quality Report for 2025

Village of Addison - 35 Tuscarora Street - Addison, N.Y. 14801 • Public Water Supply ID #NY 5001203

Introduction

To comply with State and Federal regulations, the Village of Addison will be annually issuing a report describing the quality of your drinking water. The purpose of this report is to raise your understanding of drinking water and awareness of the need to protect our drinking water sources. Last year, your tap water met all state drinking water health standards. We are proud to report that our system has never violated a maximum containment level or any other water quality statement. This report provides an overview of last year's water quality. Included are details about where your water comes from, what it contains, and how it compares to state standards. If you have any questions about this report or concerning your drinking water, please contact Charles Wright, Water Systems Operator, at 607-359-3892. We want you to be informed about your drinking water. If you want to learn more, please attend any of our regularly scheduled village board meetings. Meetings are normally held on the second Monday of the month at the Community Center, starting at 6:30 p.m. You may also stop at the Public Works Building on 70 Steuben Street and direct any questions you have to Charles.

Where does our water come from?

In general, the sources of drinking water (both tap and bottled water) include rivers, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activities. Contaminants that may be present in source water include microbial contaminants, inorganic contaminants, and radioactive contaminants. In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the state and the EPA prescribe regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. The State Health Department's and the FDA's regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health. Our water source is three groundwater wells less than 100 ft. deep. Two are located in the center of the village and the other is on the western edge of the village. Two of your water well's are treated with sodium hypochlorite prior to entering the distribution system. The third well is a filtration plant which is treated with potassium permanganate and sodium hypochlorite prior to entering the distribution system. At present time, our water system has 589 service connections, which serve water to around 1,800 people. In 2025, our water system pumped 52.0 million gallons of water, which equals about an average of 4.3 million gallons a month. This is 700,000 gallons more per month than last year. Average water metered by the system per month is 3.0 million gallons. This is 100,000 gal per month more than last year. About 30% of the water pumped in 2025 was not metered. (note that about 10% of unmetered water is used for fire protection, hydrant flushing, street cleaning and bulk water sales). Also, we used about 1.5% = .750 million gallons of unmetered water in 2025 to backwash filters at the filtration plant. Total unaccounted water is 18%.

A Source Water Assessment Summary will be included when the data is available from the NYS Department of Health.

Are there contaminants in our drinking water?

As the state regulations require, we routinely test your drinking water for numerous contaminants. These contaminants include total coliform, inorganic compounds, nitrate, nitrite, lead and copper, volatile organic compounds, total trihalomethanes, and synthetic organic compounds. The table presented below depicts which compounds were detected in your drinking water. The state allows us to test for some contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants do not change frequently. Some of our data, though representative, is more than one year old. It should be noted that all drinking water, including bottled water, might be reasonably expected to contain at least a small amount of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791), or the New York State Health Department (607-324-8371).

Lead: Lead can cause serious health effects in people of all ages, especially pregnant people, infants (both formula-fed and breastfed), and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and parts used in service lines and in home plumbing. The Village of Addison Water Department is responsible for providing high-quality drinking water and removing lead pipes but cannot control the variety of materials used in the plumbing in your home. Because lead levels may vary over time, lead exposure is possible even when your tap sampling results do not detect lead at one point in time. You can help protect yourself and your family by identifying and removing lead materials within your home plumbing and taking steps to reduce your family's risk. Using a filter certified by an American National Standards Institute-accredited certifier to reduce lead is effective in reducing lead exposures. Follow the instructions provided with the filter to ensure the filter is used properly. Use only cold water for drinking, cooking, and making baby formula. Boiling water does not remove lead from water. Before using tap water for drinking, cooking, or making baby formula, flush your pipes for several minutes. You can do this by running your tap, taking a shower, doing laundry or a load of dishes. If you have a lead service line or galvanized requiring replacement service line, you may need to flush your pipes for a longer period. If you are concerned about lead in your water and wish to have your water tested, contact Charles Wright at the Water Department or DPW at (607)359-3892. Radon: is a naturally occurring radioactive gas found in soil & outdoor air that may also be found in drinking water and indoor air. Some people exposed to elevated radon levels over many years in drinking water may have an increased risk of getting cancer. The main risk is lung cancer from radon entering indoor air from soils under homes. For additional information, call your state radon program @ 800-458-1158 or call the EPA's Radon Hotline @ 800-SOS-Radon.

2 - The level presented is the 90th percentile of the (0.192) 10 sites tested. A percentile is a value on a scale of 100 that indicates the percent measurements that is equal to or below it. This means in our system, copper levels in (0.054-0.23) for 10 sites are below the 90th percentile value. The action level for copper was not exceeded at any of the sites tested.

3 - The level presented in the 90th percentile of the (2.3) 10 sites tested, the action level for lead was not exceeded at any of the sites tested.

A Lead Service Line (LSL) is defined as any portion of pipe that is made of lead which connects the water to the main building inlet. An LSL may be owned by the water system, owned by the property owner, or both. The inventory includes both portable and non-potable SLs within a system. In accordance with the federal Lead and Copper Rule Revisions (LCRR) our system has started preparing a lead service line inventory and have made it publicly accessible by contacting Water System Operator Charles Wright.

***Coliforms:** Bacteria that are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially harmful bacteria may be present. If Coliform bacteria were found in routine monthly samples, four or five additional samples would be subsequently collected within 24 hours and samples.

Definitions:

MCL-Maximum Contaminant Level, the "maximum allowed" MCL is the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

MCLG-Maximum Contaminant Level Goal, the MCLG is the level of contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

Mrem/yr- Millirems per year - measure of radiation absorbed by the body.

ppm- Parts Per Million, one part per million corresponds to one minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000.

ppb-Parts Per Billion, one part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2000 years or a single penny in \$10,000,000.

mg/l-Milligrams per liter corresponds to one minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000.

AL-Action Level -The concentration of a contaminant which if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirement which a water system must follow.

ug/l-Micrograms per liter (equivalent to parts per billion).

TTHM-Total Trihalomethanes

MRDL-Maximum residual disinfectant level - The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that the addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

MRDLG - Maximum residential disinfectant level goal - The level of drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLG's do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contamination.

What does this information mean?

As you can see by the above table, our system had no MCL violations in 2025. We have learned through our testing that some contaminants have been detected. However, these contaminants were detected below the level allowed by the state.

Is our water system meeting other rules that govern operations?

During 2025, our water system was in compliance with all other State Drinking Water requirements. During 2025 our water system had its highest chlorine residual of 1.39 mg/l on 9/2/25 and the system had its lowest chlorine residual of 0.28 mg/l on 3/4/25. Both of these residuals are within the state range of 0.2-4.0 mg/l.

Do I need to take special precautions?

Although our drinking water met or exceeded state and federal regulations, some people may be more vulnerable to disease-causing microorganisms and pathogens in drinking water than the general population. Immunocompromised persons, such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants, can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice from their health care provider about their drinking water. EPA/CDD guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by cryptosporidium, giardia, and other microbial pathogens are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791)

Students Have a Virtual Reality Experience

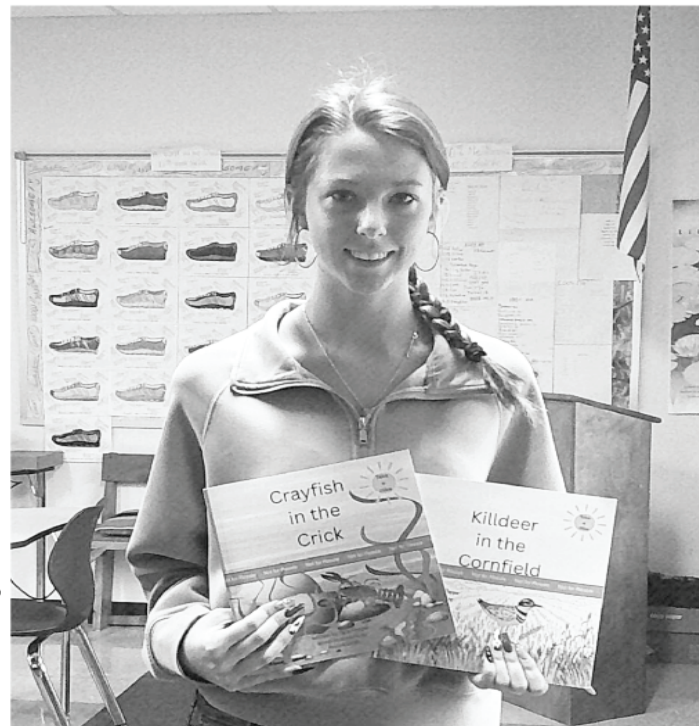
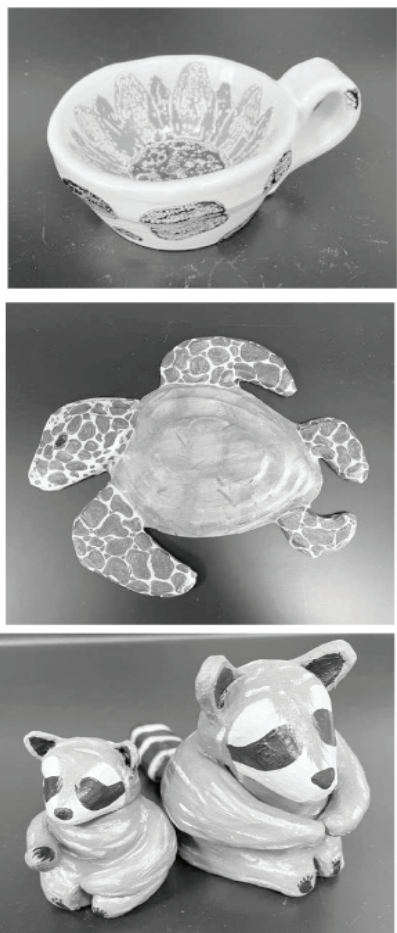

Trust Him Job 1:21; 19:25

We couldn't stop thanking God after we heard the good news. Our Brother-In-Christ and friend, Mark Walker, had walked dangerously near the precipice of death for so long. Finally, the hospital called, and Mark and his wife raced through the night to get a lifesaving liver transplant.

There is quite a backstory here. Mark is the pastor of a small but vibrant church outside Greenwood, New York. Pastor Mark had been wrestling with a failing liver for quite some time. With great patience, he and his wife waited for a liver transplant. As his health deteriorated, he would sometimes call on me to preach when he was too ill do so.

I was impressed by his and his family's steadfast trust in God.

Just a few weeks prior to the transplant, Mark and Marty had been rushed to the hospital to receive a liver. However, when they were only two hours away from the hospital, the doctor disqualified the organ. I could not imagine the disappointment, yet I learned that Mark's next sermon was on the promises of God. He would continue to trust God, transplant or not, and was heard saying, "God will heal me...He will either heal me on earth or heal me in heaven." Like the biblical story of suffering in Job, Mark sought God's will to be done, no matter what.

When we have this kind of faith – in God's will – we really cannot lose. To trust God to wake up with a new liver or wake up in heaven is beyond me. It's beyond all of us. I know Mark and his family well enough to say this: they give the glory to God for all this.

They would say it is not their trust in God that brought this about; rather, it is how great God is. Indeed, we serve a wonderful Savior. No wonder Job said, even while he suffered, "For I know that my redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth." (Job 19:25).

Friend, this One and Only God is trustworthy. Though above our understanding, His will is perfect and best. I'll be the first to admit that fear can crowd faith in hard times.

Though impossible on our own (Luke 1:37; John 15:5), God can help us place our hand in his... and hold on. Leaning on his everlasting arms, we can say with Job, "... Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return. The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord"(Job 1:21b, ESV). Trust Him.
