Regular Board Meeting Minutes

June 9, 2025

The Village of Addison held its Regular Monthly Board Meeting on Monday, June 9, 2025, at 6:30 p.m. at the Addison Community Center. Mayor Soporowski welcomed the community and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

IN ATTENDANCE: Mayor Ed Soporowski, Trustees Lorne Hults, Bo Graham, Tara Watson, and Village Clerk/Treasurer Donna Taylor. Department Representative: Officer in Charge Ken Grove, Fire Department Chief David Hatch, and Code Enforcement Officer Nick Lewis-Nolton. Trustee Dennis Rattay and DPW Working Foreman Charles Wright were absent.

MEETING MINUTES/DEPARTMENT REPORTS/BILLS: The Board approved May 12, 2025, Regular Meeting Minutes, Monthly Department Reports, and payment of monthly bills. Guest speaker Kayla Wagner from

Sprague Insurance discussed the Village of Addison’s insurance coverage policy.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Jim Gotshall inquired about the sewer system’s infrastructure and wants to know what is being done to fix it to reduce the amount of water being transported to Erwin. Mr. Gotshall also inquired about the Water Improvement Project bond that is due in September. Derrick Burrell asked if the village is taking any action regarding informing the public about the dissolution study for the village. Jaime Shorthouse-Potts inquired if the village had considered a location for the drop-off clothing shed.

PERSONNEL: The Board of Trustees approved the following Personnel items: Accrual Time Extension for Donna Taylor, 2025-2026 Non-Union hourly rates/salaries, and 2025-2026 elected official salaries, both effective June 1, 2025.

OLD BUSINESS: The Board of Trustees approved the following agenda item during Old Business: (1) Amendment to November 13, 2023, resolution changing the length of the chain link fence from 100 ft to 135 ft along the property lines of the municipal lot and 45 Main St. (2) Awarding the bid for installing a 6’ chain link fence on the property line of the municipal lot and 45 Main St. to Dewalt & Sons Contracting, LLC. and (3) the approval of the Whistleblower Protection Policy, Cybersecurity Incident Response Policy, Communication and Social Media Policy, Breach Notification Policy, and Technology Acceptable Use Policy.

NEW BUSINESS: The Board of Trustees approved the following agenda items during New Business: (1) Approval for Mayor Soporowski to enter into the following contracts: Harter, Secrest & Emery for legal counsel services and Southern Tier Regional Planning & Development Board for professional planning assistance, and (2) the reading of Local Law 1 of 2025 ~ Village of June 30, 2025 @ 6:00 P.M.

REVIEW/DISCUSSION: The following policies were presented for 1st Reading: Workplace Violence, Sexual Harassment, Data Privacy Policy, Environmental Sustainability, Equal Employment Opportunity, and Workplace Safety Policy.

ADJOURNMENT: The Board adjourned at 7:15 P.M.

PUBLIC NOTICE VILLAGE OF ADDISON

NOTICE IS GIVEN, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Addison, Steuben County, New York (the “Village”), at a regular meeting held on July 14, 2025, duly adopted, subject to a permissive referendum, a resolution, an abstract of which is set forth below:

In accordance with the New York State Village Law, such resolution will take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption, unless prior to the close of such thirty (30) day period there is filed with the Village Clerk a petition, subscribed and acknowledged by at least twenty percent (20%) qualified electors of the Village, as shown on the Village’s register of electors for the last general Village election, protesting against such resolution and requesting that it be submitted for approval or disapproval by the qualified electors of the Village. If such a qualifying petition is filed, a proposition for approval of the resolution shall be submitted at a special election held not less than ten (10) and not more than sixty (60) days after the filing of such petition.

Such Resolution was entitled:

AMENDED AND RESTATED BOND RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ADDISON, STEUBEN COUNTY, NEW YORK (THE “VILLAGE”), AMENDING AND RESTATING IN ITS ENTIRETY A BOND RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE DATED OCTOBER 12, 2021, AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE TO UNDERTAKE CERTAIN WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS; STATING THE MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST THEREOF IS \$2,283,000; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$2,283,000 IN SERIAL BONDS OF THE VILLAGE TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION

Such resolution amends and restates in its entirety a prior bond resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village on October 12, 2021 (the “Original Bond Resolution”), which authorized the issuance of serial bonds of the Village in the principal amount of \$1,690,000 to undertake certain water system improvements as set forth in an engineering report entitled “Village of Addison Water System Study” dated January 2019 and revised October 2020, as prepared by Larson Design Group, the Village’s engineers (the “Engineer’s Report”) and on file in the office of the Village Clerk, incorporating certain technological changes and describing upgrades and improvements to be constructed, reconstructed and installed for the Village’s water system, including all related, ancillary and appurtenant facilities, improvements, equipment, machinery and apparatus, and all planning, design, engineering, legal and permitting costs in connection therewith and the financing thereof (the “Project”), which amendment and restatement is being undertaken for the purpose of (i) increasing the maximum estimated cost of the Project from \$1,690,000 to \$2,283,000 (including increasing the amount of serial bonds authorized in connection therewith); (ii) appropriating said increased amount; and (iii) restating the plan of finance set forth therein. An abstract of such bond resolution, concisely stating the purpose and effect thereof, being as follows:

1. The Village is authorized to undertake the Project as further described in the Engineer’s Report, at a total estimated maximum cost not to exceed \$2,283,000.
2. The Village is authorized to issue \$2,283,000 principal amount of serial bonds (including, without limitation, statutory installment bonds) and bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the “Law”) and to finance the Project.
3. It is determined that the maximum aggregate cost of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is \$2,283,000, said amount was appropriated therefore and the plan for the financing thereof shall consist of (i) the issuance of up to \$2,283,000 in serial bonds of the Village, or bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds, authorized to be issued pursuant to Section 2 of this resolution, (ii) the application of grant monies expected to be received by the Village from the State of New York Environmental Facilities Corporation, including Drinking Water State Revolving Fund and Water Infrastructure Improvement Act grants to either directly pay or reimburse a portion of the cost of the Project and/or to repay a portion of any such bond anticipation notes issued under the authority of this resolution, (iii) to the extent necessary, the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the Village to pay the principal of said bonds or bond anticipation notes and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.
4. It is determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforementioned specific object or purpose is forty (40) years, pursuant to subdivision 1 of paragraph (a.) of Section 11.00 of the Law.
5. The final maturity of the bonds herein authorized to be issued shall be in excess of five (5) years measured from the date of issuance of the first serial bond or bond anticipation note issued pursuant to the resolution.
6. The temporary use of available funds of the Village, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Law, for the capital purposes described in the resolution. The Village shall reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by the resolution. The resolution shall constitute a declaration of “official intent” to reimburse the expenditures authorized herein with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein, as required by United States Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.
7. Said bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes shall be general obligations of the Village; and the Village has pledged its faith and credit to the payment of the principal of and interest of said bonds.
8. The Board of Trustees delegated to the Village Treasurer, as chief fiscal officer of the Village, the powers and duties relating to the authorization and issuance of said bonds, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, or the renewals thereof, the determination of the terms, form and contents thereof and the execution of all applications, agreements and instruments necessary to effect the issuance of said bonds or bond anticipation notes.
9. The Village Treasurer is authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by the resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “Code”) and to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, if applicable, as “qualified tax-exempt bonds” in accordance with Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i) of the Code.
10. The Village Treasurer is further authorized to enter into a continuing disclosure undertaking with or for the benefit of the initial purchasers of the bonds or notes in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12, promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.
11. The bond resolution was determined to be subject to permissive referendum.

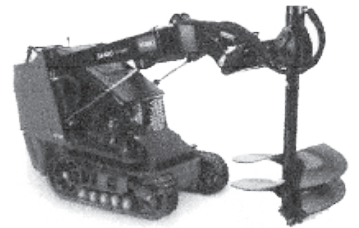

SECOND: STATING that the estimated maximum cost thereof, including certain preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$410,000; appropriating said amount for such purpose; and STATING that the plan of financing includes the issuance of bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$410,000 to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the Town to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable; and STATING that the Town has applied for financing through the USDA Rural Development, Community Facilities Loan Program and the financing may be provided through said program or from other financing sources, and that any grant funds received by the Town in connection with the acquisition of the road grader shall be used to pay all or a part of the cost thereof, and the principal amount of bonds or notes issued pursuant to this resolution shall be reduced by a like amount;

THIRD: DETERMINING and STATING the period of probable usefulness applicable to the purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued is fifteen (15) years; the proceeds of said bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation thereof may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this bond resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized; and the proposed maturity of said bonds will exceed five (5) years;

FOURTH: DETERMINING that said bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes shall be general obligations of the Town; and PLEDGING to their payment the faith and credit of the Town;

FIFTH: DELEGATING to the Supervisor the powers and duties as to the issuance of said bonds, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, or the renewals thereof;

SIXTH: STATING the conditions under which the validity of the bonds and any notes issued in anticipation thereof may be contested; and referendum.

SEVENTH: DETERMINING that the bond resolution is subject to a permissive referendum.
