Interesting Facts About The Constitution

*Writing of the Constitution: The Constitutional Convention took place in Philadelphia from May 25 to September 17, 1787. James Madison, often called the "Father of the Constitution", played a significant role in drafting the document.

The original purpose of the convention was to revise the Articles of Confederation, but they decided to create a new Constitution instead. *Signing of the Constitution: On September 17, 1787, 39 of the 55 delegates present signed the final draft of the Constitution at Independence

Hall. Benjamin Franklin, at 81 years old, was the oldest delegate to sign the Constitution, while Jonathan Dayton, at 26 years old, was the youngest. * Radification: The Constitution needed to be ratified by nine states to become effective.

The first state to ratify the Constitution was Delaware on December 7, 1787. The ninth state to ratify was New Hampshire, which occurred on June 21, 1788, making the Constitution official.

- * Amendments: The first ten amendments to the Constitution are known as the Bill of Rights, which were added in 1791 to protect individual I iberties. The process of amending the Constitution is laid out in Article V and requires a proposal by two-thirds of both houses of Congress or a national convention called for two-thirds of the state legislatures. To become part of the Constitution, an amendment must be ratified by three-fourths
- of the state legislatures or conventions. * The Preamble: The opening lines of the Constitution are known as the Preamble, which outlines the purpose and goals of the document. It starts
- with the famous phrase: "We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union..." * Influences from other documents: The Constitution drew inspiration from various sources, including the Magna Carta, the English Bill of Rights, and the writings of philosophers like John Locke and Montesquieu.
- *Federalist Papers: The Federalist Papers, a series of essays written by Alexander Hamilton, James Madison, and John Jay, were influential in
- advocating for the ratification of the Constitution. * Longevity and influence: The United States Constitution is the oldest written national constitution still in use globally. Its model of separation of
- powers and checks and balances has been adopted by numerous other countries in their governing documents. ratified in 1992, over two centuries after it was proposed.

* Modern-day amendments: The most recent amendment to the Constitution is the 27th Amendment, which deals with congressional pay and was







PUBLIC NOTICE VILLAGE OF ADDISON

NOTICE IS GIVEN, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Addison, Steuben County, New York (the "Village"), at a regular meeting held on September 8, 2025, duly adopted, subject to a permissive referendum, a resolution, an abstract of which is set forth below:

In accordance with the New York State Village Law, such resolution will take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption, unless prior to the close of such thirty (30) day period there is filed with the Village Clerk a petition, subscribed and acknowledged by at least twenty percent (20%) qualified electors of the Village, as shown on the Village's register of electors for the last general Village election, protesting against such resolution and requesting that it be submitted for approval or disapproval by the qualified electors of the Village. If such a qualifying petition is filed, a proposition for approval of the resolution shall be submitted at a special election held not less than ten (10) and not more than sixty (60) days after the filing of such petition.

Such Resolution was entitled:

SECOND AMENDED AND RESTATED BOND RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ADDISON, STEUBEN COUNTY, NEW YORK, AMENDING AND RESTATING IN ITS ENTIRETY A BOND RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE DATED OCTOBER 12, 2021, AS PREVIOUSLY AMENDED BY A RESOLUTION DATED JULY 14, 2025, AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE TO UNDERTAKE CERTAIN WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS; STATING THE MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST THEREOF IS \$2,462,200; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$2,462,200 IN SERIAL BONDS OF THE VILLAGE TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION

Such resolution amends and restates in its entirety a prior bond resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village on October 12, 2021, which resolution was amended and restated by a resolution dated July 14, 2025, which authorized the issuance of serial bonds of the Village in the principal amount of \$2,283,000 to undertake water system improvements pursuant an engineering report entitled "Village of Addison Water System Study" dated January 2019 and revised October 2020, as prepared by Larson Design Group, the Village's engineers, and on file in the office of the Village Clerk, incorporating certain technological changes and describing upgrades and improvements to be constructed, reconstructed and installed for the Village's water system, including all related, ancillary and appurtenant facilities, improvements, equipment, machinery and apparatus,

and all planning, design, engineering, legal and permitting costs in connection therewith and the financing thereof (the "Project"), which amendment and restatement is being undertaken for the purpose of (i) increasing the maximum estimated cost of the Project from \$2,283,000 to \$2,462,200 (including increasing the amount of serial bonds authorized in connection therewith), (ii) appropriating said increased amount, and (iii) restating the plan of finance set forth therein.

An abstract of such bond resolution, concisely stating the purpose and effect thereof, being as follows:

- 1. The Village is authorized to undertake the Project as further described in the Engineer's Report, at a total estimated maximum cost not to exceed \$2,462,200
- 2. The Village is authorized to issue \$2,462,200 principal amount of serial bonds (including, without limitation, statutory installment bonds) and bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law") and to finance the Project.
- 3. It is determined that the maximum aggregate cost of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is \$2,462,200, said amount was appropriated therefore and the plan for the financing thereof shall consist of (i) the issuance of up to \$2,462,200 in serial bonds of the Village, or bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds, authorized to be issued pursuant to Section 2 of this resolution, (ii) the application of grant monies expected to be received by the Village from the State of New York Environmental Facilities Corporation, including Drinking Water State Revolving Fund and Water Infrastructure Improvement Act grants to either directly pay or reimburse a portion of the cost of the Project and/or to repay a portion of any such bond anticipation notes issued under the authority of this resolution, (iii) to the extent necessary, the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the Village to pay the principal of said bonds or bond anticipation notes and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.
- 4. It is determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforementioned specific object or purpose is forty (40) years, pursuant to subdivision 1 of paragraph (a.) of Section 11.00 of the Law.
- 5. The final maturity of the bonds herein authorized to be issued shall be in excess of five (5) years measured from the date of issuance of the first serial bond or bond anticipation note issued pursuant to the resolution.
- 6. The temporary use of available funds of the Village, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Law, for the capital purposes described in the resolution. The Village shall reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by the resolution. The resolution shall constitute a declaration of "official intent" to reimburse the expenditures authorized herein with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein, as required by United States Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.
- 7. Said bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes shall be general obligations of the Village; and the Village has pledged its faith and credit to the payment of the principal of and interest of said bonds.

The Village Treasurer is authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by the resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, if applicable, as "qualified tax-exempt bonds" in accordance with Section 265(b)(3) (B)(i) of the Code.
- (B)(i) of the Code.

 10. The Village Treasurer is further authorized to enter into a continuing disclosure undertaking with or for the benefit of the initial purchasers of the bonds or notes in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12, promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the
- Securities Exchange Act of 1934. 11. The bond resolution was determined to be subject to permissive referendum.


Welcome to Addison, Mrs. McCaig Mrs. McCaig is our new special






