We have exciting and incredible news to share! The Alden Balch Memorial Library has received a bequest of more than \$150,000 from Bonnie and Nils Seastrand of Fairfield, Connecticut. The Lunenburg Elementary School also received the same bequest.

Bonnie died February 16, 2024. She and her husband, Nils, who predeceased her in 2021, owned land on Bobbin Mill Road for more than 40 years. Bonnie attended college in Vermont, and her grandparents eventually moved to Vermont. The obituary for Nils noted that, "the love for his very special Vermont will stay alive in him forever."

The bequest to Lunenburg Elementary School is designated specifically to support scientific education. The gift to the Alden Balch Memorial Library came without restrictions; the Library Board of Trustees has voted to add the funds to its endowment account, strengthening its ability to serve the community for generations to come.

We are so very grateful for the generosity of this amazing couple.

Congratulations Hailey. Troop 30356 is so proud of you.




