Please register by August 23rd to help us prepare class rosters and materials.

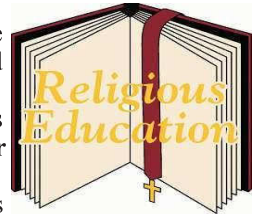

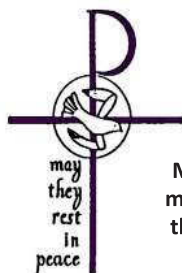

Father Jake's Column

Becoming Household Makers

Principle #1: Make Household-Making a Priority

(Inspired by The Intentional Household: Living as if People Matter by Dr. John Cuddeback)

No one else is going to make your household a priority. In fact, there are many forces at work drawing us away from it. Work, school, sports, entertainment, technology, and countless other commitments compete for our time and attention. Left to itself, a household does not simply happen—it must be intentionally built.

The good news is that reclaiming the household as the place of intentional formation and as the domestic church is within our power. It begins with a simple decision: *Yes, our household will be a priority.* Like anything worthwhile, it requires time, sacrifice, and perseverance.

The first defining characteristic of a household is not the house itself, but the relationships within it. From the very moment we are conceived, we are received into relationships. Relationship is not something added to our humanity; it belongs to who we are. Yet our culture often teaches us to see life primarily through the lens of the individual—*my* success, *my* happiness, *my* story. The home can easily become nothing more than the place where individuals eat, sleep, recharge, and then head back out to pursue their own lives.

But that is not what a household is meant to be.

A household is about *our* story. It is a community of persons learning to live together and build a shared culture. Every family has its own traditions, rhythms, and memories. These are not accidental. They are formed by intentionally sharing life together.

Perhaps some of the ordinary activities that once filled family life disappeared because technology made them unnecessary. But perhaps they also disappeared because we forgot how well they fit our humanity. Preparing meals, telling stories, playing games, and simply enjoying one another's company were never just ways of passing time. They were ways of building relationships.

Perhaps we begin with something every household already does: eating.

Rather than seeing meals as another task to complete, what if we saw them as one of God's daily opportunities to build communion? Food must be procured, prepared, and shared. There are many ways to procure it—gardening, visiting the farmer's market, hunting, or shopping. Preparing it invites participation. One person chops vegetables, another seasons the meat, another sets the table, and even the youngest children can wash produce or place the liturgical color napkins at each setting. In the end, everyone has contributed to something that belongs to the whole household.

Now, before you think I've become unrealistic, I'm not suggesting every evening needs to resemble Thanksgiving dinner. Life is busy. But perhaps Sunday—the Lord's Day—can become a day of leisure in the Christian sense: not merely a day off, but a day intentionally spent together. A meal that takes a little more planning, where everyone has a role, becomes more than dinner. It becomes an act of building the household.

So the question remains:

Will your household be a priority?

Adoration Chapel



The **Adoration Chapel** at our parish was established in 1995 under the leadership of Father Raymond Balzer and is located next to the church. It is a sacred space dedicated to silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, providing an opportunity to spend time face-to-face with Jesus in the Eucharist.

In the Adoration Chapel, the consecrated Host—the Body of Christ—is placed in a Monstrance and displayed on the altar for worship and adoration. This beautiful tradition invites us to recognize Christ's Real Presence and to open our hearts to Him in a personal and profound way.



The chapel offers a peaceful, prayerful atmosphere free from the distractions of daily life. During adoration, visitors may kneel or sit quietly as they pray, read Scripture, pray the Rosary, or simply sit in quiet reflection. Our Adoration Chapel is stocked with Bibles and prayer books to assist visitors in their time of prayer, or you are welcome to bring your own spiritual reading or devotional materials.

Because the Eucharist is exposed and must never be left unattended, the Adoration Chapel relies on dedicated "committed adorers" who volunteer for a one-hour weekly time slot. Schedulers strive to have three adorers, from different households, assigned to each hour in case someone is ill or unable to fulfill their commitment.

We invite you to discover the peace, comfort, and spiritual renewal that come from spending quiet time in the presence of our Lord. If you feel called to become a committed adorer by taking a weekly hour, please contact one of the schedulers using the phone numbers listed below. 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A 12-Day Pilgrimage to the Shrines & Cathedrals of France

Day 1: Friday, November 5, 2027

Depart via scheduled air service to Paris

Day 2: Saturday, November 6: Paris

Upon arrival in Paris, meet your Faith Journeys Tour Manager, who will assist the group to the awaiting chartered motorcoach for a panoramic tour of Paris to see the Eiffel Tower, L'Arc de Triomphe, and Champs-Élysées. We will also see the Basilica of the Sacred Heart (Sacré-Coeur) Depending on timing – attend Mass at Sacré Coeur (6 pm public mass in French). Late afternoon check-in at the hotel. Evening Welcome Dinner and overnight

Day 3: Sunday, November 7: Paris

Attend Mass at the Chapel of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal, site of three apparitions of the Virgin Mary in 1830. Visit the Tomb of St. Vincent de Paul in the Chapel of the Vincentians. Continue our tour with a visit of Notre Dame and continue to Sainte-Chapelle, a 13th-century Gothic chapel in the heart of Paris. Enjoy time at leisure for additional sightseeing, reflection, or other activities. Evening dinner and overnight

Day 4: Monday, November 8: Paris / Beauvais / Amiens / Lisieux

This morning, we will visit the incomplete Cathedral of St. Peter of Beauvais. It is, in some respects, the most daring achievement in Gothic architecture. Continue to Amiens Cathedral in the heart of Picardy. Prior to lunch, on own, Mass will be said in the Cathedral (Private Mass). Enjoy time at leisure for additional sightseeing, reflection, or other activities. Travel to Lisieux for evening dinner and overnight

Day 5: Tuesday, November 9: Lisieux / Chartres

Visit the Martin family house, where Saint Therese lived until she entered the Carmel Convent, and the great Basilica of Saint Therese. Say Mass at the Tomb of St. Therese in the Chapel of the Carmelite Monastery. Continue to Chartres to visit its magnificent Cathedral. Chartres Cathedral has been a major pilgrimage destination since the early Middle Ages and has a spirit of holiness that impresses even the most resolute of nonbelievers. Evening dinner and overnight

Day 6: Wednesday, November 10: Bourges / Paray-le-Monial

On our way to Paray-le-Monial, stop in Bourges to visit its 13th-century cathedral dedicated to St. Stephen. The site occupied by the present cathedral has been the site of the city's main church at least since Carolingian times. Continue to Paray-le-Monial, home to St. Margaret Mary and the Shrine of the Sacred Heart. Visit the Church of St. Claude de Colombière and the Chapel of the Visitation, where St. Margaret Mary received her visions. A private Mass will be said at the Chapelle de la Visitation, if available. Evening dinner and overnight

Day 7: Thursday, November 11: Le Puy-en-Velay

Depart for Le Puy-en-Velay, home of the Motherhouse for the Sisters of St. Joseph. Le Puy is known for its tradition of pilgrimage and a historic Marian apparition in the first century AD. The shrine features a replica of a Black Madonna statue and is the starting point for one of the routes of the Camino de Santiago. Tour the city and the recently purchased house, and the center. If space is available, celebrate a private Mass in the center. Enjoy lunch and some free time in Le Puy
Dinner will be on your own, allowing everyone to explore the fantastic food for which the city is known

Day 8: Friday, November 12: Lyon

Transfer to Lyon. Upon arrival in Lyon, enjoy a guided tour of Lyon ending with a trip just outside of the city to Fourvière and a visit to the Basilica of Notre-Dame de Fourvière, say Mass at the Basilica of Notre-Dame de Fourvière (Private Mass). Check into your hotel and enjoy dinner on your own in one of the best food cities in the world.

Day 9: Saturday, November 13: St. Francis de Sales

Check out of your hotel and board your coach for Annecy, traveling through the beautiful countryside and wine country of Burgundy to the shores of Lake Annecy. Visit Annecy Castle, the residence of the Counts of Geneva. Tour the Monastery of the Visitation and Basilica. It was here that St. Francis de Sales was buried in 1623. Many miracles have been reported at his shrine. Continue to the village of Thorens to celebrate Mass at the De Sales Chapel. Visit Château Thorens, the ancient family residence of the De Sales family. Evening dinner and overnight

Day 10: Sunday, November 14: The French & Swiss Alps

A 90-minute drive by motor coach through the picturesque Arve Valley takes you from Annecy to Chamonix, one of the most famous mountain villages at the foot of the remarkable and majestic Mont Blanc. Enjoy time at leisure for additional sightseeing, reflection, or other activities. Travel to the Italian ski village of Courmayeur to enjoy amazing vistas surrounding the mountains before returning to Annecy. Dinner and overnight. Overnight at hotel

Day 11: Monday, November 15: Geneva

Morning check-out and transfer to Geneva. Upon arrival, enjoy a guided city tour, visiting the main sites of Geneva. Enjoy a free afternoon exploring the city on your own. In the late afternoon, meet your coach and transfer to your hotel for check-in. Then, travel to a local restaurant for a special celebration dinner. Overnight in Geneva (airport area hotel)

Day 12: Tuesday, November 16: Return Home

Transfer to Geneva Airport for the return flight
