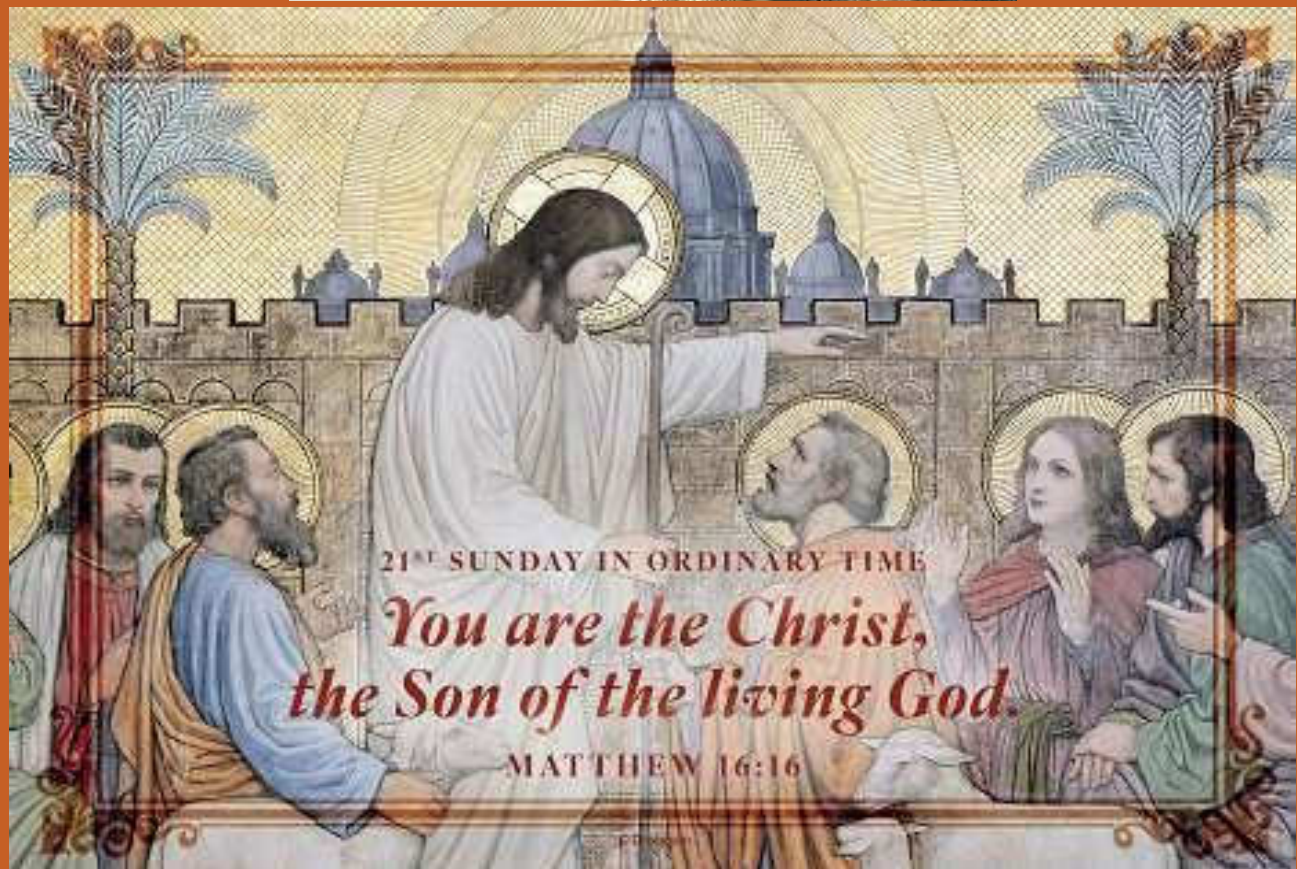

Father Jake's Column

The Home of Responsibility

Principle #2: Take Responsibility for Life in the Home

(Inspired by The Intentional Household: Living as if People Matter by Dr. John Cuddeback)

If a person sees himself or herself as responsible only for themselves, then ultimately they become an irresponsible person. How can this be? We are born into a community of persons, and from the beginning, others have been responsible for our well-being. To "grow out of that" would be to set aside a fundamental part of our humanity: love and responsibility.

Love makes us responsible for others. In *Love and Responsibility*, St. John Paul II emphasizes that to love another person is to seek their good and, therefore, to take responsibility for them. This responsibility is first learned in the home. The love between a husband and wife, expressed through their daily care for one another and their duties toward the family, communicates to their children that we are responsible for the good of the other.

Responsibility is when a person takes care of **things** because he recognizes that he owes this care to **others**. How we take care of things is directly related to how we love and care for people. Diligent care for others, expressed even through ordinary things, is part of what makes us responsible.

The chain effect of the responsibility in the home is revealed in society. We can see this in simple examples. Consider the grocery store cart return. When carts are left scattered throughout the parking lot, it can reveal a society that has forgotten that our actions affect others. Or consider lawn care. When a property is cared for, orderly, and healthy, there is something about it that communicates a care for the neighborhood. These ordinary things communicate that we recognize that our surroundings are not simply ours, but are shared with others.

You may agree with this and move on with your week. However, there is a subtle challenge here: we may think we have our priorities in place, while our actions reveal something different. We can begin to appreciate the care of things more than the people those things are meant to benefit. Our responsibility toward our work can become more important than our responsibility toward the people our work is meant to serve. The decisions we make reveal where our heart and intentionality is.

Creating a culture of responsibility in the home is no easy task. It begins with a husband and wife dedicated to the thriving of the other. So, over the next week, I suggest that after dinner your household engage in a communal activity: walking, riding a bike, playing a game, having a bonfire, or something similar. Each night, let a different person decide what the family will do. Even when an older sibling detests what the younger sibling has chosen, by embracing the decision there is a fundamental responsibility for the other's well-being.

Ultimately, this simple practice can teach us to become more diligent in our care for others—and to discover that another person's joy can become our own.

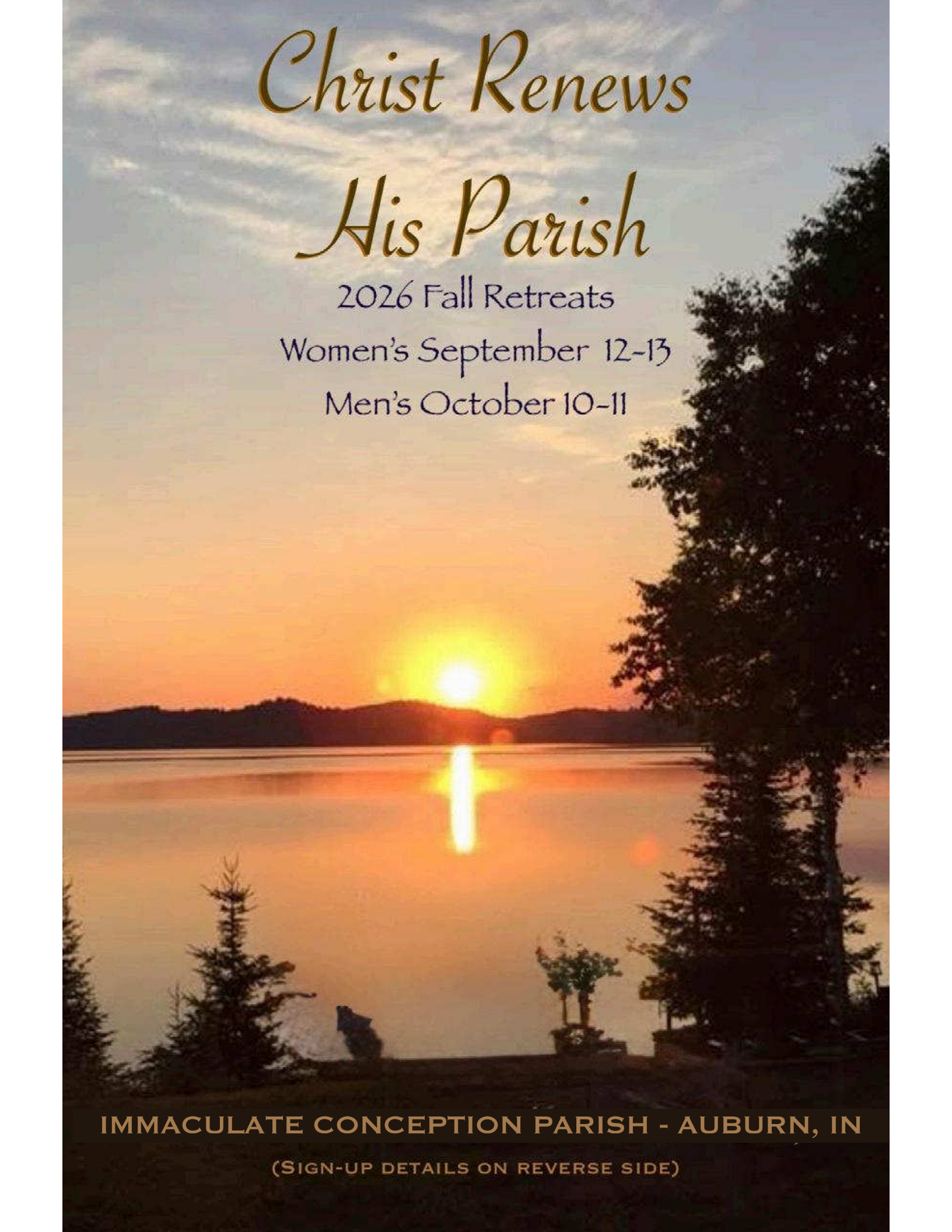

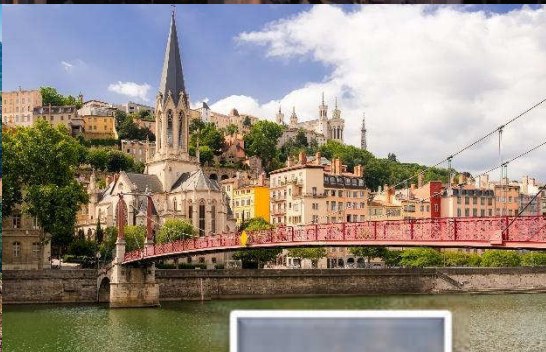
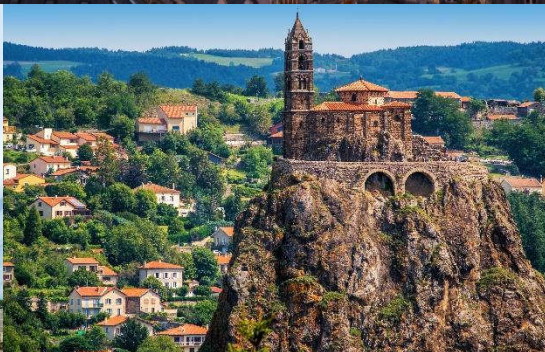

A 12-Day Pilgrimage to the Shrines & Cathedrals of France

Day 1: Friday, November 5, 2027

Depart via scheduled air service to Paris

Day 2: Saturday, November 6: Paris

Upon arrival in Paris, meet your Faith Journeys Tour Manager, who will assist the group to the awaiting chartered motorcoach for a panoramic tour of Paris to see the Eiffel Tower, L'Arc de Triomphe, and Champs-Élysées. We will also see the Basilica of the Sacred Heart (Sacré-Coeur) Depending on timing – attend Mass at Sacré Coeur (6 pm public mass in French). Late afternoon check-in at the hotel. Evening Welcome Dinner and overnight

Day 3: Sunday, November 7: Paris

Attend Mass at the Chapel of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal, site of three apparitions of the Virgin Mary in 1830. Visit the Tomb of St. Vincent de Paul in the Chapel of the Vincentians. Continue our tour with a visit of Notre Dame and continue to Sainte-Chapelle, a 13th-century Gothic chapel in the heart of Paris. Enjoy time at leisure for additional sightseeing, reflection, or other activities. Evening dinner and overnight

Day 4: Monday, November 8: Paris / Beauvais / Amiens / Lisieux

This morning, we will visit the incomplete Cathedral of St. Peter of Beauvais. It is, in some respects, the most daring achievement in Gothic architecture. Continue to Amiens Cathedral in the heart of Picardy. Prior to lunch, on own, Mass will be said in the Cathedral (Private Mass). Enjoy time at leisure for additional sightseeing, reflection, or other activities. Travel to Lisieux for evening dinner and overnight

Day 5: Tuesday, November 9: Lisieux / Chartres

Visit the Martin family house, where Saint Therese lived until she entered the Carmel Convent, and the great Basilica of Saint Therese. Say Mass at the Tomb of St. Therese in the Chapel of the Carmelite Monastery. Continue to Chartres to visit its magnificent Cathedral. Chartres Cathedral has been a major pilgrimage destination since the early Middle Ages and has a spirit of holiness that impresses even the most resolute of nonbelievers. Evening dinner and overnight

Day 6: Wednesday, November 10: Bourges / Paray-le-Monial

On our way to Paray-le-Monial, stop in Bourges to visit its 13th-century cathedral dedicated to St. Stephen. The site occupied by the present cathedral has been the site of the city's main church at least since Carolingian times. Continue to Paray-le-Monial, home to St. Margaret Mary and the Shrine of the Sacred Heart. Visit the Church of St. Claude de Colombière and the Chapel of the Visitation, where St. Margaret Mary received her visions. A private Mass will be said at the Chapelle de la Visitation, if available. Evening dinner and overnight

Day 7: Thursday, November 11: Le Puy-en-Velay

Depart for Le Puy-en-Velay, home of the Motherhouse for the Sisters of St. Joseph. Le Puy is known for its tradition of pilgrimage and a historic Marian apparition in the first century AD. The shrine features a replica of a Black Madonna statue and is the starting point for one of the routes of the Camino de Santiago. Tour the city and the recently purchased house, and the center. If space is available, celebrate a private Mass in the center. Enjoy lunch and some free time in Le Puy
