



How to Gain the 2025 Jubilee Year Indulgence during Pilgrimages and Visits to Jubilee Churches in the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend

These are the nine designated Jubilee churches in the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend:

- Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Fort Wayne
- St. Matthew Cathedral, South Bend
- Basilica of the Sacred Heart, Notre Dame
- St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church, Fort Wayne
- SS. Peter and Paul Church, Huntington
- St. Anthony of Padua Church, Angola
- St. Pius X Church, Granger
- St. Michael the Archangel Church, Plymouth
- Our Lady of Guadalupe Church, Warsaw

The faithful who undertake a "pious pilgrimage" to any of the above diocesan Jubilee churches can obtain the Jubilee Indulgence by devoutly participating in any of the following:

- Holy Mass
- a celebration of the Word of God
- the Liturgy of the Hours (Office of Readings, Morning Prayer, or Evening Prayer)
- the Way of the Cross
- the Rosarv
- the recitation of the Akathist hymn (an Eastern Catholic hymn)
- a Penance Service, which ends with the individual confessions of the penitents

The faithful can also obtain the Jubilee Indulgence if, individually or in a group, they devoutly visit any of the above Jubilee churches and there spend time in Eucharistic adoration and meditation, concluding with all the following:

- 1. the Our Father
- 2. the Profession of Faith (e.g., Nicene or Apostles' Creed)
- 3. invocations to Mary, the Mother of God (e.g., the Hail Mary)

What conditions must be met to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence? To obtain any indulgence, one must intend to gain the indulgence via the prescribed work. One must also be baptized, be in a state of grace, and not be excommunicated.

To obtain the Jubilee plenary indulgences, all the following conditions must also be met:

- 1. Being truly repentant and receiving sacramental absolution in the Sacrament of Penance
- 2. Reception of Holy Communion
- 3. Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father on the same day as the indulgenced work, either through the recitation of one Our Father and one Hail Mary or through the recitation of another appropriate prayer for the Pope's intentions.
- 4. The exclusion of all attachment to sin, even venial sin. (If this condition is not met, one can still receive a partial indulgence from the prescribed work.)

The first two actions (Confession and Communion) may be fulfilled within 20 days before or after the indulgence opportunity. However, it is most appropriate if they are done on the same day as the prescribed work. A single sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but separately receiving Communion is required for each indulgence. Only one of the above plenary indulgences can be obtained per day.





Pilgrimage to Italy with Fr. Bob Garrow and Fr. Cyril Fernandes | Dates: Sept.28-Oct. 8, 2026

Day 1: Monday, September 28, 2026 | Departure for Rome -We depart Fort Wayne on our overnight flights to Rome, Italy. Drinks and meals will be served on board.

Day 2: Tuesday, September 29 | Arrival in Rome - Transfer to Assisi Upon arrival at Rome Fiumicino Airport, we are greeted by our local guide and board our private motor coach for the scenic drive to Assisi. Along the way, we enjoy glimpses of the beautiful Umbrian countryside. After checking into our hotel, we gather for a welcome dinner and get to know our fellow pilgrims before retiring for the night. Dinner and overnight in Assisi.

Day 3: Wednesday, September 30 | Assisi & St. Carlo Acutis - After breakfast, we begin our day in the lower village of Assisi, visiting St. Mary of the Angels, where St. Francis spent a significant part of his life. We will explore the Chapel Portiuncola, the rose bush, and the cave where the saint retreated for prayer. Next, we will proceed to the Church of St. Clare to view the Saint's body, incorrupt since her death centuries ago. St. Clare was the foundress of the Order of Poor Clare's. We will have some free time for lunch at Piazza della comuna followed by a visit to St. Mary Major. Today we will also visit the Basilica of St. Francis where Father will celebrate Mass. Finally, we will take time to visit the Shrine of the Renunciation, where the millennial Saint Carlo Acutis' body is interred, and learn more about his life and spirituality. Dinner and overnight in Assisi.

Day 4: Thursday, October 1 | Day Trip to Loreto - After breakfast we board our bus and head towards the Marian Shrine in Loreto, the Basilica della Santa Casa. Within its walls, we encounter the beautiful Madonna of Loreto and the Holy House of Nazareth. Tradition holds that this modest house is where "The Word Became Flesh," where Mary spent her early years, and where she received the visitation of the angel Gabriel. It is also believed to be the place, where Jesus was raised, and where the Holy Family lived. We will return to Assisi for dinner and an overnight.

Day 5: Friday, October 2 | Basilica of Santa Rita da Cascia, Lanciano, San Giovanni Rotondo - Today we will make our way to San Giovanni, in route we will visit the Basilica of Santa Rita da Cascia and Lanciano, the site of the Eucharistic Miracle from the eighth century. Finally, we will head to San Giovanni Rotondo to visit the shrine of St. Padre Pio. Dinner and overnight in San Giovanni Rotondo.

Day 6: Saturday, October 3 | Exploring St. Padre Pio's Life, Monte Sant' Angelo- Today is dedicated to the town where St. Padre Pio lived for most of his life. We will visit the church of Santa Maria Della Grazie, where the tomb of St. Padre Pio is located, and offer Mass. In

the afternoon, we will visit the Sanctuary of Monte Sant'Angelo. Dinner and overnight in San Giovanni Rotondo.

Day 7: Sunday, October 4 | Monte Cassino & Rome - All Roads lead to Rome... Following breakfast, we set off on a scenic bus ride, heading to Monte Cassino, where the ancient Roman town of Casinum once stood. Our first stop is the Benedictine Abbey of Monte Cassino, the original home of the Benedictine Order, established by St. Benedict around 529. Here we will enjoy lunch and celebrate Mass. In the afternoon we will transfer to Rome. Dinner and overnight in Rome.

Day 8: Monday, October 5 | Vatican City & Papal Audience - In the morning, we head to Saint Peter's Square for the Papal general audience with Pope Leo XIV (subject to his schedule). Afterward, we will have a private Mass in a Chapel at the Vatican Grottoes below St. Peters Basilica (Subject to availability). Following a brief lunch, we tour the Vatican Museum, Sistine Chapel, and St. Peter's Basilica, marveling at the incredible art and history. Dinner and overnight in Rome.

Day 9: Tuesday, October 6 | Exploring Ancient Rome - After breakfast, we will embark on a historic tour of Ancient Rome. We will stroll along Cobblestone streets, lined with majestic stone pines, and visit the Colosseum, a grand amphitheater of the ancient world. Along the way we'll stop for prayer at the Basilica of Saint Clement. Passing by the Roman Forum, we will witness the ruins of ancient government buildings. We'll finish the day visiting the Basilica of Santi Giovanni e Paolo, originally built in 398. It is home to the Passionists and is the burial place of St. Paul of the Cross. Dinner and overnight in Rome.

Day 10: Wednesday, October 7 | Major Roman Basilicas - Today, we explore three of the major basilicas of Rome, beginning with St. John Lateran, the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome. We visit the Holy Stairs, believed to be the steps Jesus ascended during his trial before Pontius Pilate. Next, we visit St. Mary Major, one of the oldest churches dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, here we will visit the tomb of Pope Francis. In the afternoon, we visit St. Paul Outside the Walls, where we venerate the tomb of St. Paul and celebrate Mass (Mass is subject to availability). Dinner and overnight in Rome.

Day 11: Thursday, October 8 | Our Pilgrimage Comes to an End With a renewed sense of pilgrimage, and an invigorated love of our Catholic faith, we transfer to the Rome Fiumicino Airport and board our return flight(s) home.
