

Incentives for 2026-2027

Teachers –

- Teacher receives \$20 per played team **(1)**, paid out as a gift card after completing end of session survey (NTE \$500 per session).

Students –

For each **Stock Market Game** division **(3)** in the fall and spring trading sessions, the following prizes are divided evenly by students that are on the team **(1)**:

- First place team - \$500 and a field trip visit to a financial advisor or wealth management firm.
- Second place team - \$400
- Third place team - \$300
- Fourth place team - \$200
- Fifth place team - \$100
- Teacher, parents, school administrators and students are Invited to the ***Ring the Bell Awards Luncheon*** in Jackson, MS on Friday, May 7, 2027. Elected officials, BlackRock executives and other VIPS will be invited.

For each **InvestWrite** division **(3)** in the fall and spring trading sessions:

- First place - \$250 college scholarship and a field trip visit to a financial advisor or wealth management firm.

Notes:

- (1)** Team must have 3-5 students and make the minimum trades by the deadline
- (2)** Team fees are \$17 per team.
- (3)** Divisions are elementary, middle and high school. Only fall and spring sessions are eligible for prizes.
- (4)** There are three trading sessions: fall, spring, yearlong.

** Team must be present at the ***Ring the Bell Awards Luncheon*** on May 7, 2027, to receive the cash prizes. It is important for the sponsors to see the results of their investments in the students participating in this program. Their attendance at the luncheon is very valuable for continued financial support of the program, thereby making the program available at no cost to teachers and students.
