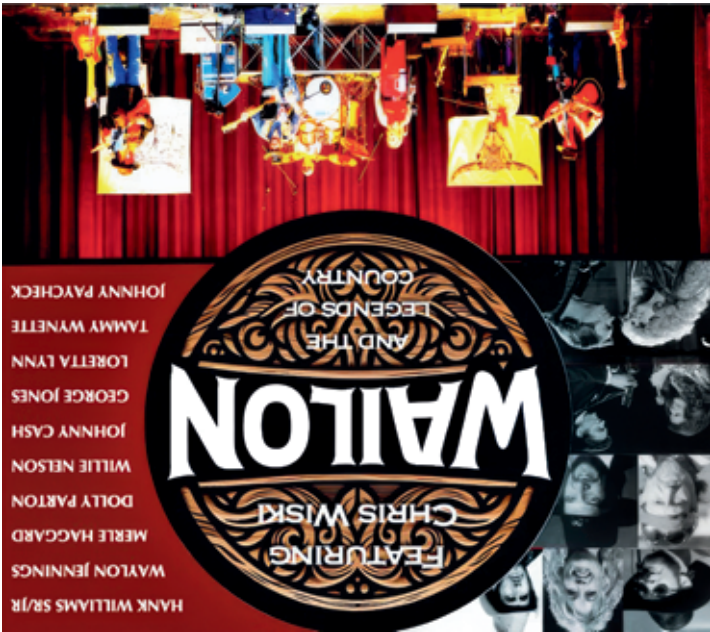




Wailon: Tribute to REAL Country Music

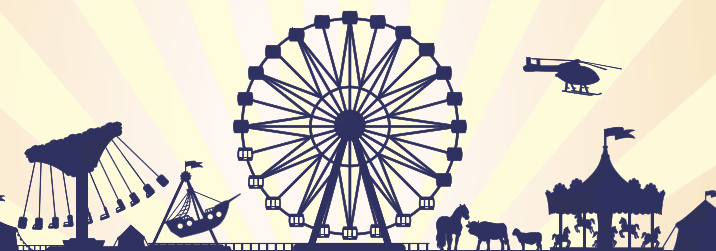
FIDDLEFIRE—Honoring the Music of the Charlie Daniels Band (FRIDAY 12PM TO 1:45 PM)
