The Ohio AMBER Alert Advisory Committee and its member organizations are committed to a statewide approach to emergency alert programs through the coordination of resources, information sharing, and training. The committee's goal is to ensure efficient notification to law enforcement, emergency alert partners, and the public to aid in the swift recovery of victims of abduction or other life-threatening situations. This program covers the AMBER Alert, Endangered Missing Child Alert, Endangered Missing Adult Alert, and the Ohio Blue Alert programs, which began in Ohio on January 1, 2003.
