Process description:

SURFACE TREATMENT: We recommend regular maintenance and cleaning of your sprayers and filters, and to use a sprayer with a maximum pressure of 3 bar.

Spray 1L of diluted solution over 20m². After treatment, the water evaporates leaving the microcapsules on the surface. Indoors, ventilate throughout the treatment and ventilate before re-occupying the premises (on average 30 minutes to 2 hours depending on the level of ventilation). Clean equipment after use. We recommended wearing gloves when handling the product and to wash hands thoroughly after each use.

Shake the bottle before use. Dilute 50ml of product in 5L of water per 100m².
