Black Pearl paste bait sachets

#### **Process description:**

Black Pearl is a ready-to-use rodenticide bait containing 4% w/w alphachlorolose in a paste sachet formulation. It is used for controlling house mice. The product is to be used inside buildings only. Prevent access to bait by children, birds and non-target animals (particularly dogs, cats, pigs and poultry). Baits must be securely deposited in a way so as to minimize the risk of consumption by other animals or children. Where possible, secure baits so that they cannot be dragged away. Bait should be laid for periods of at most 7- 10 days. Search for and remove dead rodents at frequent intervals during treatment, at least as often as when baits are checked and/or replenished. Due to the action of this rodenticide this may need to be as often as every few hours. Dispose of dead rodents in accordance with local requirements. Poisoned rodents may be disposed of by the waste producer at an incinerator or landfill permitted to accept that type of waste or collected by a registered waste carrier and taken for disposal at a suitably permitted site. Process description: For high infestations 5-20g in tamper resistant bait stations 3m apart. For low infestations 5-20g in tamper resistant bait stations every 5m apart.

In the event of exposure by:

**Inhalation:** Remove casualty to fresh air and keep warm and at rest. Seek medical attention if difficulties appear and persist.

**Contact with eyes:** In case of contact with eyes, rinse immediately with plenty of water and seek medical advice.

**Contact with skin:** In case of skin exposure, clean skin with water then with soap. Seek medical attention if irritation or discomfort develops. Remove contaminated clothing, wash skin with soap and rinse thoroughly with water. Do not use solvents or thinners. **Ingestion:** Seek medical attention, showing the label. Do not under any circumstances induce vomiting. Do not eat or drink
