Process description:

Black Pearl is a ready-to-use granular rodenticide bait containing 4% w/w alphachlorolose in a grain formulation. The product is to be used inside buildings only. Target organism: Mus musculus (House mouse). Juveniles and adults.

Application rate(s) and frequency:

For high infestation: 10g to 25g of bait in a mouse bait station every 3 metres.

For low infestation: 10g to 25g bait in a mouse bait station every 5 metres.

First aid measures in the event of accidental exposure?

In the event of exposure by:

In the event of exposure by inhalation: Remove casualty to fresh air and keep warm and at rest. Seek medical attention if difficulties appear and persist.

In the event of splashes or contact with eyes: Wash thoroughly with fresh, clean water for 15 minutes holding the eyelids open. If there is any redness, pain or visual impairment, consult an ophthalmologist.

In the event of splashes or contact with skin: Watch out for any remaining product between skin and clothing, watches, shoes, etc. In case of skin exposure, clean skin with water then with soap. Seek medical attention if irritation or discomfort develops.

In the event of swallowing: Seek medical attention, showing the label. Do not under any circumstances induce vomiting. Do not eat or drink. Install the victim in lateral safety position and protect it from injury in case of sudden movement or convulsion. Monitor the victim's breath. In cases of acute distress contact the 15 (or 112).

Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed Cardiac arrhythmias, convulsions.

In case of severe poisoning, central nervous system depression, hypotension, bradycardia and hypothermia may occur. Unconsciousness, diminished responsiveness, drowsiness, inebriation.
